HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

Use this guide alongside The Urban Christian Woman Podcast week-toweek as we traverse through 1st, 2nd, &3rd John.

TOOLS:

Prayer, pen/pencil & highlighter, Bible, dictionary, The Urban Christian Woman Podcast, a TUCW Companion Study Guide, a notebook to journal your thoughts, and internet for cross-referencing.

PRINTING:

In the guide everything is documented once for easy accessibility. We recommend that you print the guide once in its entirety. Feel free to reprint these as many times as needed to get you or a friend through 1st, 2nd, & 3rd John. There are 7 chapters that will be covered, so we recommend printing 7 copies of the Look, Listen, and Live pages.

Each podcast in our series "Complete Joy" features One chapter each. We've designed the Companion Guide so that you can walk through the chapters side-by-side. See the layout example on the following pages.

BACKGROUND

These books are general epistles (letters) written by the apostle John to the churches around Ephesus. First John was intended to be circulated to many churches and to be read aloud while 2nd John was written to a church and 3rd John was written to a church leader. John wrote with exhortations, warnings and corrections. He wrote to remind believers of what is central to the faith and life in the family of God and in the local church.

First, Second, and Third John are general epistles- letters written by John to/for the church in general. To gain a greater grasp of John and the church in Asia Minor, it will be helpful to listen/read the following New Testament gospel and letters: John, Ephesians and Acts. Read these three books with an eye for how the themes re-emphasize themes from 1st, 2nd, and 3rd John. The Gospel of John will help you understand John's writing style. Ephesians helps you understand the church, John's audience. Acts gives a a glimpse of the key players in 3rd John and the DNA of how the church generally is meant to live in relationship together. Letters written to the church are no different than the framework for letter writing today. In a letter there is a sender, recipient(s), greeting, body, and closing.

- 3 John Walking in friendship

Genre: Epistle(letters)-

- First, Second, and Third John are general epistles- a letter written by John to/for the church in general.
- To gain a greater grasp of John and the church that he writes his letters to, it will be helpful to listen/read the following New Testament gospel and letters (i.e., John, Ephesians, and Acts). When reading these three books of the bible you are seeking to identify how John and the church emphasizes the themes from 1st, 2nd, and 3rd John. Keep in mind that the Gospel of John will allow you to understand the writer of the letter and how he writes. The Ephesian Letter will allow you to understand the church, John's audience. Acts will allow you to gain a glimpse of the key players in 1st, 2nd, and 3rd John and the DNA of how the church is supposed to exist together.
- The Letters that are written to the church are no different than the framework we have for letter writing today. In a letter there is a sender, recipient, greeting, body, and closing.


