### **SAFETY REPORT**



To card or not to card, that is the question. No, not Shakespeare, of course, far from the bard. Some may know, some may not know, the California boating law requires boaters to obtain and carry a "California Boater Card (CBC)" while operating a recreational motorized vessel on California

waterways. This requirement is being phased in over eight years beginning January 1, 2018 for persons 20 years or younger through January 1, 2024 for persons 60 years of age or younger and January 1, 2025 for all persons. This may seem non-safety re-

lated, but indeed it is. Many of us boaters have been a witness to incompetent actions by boaters out on the water. Often these actions lead to property damage, injury and even death. This is a fine example where a little knowledge can go a long way in keeping the boater out of trouble or even preventing an accident. There is a website, Boat-ed.com, where you can take a course of study and even, upon completion passing a test, obtain a California Boater Card if desired. Even if you have no desire to obtain a card, the knowledge gained will make you a better and safer boater. Be smart, be safe, stay healthy and wear that PFD when out on the water.

#### **RBOC Current News:**

RBOC and a number of additional boating community organizations are advocating for key revisions to Governor Newsom's proposed 250% vessel registration fee increase that would take effect on July 1. California boaters would see their boat registration fees increase from a minimum of \$20 every two years to at least \$70 every two years as soon as July 1 if the Governor's state budget proposal is enacted. Budget subcommittees in the state Senate and Assembly are discussing this proposal now, and are anticipated to decide on the issue in the next few weeks. as the state budget development process moves forward in the state capitol. RBOC leaders and advocates are lobbying and testifying.

# BILL'S STORY

Let's remember Bill. William O. Zerby was born in 1941 and grew up in San Leandro, CA. There he completed high school and after graduation Bill joined the Marine Corps. He completed boot camp, basic marine combat training and was assigned duty in a remote area of Alaska. While there he once encountered a submarine in a coastal inlet while on security patrol several miles from his base. Fearing it was a Soviet vessel, he hailed the individuals who emerged from the sub, held them at gunpoint and radioed the base. It turns out it was an American sub on a classified mission, and after alarming the captain who lodged a complaint with the base commander, he was "dressed down" severely. At the end of the reprimand he was complimented for his Marine spirit and given a "job well done" by his base commander. This officer was later involved in Bill's military career and was instrumental in recommending Bill for training and assignment as an armorer in small weapons. Bill was on the USMC pistol team and served with distinction. After serving in Vietnam, Bill returned to the country as a contractor where he was involved in classified duties. Bill had a brief experience as a "soldier of fortune" in Africa but found the job requirements unsatisfactory and declined to pursue that career further. After the military, Bill joined law enforcement in the Bay Area in the late 60s and 70s. He became well known in that arena, serving in drug enforcement and the organized crime bureau. A notable chapter in his law enforcement experience was as a narcotics officer investigating the Hells Angels. His activity against the club resulted in a nearly successful attempt on his life. A bomb placed near his car exploded when he was in close proximity, resulting in trauma and severe hearing loss which persisted the remainder of his life. A movie called "Hear No Evil" was made, chronicling this event. It starred Gil Gerard (as Bill); Bill played a cameo role in the film. While serving as a Solano County sheriff's deputy, Bill encountered many local and national celebrities

and maintained personal friendships with them. A notable example is Janice Joplin. He ultimately retired and went into private investigations. He worked for many noted Solano County defense attorneys until he retired in the late 90s, but he kept his hand in the game until last year. Bill joined the Vallejo Yacht Club in 1978 and had been active in sailing and club management ever since. Bill served as Rear and Vice Commodore and as a board member. Bill met his wife-to-be. Janice, while sailing during a club regatta. They were married and had a son they named Spencer. Spencer lives in Chico with his wife Liz and their new baby boy, Royal William Zerby. Bill was immensely proud of Spencer and overjoyed when he became a grandfather last year. Bill was an avid rancher and horseman. He lived near Vacaville for years, where he maintained a stable and rode frequently. Bill loved his horses and dogs. He was partial to Queensland Heelers and grieved over the loss of two of his four dogs last year who had lived to the ripe old doggie age of 15 or 16 years. Bill will be remembered by his irascible but good-natured approach to club management, politics and life in general. He will be missed by his many friends. He loved his family, friends, dogs, horses, sailing, firearms and the Vallejo Yacht Club. Sail on William O. Zerby. We will always remember you and smile.




