Curiosity

Last week I learned that a teacher I had in grade school had died. Sr. John Williams O.P. was my sixth grade teacher at St. Augustine Parish School in Richmond. If we were to look back on our school days we would all be able to think of one teacher who made an impact upon our life. Sr. John Williams O.P. was the person who made the process of learning an adventure and just plain fun.

She could tell us a story about a particular country or place in the world and draw us into the story to the point you thought you were there or had visited there at one time. One of the gifts of teaching is to stimulate curiosity and the desire to learn. Sr. John Williams O.P. would often remind us, you can travel anywhere you wish without leaving your seat if you only READ. Reading has become one of my favorite pastimes.

You may recall that public service announcement from many years ago. Reading is FUNdamental. Reading is indeed fundamental to our life and to our vocation. In his book, Rediscover the Saints, Matthew Kelly writes about twenty-five different saints who inspired change in the way people view life and their existence.

One particular saint in Matthew Kelly’s book is Saint Ralph. Saint Ralph was a Benedictine bishop in the ninth century known for his leadership and his love of learning. Love of learning is one of the quintessential life skills. The story of St. Ralph is not so much about him but how he inspired others to gain a curiosity for learning. Whether it is Saint Ralph or any saint of the Catholic Church, the stories written of them are written to encourage us, to inspire us and to move us to do greater things with our life

May we encourage each other and especially children to develop a “beautiful curiosity”. A curiosity for the things around us, a curiosity for things yet to be discovered, a curiosity for the many ways in which God reveals Himself to us. Too often I believe we live a life of should have, would have, could have but didn’t. To develop a “beautiful curiosity” allows us to see beyond the place we find ourselves at the present moment and experience life in a new light or vision.

Bon mot: Seize the moment of excited curiosity on any subject, to solve your doubt; for if you let it pass, the desire may never return, and you may remain in ignorance.

Today, the Fifth Sunday of Lent, the readings remind us that God alone has the power of life over death. This is a particularly poignant message while we struggle with the loss of so many lives to war and natural disasters.

When we discuss the gospel reading with our RCIA members in preparation for the third scrutiny, we ask them to reflect on and discuss: "What am I willing to let go of, to let die, to give up, in order to give myself fully to God?" Some examples are societal ills such as racism, sexism, turning a blind eye to the poor and the disenfranchised, or just a general lack of care for the other. Some personal examples are hopelessness, negativity, control issues, lack of forgiveness, materialism, lack of faith, or an unwillingness to accept the need to change for the good of all.

Today would be a good day for all of us to spend some time thinking about that question, acknowledging the aspects of our lives that are not of God and need cleaning up so that we may have new life in Christ. As Catholics, we believe that death is not the end of life. Let us follow Christ and live our lives in freedom as the people of God!

Pope Francis, in his Angeles talk of April 6, 2014, speaks of God's mercy in raising Lazarus from death and each of us from sin:

"Jesus calls to us as he called to Lazarus in his tomb: "Come forth!" This call is addressed to every human person because we are all marked by death. Christ is not resigned to the sepulchers that we have constructed with our choices of evil and death, with our mistakes, our sins. [Jesus] invites us, almost orders us, to come out of the tombs into which our sins have plunged us. This is where our resurrection begins: when we decide to obey the command of Jesus to come into the light, to life; when the masks fall from our faces ... and we rediscover the courage of our original faces, created in the image and likeness of God.

[... The raising of Lazarus shows us that] there is no limit to the divine mercy, which is offered to everyone. ... The Lord is always ready to roll away the tombstone of our sins, which separate us from him, the light of the living.]"



During the Lenten season, we ask you to pray for our Adults seeking Initiation. **I would like to ask you to also give them a card with a note of welcome to the parish.**

A simple Easter card is sufficient and the note need be nothing more than "Welcome to St. Jane Frances." These cards will then be given to the newly Initiated after the Easter Vigil. This gesture is always appreciated by our newest members, making them feel welcome and truly a part of the community of St. Jane Frances. This year, we have three catechumen: Deirdre Tracey, Nadia Raft, and Selah Fischer. Please bring your cards of welcome to the Parish Office by Holy Thursday, we'll see that they get to Deirdre, Nadia, and Selah. Thank you for your welcoming spirit and please remember our catechumen in your prayers this Lenten season!

REFLECTION

The Bible tells us that Jesus cried when friends of His were hurting. Jesus had a friend named Lazarus who became very sick. His sisters, Mary and Martha, sent word to Jesus and asked Him to come and heal Lazarus, but when Jesus arrived, Lazarus had already died. The Bible tells us that when Jesus saw Mary weeping because her brother had died, He cried too. That isn't all that Jesus did; listen to what happened next.

Jesus went with Mary and Martha and some others to visit the grave where Lazarus was buried. It was a cave with a large stone across the entrance. When they arrived at the tomb, Jesus said to some of the men who were with them, "Take away the stone." Then Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" And Lazarus walked out of the grave. I imagine that when she saw that, Mary's tears of sadness turned to tears of joy.

We all cry, and I am glad that we have a Savior who weeps, too. I am glad that He loves us so much that He hurts when we are hurting. He feels our pain. He sees our tears and He is there to make us feel better.

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION

- Do you remember a time you cried tears of joy?
- In what ways do you have hope in Jesus?

FAMILY ACTIVITIES

HOT POTATO WITH A TWIST: Play "Hot Potato" with family members and/or friends. If the music stops and you have the potato (or other item used instead of potato), you are out and must leave the circle. The person who just got "out" picks one other person. If that person gets stuck with the potato next, the first person gets back into the game.

NEW LIFE BUTTERFLY: With construction paper, cut out a butterfly. Color or decorate it as you choose. Use the butterfly as a reminder that just as a butterfly has new life when it comes out of its cocoon, so do we have new life in Jesus.




