Capizzi was sworn in 1 2 an Commissioner of the Union City Housing Authority by Erin Knoeldler, Union City Deputy 3 City Clerk.) 4 5 6 DEPUTY CITY CLERK: Congratulations. 7 COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: Thank you. 8 (Applause.) COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: Thank you. 9 10 DEPUTY CITY CLERK: I just need your signature. 11 12 And I'll take the original back --13 COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: Okay. DEPUTY CITY CLERK: -- and make sure that 14 15 you have copies. 16 COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: Where do I sign? DEPUTY CITY CLERK: We'll keep the 17 original on file. 18 19 Right here. 20 COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: Yup. MR. SANGER: As Commissioner Capizzi signs 21 we'd just like to --22 23 COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: Thank you for coming 24 over. 25 MR. SANGER: -- welcome her --

SANGER: And we will now go into an Open Session. 23 24 And, Mr. Morin, will you see if outside if there are any members of our community or any 25

10 people who may want to come forward --1 MR. MORIN: Outside? 2 MR. SANGER: -- for that. 3 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Mr. Chairman, I -- I 4 apologize that I just -- by the way I inserted a 5 thin report, which is another check register --6 COMMISSIONER JETTER: Yeah. 7 MR. RODRIGUEZ: -- from July 1st of all the 8 checks that we cut out of our vouchers -- our 9 10 Section 8 checking account. But I think the Chairman also had mentioned 11 12 there may be some other report that we are missing in -- in the package and -- you know, I, 13 you know, you're welcome to give him that as well 14 as -- basically if he -- if we can, you know, 15 16 discuss that later on. MR. SANGER: Most important be sure we have 17 that for the future for everyone. 18 19 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Absolutely. 20 MR. With that being declared, we'll move 10 forward now. 11 12 (Whereupon, the Board discussed and took 13 action on the following items: 14 CONSENT AGENDA: 15 16 A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF NOVEMBER 21, 2017 AND THE EXECUTIVE SESSION 17 MEETING OF NOVEMBER 21, 2017; 18 B. APPROVAL OF BIDS; 19 20 C. APPROVAL OF VARIOUS RESOLUTIONS RESOLUTION NO. 2018-142 - RESOLUTION 21 APPOINTING A COMMISSIONER FOR THE NJ PUBLIC 22 23 HOUSING AUTHORITY JOINT INSURANCE (JIF) FOR 2018; RESOLUTION NO. 2018-143 - RESOLUTION 24 APPROVING AN INCREASE IN THE CAP OF PAYMENTS TO 25

16 FRANK'S CARPET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$7,000.00; and 1 RESOLUTION NO. 2018-144 - RESOLUTION 2 APPROVING THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE EVALUATION 3 SELECTION COMMITTEE TO SELECT ICON ARCHITECTS LLC 4 TO PROVIDE ARCHITECTURAL AND ENGINEERING SERVICES 5 FOR THE 2017 CAPITAL FUND PROGRAM; 6 D. APPROVAL OF PAYMENT OF BILLS; and 7 E. ACCOUNT'S RECEIVABLES/DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS.) 8 9 MR. SANGER: And I just want to remind, as 10 we do each month, that the -- the following items 11 12 that we will read off in Resolutions and items, we will be part of a Consent Agenda that we will 13 vote upon at the end through Consent Agenda. 14 15 And the first thing I'd like to do is go 16 through four -- three Resolutions that we have this evening with the first one being Resolution 17 number 1 --18 Resolution number 142. 19 20 It's really a formality type of Resolution but it's something, of course, that must go 21 through the Board of Commissioners. 22 And that's a Resolution Appointing a 23 Commissioner for the New Jersey Public Housing 24 Authority JIF Insurance for 2018. 25

And, Whereas, the Union City Housing
 Authority is a member of the New Jersey Public
 Housing Authority Joint Insurance Fund; and

Whereas, the bylaws of the said Fund
requires that each member Housing Authority,
which is the Union City Housing Authority in our
case, appoint a Fund Commissioner to represent
and serve the Authority and Non-Profit as a
representative to the Fund; and

10 Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Board 11 of Commissioners of the Union City Housing 12 Authority do hereby -- do hereby appoint Jorge 13 Rodriguez as its Fund Commissioner to the New 14 Jersey Housing Authority Joint Fund for 2018.

