- In this interview with Nicky Gumbel, historian, broadcaster and co-presenter of *The Rest is History* podcast, Tom Holland reflects on the impact Christianity has made on history.
- Tom emphasises the uniqueness of Christianity, particularly the crucifixion and resurrection, which he argues radically changed historical perceptions of power and victimhood.
- He discusses how early Christian writers, including Paul, grappled with the crucifixion's implications, viewing it as both a stumbling block and a profound revelation.
- Tom highlights that Christianity's moral and cultural influence persists, evident in secular ideologies like atheism, which Tom argues are rooted in Christian thought.
- He encourages believers and churches to embrace and emphasise the uniqueness of the Christian faith, particularly the supernatural and biblical stories, to maintain distinctiveness in a secular world that has adopted much of the change that Christianity brought.
- Tom stresses the importance of biblical literacy among younger generations.
