Whereas, the Union City Housing Authority, 11 12 City of Union City have developed a procedure for disbursements of funds for the -- from the 13 Affordable Housing Trust Fund in connection with 14 15 the Order of the Supreme Court of New Jersey 16 permitting the amendment of the City's Spending Plan; and 17 Whereas, it was previously determined that 18 19 the funds to rehabilitate the Housing -- Veterans 20 Housing at Cantello Street project would come from the Affordable Housing Trust Fund maintained 21 22 by the City; and Whereas, the Authority previously bid out 23 and selected ICON Architects as the Architect of 24

Record for the Cantello Street, Veterans Housing

Rehabilitation Project; and 1 Whereas, on February 15th, 2019, ICON 2 submitted an invoice to the Authority totaling 3 \$26,650.00 for work related to Cantello Street, 4 Veterans Housing rehabilitation, including 5 schematic design, design development and the 6 preparation of a portion of the relevant 7 construction documents. 8 And the Authority has reviewed the ICON's 9 invoice and has confirmed that the invoice and 10 the amount is proper; and 11 12 The Authority adopted this resolution memorizing (sic) and its author-- it's 13 authorization of payment of the -- of the invoice 14 15 and consistent with the procedure developed 16 between the Authority and the City. 17 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Oh. MR. SANGER: Oh, okay. 18 19 MS. BESHARA: I'm sorry. 20 MR. SANGER: Please come in. 21 Okay. Whereas, consistent with the procedure 22 developed between the Authority and -- and the 23 City of Union City, present this resolution to 24

the City and request the City to pay the invoice

1 30 days of -- within 30 days of the presentment
2 of this memorialized resolution.

And the bottom line with this is, as you well know, we've been provided with COAH moneys through the City of Union City and approved by the Supreme Court of New Jersey.

And those moneys now -- our procedure would be that as the work is being done at the Union City Housing Authority, we would forward the -- forward the invoice or as known as the bills, the bill to the City of Union City, and they will pay the vendors and -- and whoever has been providing those services from the City of Union City.

So that is the system that's been set up through -- through the legal process with the attorneys and, of course, through the courts as well and we will be following that process.

So this is the first bill we are submitting to -- as -- as the plans and the designs are being developed and set up for the COAH project at -- at Cantello Street.

So this is the first phase of that. And we'll be paying the architect who's been doing some good work for us. We seem like we're very up-to-date with things. And as long as the --