So with that we'll -- we'll move forward with that one.

The next is Resolution 2018 - 143.

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18 Resolution Approving Increase in the Cap of
19 Payments to Frank's Carpet, in the total of
20 \$7,000.00.

And before I do get into reading this I
want to just share with you the original cap for
Frank's Carpet. And Frank's Carpet is a -- is a
vendor here from Union City.

We may have -- in a number of our units you

1 might have flooring issues, carpet issues, tile 2 issues. Sometimes you have water leakage and 3 tiles buckle. Things of that nature. And Frank 4 -- Frank's Carpet does have a contract with --5 with us. That cap on that was \$12,000.00 for 6 this year.

And, unfortunately, --

7

And it's something that I -- I take very -I take a very close look at in increasing caps to
be sure it's something that is totally necessary
and to be sure that we are looking at the -- you
know, the cost efficiencies and keep the cost
down for the Union City Housing Authority.

But in this particular case, with a number 14 15 of things that happened this winter with heating 16 issues, with pipes breaking, and things of that nature, led to a number of -- and one or two big 17 projects with water damage through pipes breaking 18 19 and pipes freezing and things of that nature. 20 MR. MORIN: And vacancy. MR. SANGER: You know? 21 22 And of -- of course there are vacancies. 23 When people move out you'd be very, very -- not -- well you wouldn't be surprised --24 25 COMMISSIONER DiNARDO: Mmm.

MR. SANGER: -- but it's something to see the amount of damage in many of these floors that people that move out.

And in order to get them into shape and to
get those apartments that are suitable for -for, you know, for people to live there and to
make them clean -- safe and clean and healthy for
them, we have to sometimes remove floors, put new
floors in, things of that --

10 That's what we call the turnover. We
11 turnover the apartment to -- to other people.

So with that being said we had quite a few this year and Frank already this year has gone over the 12,000 -- Frank's Carpet. And we're asking for an additional 7,000, which is very -in my mind very minimal and I'm going to try to keep to that as well.

So, give that -- because we have to do
what's right for our -- for the people, you know,
living within the units but at the same time we
have to keep a close eye on this when we're
exceeding some of our caps and things of that
nature.

So, there's amount -- that we could have
gone higher but in my -- in speaking with Jorge

20 and -- speaking with our CFO we wanted to be sure 1 we hold it down to a minimum. 2 So we're going to cap that at -- so the new 3 cap really will be 19,000. Be the original 12, 4 plus this 7, will be 19. So with that -- with 5 the floors. 6 7 So that we're looking to --Whereas, on October 2nd, 2017, the Housing 8 9 Authority entered into a contract with Frank's 10 Carpet with a capped amount of --And that's an -- that is an error there. 11 12 It should be capped amount of \$12,000.00. That's a typographical; it should be \$12,000.00 there. 13 And, Whereas, the contract is currently set 14 to expire on September 30th, 2018, and Frank's 15 16 Carpet has already exceeded its capped contractual amount; and 17 Whereas, the Authority recommends to 18 19 increase the cap amount of compensation payable 20 to Frank's Carpet for the remainder of the term by -- by the contract by \$7,000.00; and 21 Whereas, the Board of Commissioners have 22 the opportunity to discuss this at this table 23 with the increase and have been satisfied with 24 25 the responses; and

Be It Resolved, the Board of Commissioners
 of the Housing Authority of Union City that it
 approves an increase in the contractual cap
 payment amount to Frank's Carpet through
 September 30th, by \$7,000.00, which will be a
 total of \$19,000.00, on this day, January 18th,
 2018.

8 The next Resolution is one that I feel is
9 very important as we move the Housing Authority
10 forward.

And that is Resolution 2018-144.
And it's a Resolution Approving the
Recommendation of the Evaluation Selection
Committee to Select ICON Architects, LLC to
Provide Architectural and Engineering Services
for the 2017 Capital Fund Program.

