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MESSAGE FROM THE TEAM

2022 was a year of many victories. Among the most impactful were the Districts of Tofino and Ucluelet banning single-use utensils in the region.

Our Dart Board video, launched in March, received national recognition and publicity. Through our Hold On To Your Butt Campaign, we have recycled almost 1.3 million cigarette butts. The Meares Island Tribal Park dock was replaced by May with air-filled billets, and the First Street is coming soon.

2022 also saw us bring back all of our inperson beach clean-ups, including our Washed- Up Wednesdays collaboration with Tofino Tourism during July and August. We also supported waste diversion with our recycling station at a number of public events including Ukee Days, Ucluelet Night Markets, Edge to Edge Marathon, and CSA competitions in Tofino.

The ACRD harnessed our resources to support the local composting roll-out program in Tofino, Ucluelet, Port Albion and Millstream, along with Esowista, Ty-Histanis and Hitaću this fall. If that wasn't enough we received 28K from Blue Friday to create styro-surfboards in 2023!

There is so much to look forward to in the future as we've settled into our new location at Surf Grove. Our amazing crew of west coast volunteers have been key to our successes, especially in their drive to encourage businesses and community members to reduce our environmental footprint.

Thank you to all of the volunteers who came to our beach clean-ups by foot, boat, kayak, and bike this year! Our volunteers who recycle cigarette butts all year, our Ocean Friendly Business, and wetsuit recycling volunteers are so vital to the functioning of our initiatives and you are all the heart of our mission, to protect the ocean, beaches and waves for all!

2022 HIGHLIGHTS

PLASTICS

- * 2 Coastal Victories for Cut the Cutlery in Tofino and Ucluelet! Cut the Cutlery goes to council and gets passed! Coastal victory Cut the Cutlery Campaign, which reached close to 100% compliance across the Pacific Rim. Plastic cutlery was added to the single-use plastic regulation bylaws in Tofino and Ucluelet.
- We spent a total of 23 days cleaning the coastline, engaging more than 400 volunteers and removing a total of 14,202 lbs of debris from the environment through the Love Your Beach Clean Program.
 Volunteers engaged in citizen science by using the Marine Debris Tracker App, sorting recyclable materials and collecting marine debris data.
- * Through our Hold On To Your Butt
 Campaign we recycled over 294,987
 butts this year. We also completed a
 cigarette surfboard (the Dart Board) to
 raise awareness around the pollution
 caused by cigarette butts in the
 community and have developed an
 informative and empowering video to
 support the campaign!

- Foam Free Docks Installed! We replaced the foam flotation on the Big Tree Trail dock on Mearse Island in collaboration with Tla-o-qui-aht Tribal Parks - and gave the DOT \$25,000 to replace the First Street Dock with air-filled billets in 2023!
- * Through the Take Back the Tap Campaign, we installed 'Classic Plastic' an environmental awareness art piece created by Pete Clarkson funded by the District of Tofino.
- Through our Wetsuit Reincarnation program, we continued to support the research by Shred, investigating potential wetsuit recycling opportunities in Canada.
- * 8 new businesses registered as Ocean Friendly across the Pacific Rim in 2022, bringing the total number of registered Ocean Friendly Businesses to almost 70 by the end of 2022!



2022 HIGHLIGHTS

EDUCATION

- We supported the ACRD to educate the community on the curbside composting program rollout to residents in November 2022. Working with the ACRD to educate businesses on plastic contamination as the new regional composting program started in fall of 2022. This included 15 Ocean Friendly Business audits completed by our waste consultant Robin Jackson!
- With the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District, we continued the third year of the Transparent Waste Education Initiative under our Rise Above Plastics Program, with the aim of diverting a greater amount of waste from landfill through the uptake of proper waste practices. This included providing 21 business visits and 14 waste audits.
- A brand new ocean-friendly curriculum was developed for the Youth Environmental Stewardship Program to be implemented in 2023!
- Ucluelet Secondary School Surfrider Youth Club continues to make waves with their school based waste reduction campaigns and shoreline cleanups.



