Today, the Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord. For some, depending on the part of the world you are in, this is the conclusion of the Christmas season. For Poles and many European countries, the end of the Christmas season is the Feast of Candlemas, or as many of us know it, the Presentation of the Lord.

The Church in her wisdom gives us this octave after Christmas to reflect upon all that has happened—namely, that Christ has been born into the world. Some may find this easier to believe than others. This Octave of Christmas allows us to process and mediate upon the fact the God sent His Son into the world to redeem us and that God loves us unconditionally and is very merciful.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a time for us to recall and renew our baptismal call. We are called to serve the Church and each other through the proclamation of the Word of God—and more importantly, through living out our faith in our home, our family, our workplace, and our community. Living the Gospel calls us to internalize the Word of God that we hear proclaimed—to make it our own and share it with others. As we begin this New Year, may we strive to live that proclaimed Word in our life. As St. Francis of Assisi once said, “Always proclaim the word of God. When necessary, use words.”

Again, I wish all of you a joyous and awesome year. Take the time each day to see God’s hand in your life, and every night, pause and give thanks to God for the blessings He has bestowed upon you.

Pope Francis in his *Ubi et Orbi* blessing for the New Year ended with these words:

“As 2022 begins, people should make a commitment to find time for others. Time is a treasure that all of us possess, yet we guard it jealously, since we want to use it only for ourselves. Let us ask for the grace to find time for God and for our neighbor—for those who are alone or suffering, for those who need someone to listen and show concern for them.”

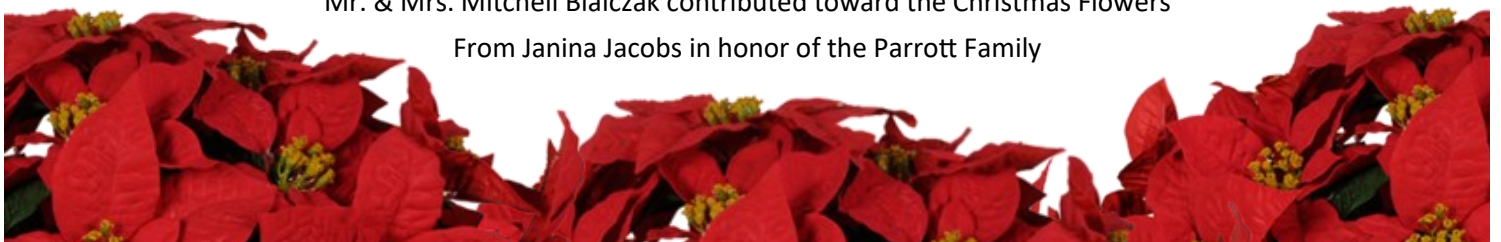

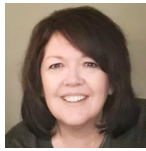

It may not be immediately apparent, but Luke's account of Jesus' baptism reveals that Jesus engaged in dialogue with his Father.

Luke says that upon being baptized, Jesus prayed. As he prayed, the Holy Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and God spoke to Jesus from the heavens: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22).

While a dove was not seen and a voice from the heavens was not heard when we were baptized, the Holy Spirit did descend upon us in baptism, and we were welcomed into this holy family, initiated into the body of Christ.

We are indeed God's beloved sons and daughters! Let us pray to God as Jesus did, as Jesus taught us, and realize how pleased God is in us. As we pray, let us give thanks for the blessings received in baptism, blessings we remember in the baptism we celebrate today.

Ministers of Music are in short supply these days, and quite often I'm asked to serve at other churches for funerals, weddings, or weekend Masses in addition to my ministry

here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal. 2022 marks my 50th year of music ministry, and it has been an incredible adventure and honor to serve the people of God and to go where I'm needed.

This is also the year St. Jane Frances de Chantal will enter our Family of Parishes and work with St. Cyril, Our Lady of Czestochowa, and St. Rene Goupil. In fact, we've already started to do that with faith formation—and even with music ministry! You may have already met Alex Sunga from St. Rene Goupil, who subbed at the Thanksgiving Family Mass; and this Saturday, you'll meet the organist from St. Cyril, Joseph Long, who is subbing while I'm away. On Sunday, Marcello Rossi is helping us out, but more on him in a little bit.

