

# WHAT IS THE SMART AND SUSTAINABLE CORRIDORS SPECIFIC PLAN (SSCSP)?

- Seeks to facilitate revitalization of major eastwest commercial corridors
- Will provide direction on key issues –
  e.g., accommodating growth, enhancing
  mobility, protecting the environment, and
  providing public facilities and services
- Should embody community values and priorities while supporting state/regional goals
- Supported by the Caltrans Sustainable Communities Grant Program
- Informed by the Coast Highway Corridor Study and Incentive District




## **Neighborhood Planning Areas (NPAs)**

The City is comprised of 17 neighborhood planning areas. NPA-specific goals, policies, and actions will be incorporated into the updated Land Use Element. The SSCSP planning area extends through most of the NPAs.

### NPA priorities that will inform the SSCSP

- Open space preservation/habitat restoration
- Public security and safety in the public realm
- Visual quality
- Pedestrian and bicycle facilities
- Traffic safety
- Additional retail and dining options
- Additional landscaping/tree canopy
- More venues for social gathering
- Solutions for homelessness