- Surfrider UVic, UBC Surf Club, and USS Surfrider gathered on our shores for a day of networking, workshops, and participation in the design of an Ocean Friendly Schools Campaign, set to launch in 2023!
- We developed an Ocean Friendly Camping Guide available to the public through our website's Ocean Friendly Resources page.
- We supported and mentored Ocean Friendly Port Alberni by attending monthly meetings and educating their members and volunteers on best practices.
- With the increasing impact of cargo container spills on the west coast, Surfrider Canada representatives were invited to speak in the House of Commons on this issue and provide recommendations on how to improve cargo container spill response.

OUTREACH

- Remaining dedicated to growing our partnerships with other non-profit and stewardship-focused organisations:

 Cedar Coast Field Station, REDD Fish Restoration Society, Clayoquot Action, Coastal Restoration Society, Friends of Clayoquot Sound, Ocean Legacy Foundation, Raincoast Education Society, Rugged Coast Research Society, Strawberry Isle Marine Research Society, Tla-o-qui-aht Tribal Parks, Maaqutusiis Hahoulthee Stewardship Society, Emerald Sea Society and Ucluelet Aquarium.
- In partnership with Tourism Tofino, Washed-Up Wednesdays weekly beach cleans throughout high summer removed more than 15,000 items/fragments, including 719 cigarette butts alone!

- We partnered with Long Beach Lodge to create a Beach Clean Bag and informative door-hanger to educate visitors on the importance of reducing their waste footprint and protecting the area they are visiting. 14 businesses on the Pacific Rim participated in this program and it will continue in 2023!
- We supported circular economy initiatives partnering with various local businesses; Drift Mfg (Styrofoam Surfboards), Sea Woven (recycled rope artwork), Pete Clarkson (marine debris artist), and Shred (neoprene recycling).
- Surfrider Sessions Fundraiser online auction raised over \$6,000, thanks to all the local businesses for donating and all the folks who participated in this event.

LOOKING AHFAD TO 2023

PLASTICS

- * Take Back the Tap community consultation with off-shore communities and businesses to eliminate 1L and under water bottles from our region.
- * Foam Free Docks: First Street dock replacement with the District of Tofino will take place next, in 2023!
- * Develop an Ocean Friendly Handbook for residents and visitors that can be shared with communities along the coast.

CIRCULAR ECONOMY

- * Create **Styro-surfboards** made of foam sourced from local beach clean-ups as an educational tool to bring awareness to the harm caused by EPS foam in the marine environment and exemplify a downstream solution to the plastics crisis.
- * Continuing to fulfill our mission by keeping neoprene out of our local landfill site, through community education on neoprene recycling options in North America!
- Stitch N' Beach sewing program to continue monthly in 2023.

EDUCATION

- * In conjunction with the ACRD, we will focus on single-use bioplastic education in composting systems for business and residential, providing locally compostable alternatives. Ongoing support of waste diversion efforts for other single-use plastic items and eventually, we plan to review recycling options for textiles and construction waste.
- We will invest in the development of digital resources to enhance the YES Curriculum, further empowering young leaders in the community.
- * Launch the Ocean Friendly Schools student workbook in the fall of 2023, which was designed by students to empower fellow students to step-up as leaders in their classroom and lead the Ocean Friendly Revolution in schools!
- Continue to provide high-quality placebased learning experiences for students to connect with their environment and learn about ocean conservation and how they can take a lead role in protecting the ocean, beaches, and waves.
- We will host a Love Your Beach Clean online webinar and in-person training for volunteers to learn the skills necessary to host their own beach clean-up

LOOKING AHEAD TO **2023**

OUTREACH

- Love Your Beach Clean will continue with monthly beach clean-ups on local beaches with local businesses sponsoring each one. A few remote beach clean-ups are on the agenda as well!
- Continue to support Long Beach Lodge with the roll out of their Beach Clean Bag initiative: providing visitors with information on how to do a 5-minute beach cleanup, log their data, and recycle their debris. Guests can use the bag throughout their stay, reducing the need for single use.
- Continue to partner with surf competitions and community events, supporting visitor education and waste reduction and diversion.
- Continue to support the hard work of our volunteers and innovative coastal stewardship ideas that help our organization grow and achieve our mission.