Each parish has its own traditions for Mass. It's a joy to meet all the people who attend a particular parish and help make things happen. There is comfort in the universal "sameness" of liturgy everywhere, no matter what city or state you are in. There are a few differences here and there with the particular Mass or special Alleluias that are sung, or whether the preferred music is traditional or contemporary, but usually one can get a feel for how each parish celebrates Mass and their own traditions.

One of my music planning resources, the current *GIA Quarterly*, had an interesting article: "Finding Balance" written by Marilyn Biery. In it, she discusses the many aspects of exactly how music ministers plan for Mass and how one plays the organ.

Some thoughts were familiar, but others never crossed my mind. For example: how far should one sit from the keyboard so that optimally you can reach the pedal board with your feet and have proper positioning of your arms and hands as you play? It may not seem important, but as the years go on, back and knee problems, sciatica, and other health issues can pop up and compromise what an organist can—or cannot—do.

Every so often, the simple matter of finding the organ on/off switch is a mystery. I provide my substitutes with a detailed list of what they need to know when visiting our parish, mainly because I find that very helpful when I'm at other churches. Having played dozens of organs, finding the power source is usually not too hard.

However, you can still be fooled: for one wedding last summer at an older Detroit church, I never would have figured it out. There were actually two organs, one downstairs and one in the loft. Thankfully, the musician in residence said the organ downstairs (which they do not use) had to be turned on first, and then the one upstairs would work. At other churches, sometimes the power isn't even at the organ but rather on a wall or cabinet.

Now, back to Marcello Rossi, who was formerly the Music Minister at St. Daniel in Clarkston. Currently, he teaches at Evola Music in Shelby. If any of you have questions about the organ, need to find music instruction, or have other inquiries, here's your chance to speak with a real expert!

Please enjoy celebrating the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the end to another beautiful Christmas season at our parish. See you next week!

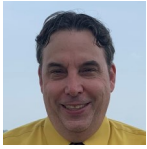

EXPLAINING THE GOSPEL VERSE

Most parents have several photo albums that are full of pictures taken of their children as they were growing up. We have always been very pleased with our children. We took pictures of our children in school, at church, playing, at Christmastime, on their birthdays, and many other occasions. We were pleased with them as they grew up and we are pleased with them today.

Do you think God was pleased with His son, Jesus? I know He was, because the Bible tells us that He was. When Jesus was baptized, the Bible tells us that there was a voice from heaven that said, "This is my Son and I love Him. I am very pleased with Him." When we trust in Jesus as our Savior, we become the children of God.

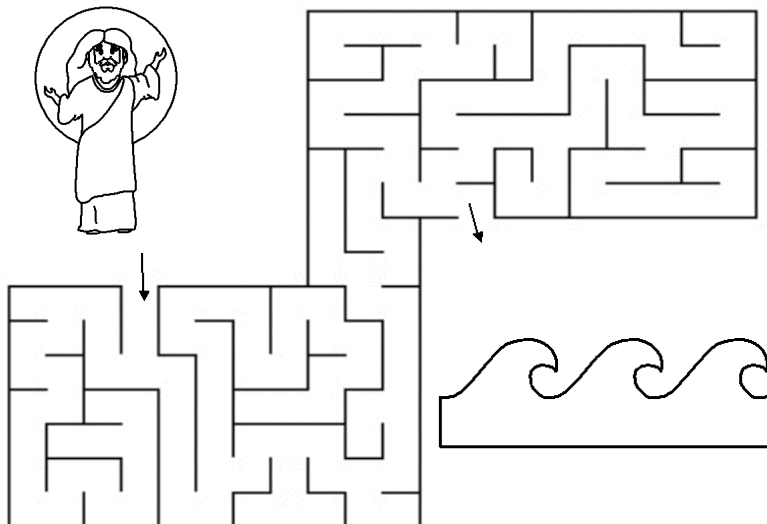