And, Whereas, the Union City Housing
Authority sought requests for proposals for
architectural and engineering services for the
2017 Capital Fund Program; and

21 Whereas, five requests for proposals were 22 picked up by various architectural and 23 engineering services; and

Whereas, on December 14th, 2017, requests
for proposals were submitted by ICON Architects,

22 LSEA Corporation, and Lothrop Associates LLP. 1 And if you look at that, basically five 2 have picked up and three have submitted. 3 And with that the evaluation selection 4 committee has recommended to the Board 5 Commissioners ICON Architects to provide the 6 architectural and engineering services for this 7 2017 Fund; and 8 9 Whereas, in renewing (sic) the submission by ICON --10 And, Whereas, in reviewing that, with the 11 evaluation selection committee recommends those 12 services as a cost of, consistent with its 13 submission of \$11,400.00. 14 15 VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Um-hum. 16 MR. SANGER: And this, basically, is going to be for -- for doors -- for roofing and for 17 doors. 18 And the bottom line is that the REAC -- in 19 20 our REAC monitoring -- that's the Real -- the Real Estate --21 22 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Assessment. MR. SANGER: -- Assessment --23 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Center. 24 MR. SANGER: -- Program -- Center. 25

And what that does it monitors the Union City Housing Authority for our physical plant and with that they had recommendations strongly to us that we have to do things to -- to improve our fire doors, put new fire doors, and approve that -- and be sure that that's happening for the -you know, for our residents.

8 So, therefore, we had to get an architect 9 in to -- to go through that and take care of that 10 whole situation. And that's why we're asking for 11 the -- for this \$11,400.00 for the architect so 12 we can complete this project in -- in its best 13 way.

So, we're asking to do that and we're asking for your -- for your support with that.

And I'd also like to thank the selection
committee, who I met this week, and had a -- went
through that -- went through the selection
process and in its evaluation and to be sure that
this was done and it's appropriate legal -- in
appropriate legal manner.

23 Are there any questions on any of those24 Resolutions?

15	MR. SANGER: Approval of our Minutes.
16	Excuse me?
17	CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: Section 8 payments
18	also with the Consent?
19	MR. SANGER: Yes. The Section 8 will be
20	included
21	CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: Right.
22	MR. SANGER: in there as well,
23	MR. RODRIGUEZ: Excellent.
24	MR. SANGER: while it's not in your
25	packets.

1	25 And we will be sure that that Section 8
2	piece is in your packets for all the future
3	months.
4	We're sorry for that but we'll be sure that
5	that's in there.
6	Okay?
7	Okay, for Consent Agenda, I'd like to take
8	the vote.

2 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: Normal --MR. SANGER: Um-hum. 3 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: -- exceptions. 4 MR. SANGER: Um-hum. Okay. 5 6 And Vice Person -- Chairperson Gutierrez? VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Yes. 7 8 MR. SANGER: Okay. Commissioner Jetter? 9 10 COMMISSIONER JETTER: Yes. MR. SANGER: Commissioner DiNardo? 11 12 (No audible response; Commissioner DiNardo stepped out of the meeting.) 13 MR. SANGER: Commissioner Capizzi? 14 COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: Yes. 15 16 MR. SANGER: Commissioner Mundorf? COMMISSIONER MUNDORF: Yes. 17 MR. SANGER: Commissioner Pedraza? 18 COMMISSIONER PEDRAZA: Yes. 19 20 MR. SANGER: Okay. We have six yes; one not present at the 21 moment. And that carries -- our agenda carries. 22 23 So, if you don't have any questions towards that, a few things that I would like to go over. 24 25

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MR. SANGER: And just as far as a report from the -- from the Executive Director, just to keep you abreast of many of our projects, many things we're doing here at the Housing Authority. And many of these things you are responsible for; you vote on them each and every month. You've been tremendously supportive.

10 And I -- I just sent a letter just last week to all of the residents that are part of the 11 12 Union City Housing Authority; that includes the people in Section 8, that includes the people in 13 Public Housing, that includes the people that are 14 15 part of Veteran's Housing as well. And we sent a 16 letter to them, of course, wishing them a happy New Year, on behalf of myself as Director and on 17 behalf of yourselves as the Board. 18

19 And one thing we did with them is mention 20 to them and let them know and let it be known 21 throughout Union City in all of our Housing 22 projects now that we have now a -- a full 23 complement of security system throughout Union 24 City in all of our Housing projects. 25 COMMISSIONER JETTER: Yes. MR. SANGER: So you should be very proud of
 that. You worked hard -- we all worked hard on
 that. You voted for that.

