

#### Scope

- Organisations based in within Canada; excluding international groups who work in Canada and Governments of any level except as part of coalitions and partnerships that are Canada specific.
- Partnerships and coalitions between organisations where recorded as separate entities if they complete actions and projects independent of the work already being done by participating organisations.
- Organisations who have no public record of activity were excluded
  Biases
- Does not account for quantity and quality of actions in counts
- Online search method can leave out actions/organisations not well documented online




























Total organisations actions towards Roadmap priorities
