
# Drive ALONG THE CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS HICKORY AUGUST 5-9

#### DIRECTIONS

1. Start on Old Lenoir Road at the Hickory city limits, just east of US 321 near the railroad tracks, heading southeast. Arby's

- 2. Turn left on Old Lenoir Road for a short distance.
- 3. Turn left on 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue, NW (Geitner Road).
- 4. At the intersection with 6<sup>th</sup> Street, NW, turn right.
- 5. Turn left on 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue, NW.
- 6. At the fork, take the right fork on 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue Drive, NW.
- 7. At the intersection with 4<sup>th</sup> Street Drive, NW, turn left.
- 8. Turn right on 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue, NW. As you cross Center Street, it changes to NE.
- 9. Turn left on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, NE (NC 127)
- 10. Turn right on 11th Avenue, NE. Kedplasma
- 11. At the intersection with 3rd Street, NE, take a sharp left turn. Café Rule



Want to drive the line that was created in 2019 and divides Congressional Districts 5 & 10 in Hickory and northeast Catawba County?

Tips before you begin:

- Directions start at the city limits; US321 Bridge
- However, you may drive any segments you like.
- From the bridge, US District 5 is on the left; District 10 is on the right. See Figure 1.
- Because it is Hickory, landmarks are included.
- August 5-9, yard signs will be along the route.
- This sheet is printable.
- Accompanying maps are on next page.
- Be careful out there. This route is not straight!

12. At 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue, NE, take a right. Go 1/2 block. On the right is *Hickory High School.* 

13. Turn left (north) on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street Drive, NE

- 14. Turn left on 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue, NE.
- 15. At the intersection with N. Center Street (NC 127), turn right (north).
- 16. At 28th Avenue, NE turn right. Mt. Olive Lutheran Church
- 17. When 28<sup>th</sup> meets Falling Creek at the private bridge, the boundary then follows roughly along the Creek, so there is no road to follow. If you followed 28<sup>th</sup> to the creek, turn around and come back to 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, NE (behind *Publix*) and turn north (right). This is a gerrymandered triangle that divides neighborhoods and a voting precinct. Would 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue have been a more natural boundary? See Figure 2.
- *18.* Turn right (east) on 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue, NE. Cross the creek; you are back on the boundary line. The street name changes to 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue Drive, NE.
- 19. At the intersection with 16<sup>th</sup> Street, NE, turn left. State Employees Credit Union
- 20. At 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, NE, turn right. From this point, you will be in, out and beside the city limits.
- 21. At Kool Park Road, NE, turn right.
- 22. At Springs Road, NE, turn right (south). You are now encountering another gerrymandered outcropping of the district boundary. **See Figure 3.** Would Springs Road have been a more natural boundary?
- 23. Turn left on Section House Road. Quality Mart
- 24. Go left on Sipe Road. White wooden fence
- 25. At the intersection with County Home Road, turn left.
- 26. When you reach Springs Road, NE (AGAIN), turn left (west).
- 27. At Sulphur Springs Road, NE, turn right (north). *Cowboy Country Store* Go ~2.5 miles (past a series of avenues in the 40's.
- 28. After two+ miles, begin to look for 37<sup>th</sup> STREET Drive, NE on the left and be prepared to turn around. There is NO OUTLET to this street. The line goes nearly a mile down 37<sup>th</sup> Street Drive NE, ultimately through private property and into the lake.

You have successfully come to the area at the end of the congressional district line in Catawba County! Do you think Hickory and this area of Catawba County should be divided into two districts?