One of the first things I heard when I came 4 to the Housing Authority here, that there was a 5 tremendous need for cameras for the security and 6 the safety of our residents. And with that we 7 were able to -- right now we've somewhat -- we've 8 spent in the vicinity now somewhere altogether of 9 about a hundred and seventy-five/eighty thousand 10 dollars on cameras. 11

But that's throughout Union City. That's our downtown sites, our -- our site here, our 3700 site.

VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Um-hum.

16 MR. SANGER: And hopefully in the future as we go through Veterans and -- and we move forward 17 in making improvement with Veterans, we're hoping 18 19 to do some type of security system in some of our 20 Veterans sites as well and include them in. CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: And -- and --21 MR. SANGER: But --22 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: -- they're paying 23

24 for themselves.

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MR. SANGER: Um-hum.

1 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: Because we see 2 the --MR. SANGER: Yes. 3 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: -- vandalism cost 4 come down every month. 5 VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Yeah, exactly. 6 Exactly. 7 8 MR. SANGER: That's right, Mr. --9 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: We used to have exorbitant bills --10 MR. SANGER: That's right, Mr. Martinetti. 11 12 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: -- for vandalism. MR. SANGER: And just working with the 13 Union City Police Department who has -- who has 14 15 an app right in the Police Department. They're 16 able to view our cameras right in the Police Department. 17 We've already worked with -- on five or six 18 19 cases where we were able to -- people who were 20 trespassing, intruders, I'll just say undesirables that shouldn't be here and different 21 22 ways that we're able to work with the Police Department. These people were arrested; 23 24 prosecuted. 25 Just a -- a few weeks ago we had a downtown

1 -- a robbery downtown in one of our apartments on 3rd Street. And because of our cameras that were exterior cameras they were able to crack the case --

5 VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Um-hum.
6 MR. SANGER: -- and get those people who
7 were responsible for that.

8 So already we've seen -- we've reaped the
9 benefits; we've seen a lot of benefits of this.

10 And -- and in my speaking with the Union City Police Department and speaking with Chief 11 12 Molinari he has said to me that this last summer and the last six months or so the -- the amount 13 of calls that they get to the Union City Police 14 15 Department, the amount of incidents there, has 16 gone down tremendously. And this last summer was the best summer they've ever had -- the Police 17 Department here at the Housing Authority when it 18 19 comes to, you know, disruptive people, when it 20 comes to, you know, people who may be

21 trespassing, undesirables, whatever it might be.

So, already the cameras that, you know, you helped support are paying dividends and certainly good things are happening with that. And we'd like to continue with that.

Also, I want to let you know we had a great 1 2 Christmas party here in our Pavilion at Christmastime and working with Mayor Stack and --3 But just to see the kids here -- the kids 4 here, you know, coming from low income and coming 5 from these buildings, and their parents, it was 6 -- it really was a great night. And there were 7 many, many people here. 8 9 And I think it was the last night of the toy giveaway for Christmas and these kids here 10 11 were going away literally with seven or eight 12 toys each --COMMISSIONER MUNDORF: Oh, that's nice. 13 VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Yes, yes, yes. 14 15 MR. SANGER: -- some of them --16 COMMISSIONER DiNARDO: Good. MR. SANGER: -- some of these little 17 18 ones --19 COMMISSIONER JETTER: Yeah, that's nice. 20 MR. SANGER: -- and everything. So, -- so, it was a great time and working 21 in partnership with the City and --22 23 COMMISSIONER MUNDORF: Yeah. MR. SANGER: -- and with everything. 24 But it's great to see the kids going through the --25

32 you know the holiday season happy. 1 COMMISSIONER DiNARDO: 2 Mmm. MR. SANGER: And the other thing is our SDA 3 project. 4 SDA project is we have a -- we have a 5 building downtown at 519-521 Summit Avenue that 6 has -- has 12/13 units that was part of an SDA 7 8 project. 9 The School Development Agency had obtained and acquired those properties back about ten 10 years ago. Was supposed to originally be the 11 12 site of the -- of the Union City -- it was going to be the site of the Union City --13 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Magnet. 14 15 MR. SANGER: -- magnet school, --16 COMMISSIONER DiNARDO: Mmm. MR. SANGER: -- which -- which we all know 17 is our gifted and talented program from Woodrow 18 19 Wilson to come to Union City originally. But we 20 wound up not using that site. I think we -- the -- the Board of Education made a choice to use 21 the old Gilmore site. 22 23 And now what's been there transpired as a beautiful school -- beautiful new school with, 24 you know, a good friend of ours, Gerry Perez, 25

being the Principal there and doing some great
 things there.

