DAILY SCHEDULE: Thursday and Friday classes are in the Exhibit Hall of the Skamania County Fairgrounds. Classes run from 9:30am-4:00pm, with a lunch break from 12:00-1:00pm. Saturday's class is at the Hegewald Center, and runs from 1:00-5:00pm. Thursday and Friday will feature lunchtime lectures. Bring your lunch and enjoy! (NOTE: A refrigerator is available for your use in the kitchen of the Exhibit Hall.)

On Saturday morning, at the Hegewald Center, we will hold our regular quarterly guild meeting, featuring a trunk show and lecture by Charisma Horton. **Public Welcome - no additional fee!**

INTRODUCING OUR TEACHERS

CHARISMA HORTON is an accomplished quilter and well-known pattern designer. She has over 300 published patterns and has appeared on several YouTube channels, including Missouri Star Quilt Company, and Rob Appell's channel with Michael Miller fabrics. Her patterns have been published in more than 80 publications - you can hardly pick up a quilting magazine that doesn't have one of Charisma's patterns in it. ROBIN O'NEIL was a special education teacher for 35 years, and began making quilts the same year she entered the classroom. Her interest was sparked by children who seemed fearless about color, pattern, and play. Robin's quiltmaking journey began with traditional quilts - striving for tidy points, perfect corners, even seams, and sensible color combinations. After about 100 quilts, she left that behind. Her current philosophy is to HAVE FUN, preferring improvisational piecing. She uses no templates, no patterns, no basting, no rulers, and no worries. When something doesn't work, she turns it upside down or cuts it into pieces and keeps going. Her philosophy is that life is too short for stress and fretting, especially about quilts!

TERRY KNOTT learned to sew clothing from her grandmother at age nine. Her grandmother wasn't a quilter, although she made a few quilts. In the 1980s, Terry dabbled with quilting. She realized stitching a flat project was a lot easier than sewing clothing to fit a variety of body types. Terry says she is addicted to quilting! She enjoys many techniques and processes, and can't pick just one to be her focus. Many of her projects contain multiple techniques. She finds that working with needle, thread, and fabric can be very meditative, and creating "quilty" projects with fabric scraps is fun! Terry says sharing her knowledge of a process or a technique and seeing how the participants incorporate their new skills into their work fulfills her soul.

CAMILLE AINSWORTH is a bag maker and quilter who loves traditional quilting but also loves to dabble in various techniques. Some of her favorite techniques are foundation paper piecing, traditional piecing, and improv. Camille was taught traditional quilting and foundation paper piecing by her mother and her mother's friends. Her first quilt, made at age 19 for a college art class, was a self-drafted foundation paper pieced quilt of the family dog, Posie. Camille's passion is making bags and she has been inspired by the fashion industry throughout her teens and early 20s. She likes bag and accessory patterns from several designers, including By Annie, Noodlehead, and Blue Calla Patterns. Camille lives in Albany, Oregon, with her husband, son, and dog.

NANCY GOLDSWORTHY was born and raised in the Northwest, spending most of her years in Portland, Oregon. Nancy is an internationally-recognized teacher and author. Her love of fabric and sewing began at a very early age and continues to color her life today. Her career spanned 50+ years in the textile industry, and included everything from fabric development to garment construction. She continued her love of fabric when she joined the world of quilting. Now, the addition of threads and embellishments has taken her to a new level. Nancy's knowledge of the technical side of sewing is unmatched. She is an award-winning quilter and has authored four books. She has been longarm quilting for 20+ years, and quilts for the public as time allows.

LINDA SHAULL was born and raised in Bend, Oregon. She began quilting about 25 years ago when her granddaughter was born. Linda happened into a wool applique shop about 15 years ago, and she was hooked! She has made everything from mug rugs to quilts using wool applique, and always has a project in progress. She is looking forward to sharing her love of working with wool!

TOMME FENT started quilting in 1998, after killing time one afternoon visiting a local quilt shop in Norman, Oklahoma. Her love of all things quilt-related has grown steadily since that time. Her book "Quirky Quilting" was published by HarperCollins in 2005. Tomme has an obsession with collecting fabric, embellishments, threads, and tools. In 2002, she acquired her first longarm quilting machine and began helping customers finish their quilts. In 2015, Tomme started the Mt. Hood Quilt Guild in Gresham, Oregon. Currently, Tomme teaches Beginning Quilting at Mt. Hood Community College in Troutdale, Oregon.

She will cover the basics of needles and threads in the lecture part of the class, then turn you lose to try them out.