And but the thing that's what I think is -is most important though with the site downtown the State of New Jersey is also -- we have one building which they obtained, which is going to allow us to get about 12 units for people; to give people who need affordable housing.

9 So we worked closely with Mr. Martinetti from the Building Department, worked closely with 10 Mayor Stack. We've submitted through our 11 12 architect -- we submitted some plans through our architect on how we are going to rehab and build 13 a -- you know, get the place ready for -- for 14 15 living. Live -- make it, you know, living 16 conditions -- good living conditions. So we're moving forward with that. 17

For hope-- hopefully by this summer, early this summer, we'd really like to get people being in there. So we're trying to move forward aggressively with that.

We also have a COAH project with the -- the Coalition of Affordable Housing and there was a number -- a -- an amount of money in -- in the general area of \$600,000.00 that again, working

with Mayor Stack and working with Marty through
 the Building Department and many of the
 contractors and the developers of Union City and
 their contributions to the COAH funding, those - those monies have been built up.

And the Mayor and the Commissioners have
allowed us now and to forward that money to -with the approval of the courts --

VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Um-hum. 9 MR. SANGER: -- we're waiting for that 10 approval and we'll be able to fix up about 40 to 11 12 45 of our Veteran units. And improve those Veteran units with new bathrooms, new kitchens, 13 new, you know, floors, new roofing, new windows. 14 15 And just to get some of these -- those -- many of 16 these units are like -- you know they're like 60 years old or so. 17

18 VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Yeah.
19 MR. SANGER: So they really need some
20 rehabilitation and fixing up.

21 VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Um-hum.
22 MR. SANGER: So that's again something
23 that's going to be, you know, very positive for
24 us.

25

And we're also working very closely with

North Hudson Community Action Corporation, which
 presently owns what they call their Renaissance
 Project.

It's on 2601 Central Avenue. There are 35
units there that North Hudson Community Action
Corporation now -- they're feeling that they
really don't have the -- the ability or the
manpower to -- to manage a low income building
any longer -- affordable housing.

So we're working closely with them to see if they'll turnover those -- that building to us with 35 apartments there and we will run that as we do with -- as we do with our Veteran's Housing.

15 So the 12 apartments downtown, the 35 16 apartments at the Renaissance, and -- will allow us to have some, you know, 47, near 50 apartments 17 new for people for affordable housing for the 18 19 people of Union City. And also gives us an 20 opportunity to fix up, through COAH funding, fix up some of our existing at -- at the Veterans 21 Housing. 22

So, you know, some good things. A lot of
planning. Right now it's, you know, it's in the
development stage, it's in the planning stage.

It's also in the approval stage; going to courts 1 for approval, things of that nature, negotiating. 2 And we've already met two -- two or three times. 3 Erin was here earlier; she was at meetings with 4 me at North Hudson Community Action Corporation. 5 Erin representing Union City; myself representing 6 -- representing the Housing Authority. And to 7 see now how we can go about getting a good deal 8 for the Union City Housing Authority. 9

And to be sure that if we're going to enter 10 into any agreements and take over that we're 11 12 doing something that's going to have long term benefits for the Authority and for the people of 13 Union City. And to basically that we're -- we're 14 doing something that's right and down the road 15 16 that we're not going to get ourselves into something that might be, you know, fiscally -- a 17 fiscal problem or things of that nature. 18

So it's important for good planning and get the right people involved and we think we're doing that.

So, just wanted to let you know about these
three projects that are going on because it's
going to really, you know, be a boost for the
people of Union City in providing those -- those

areas and -- and, of course, fixing up the much
 needed Veterans apartments.

And the other thing is -- is I don't have 3 to tell you but the last, you know, month or so 4 with the frigid, you know, cold temperatures, 5 that has led to a number of issues when it comes 6 to heating issues, heating -- now I don't want to 7 8 say problems. It's not a problem; they're situations. Heating situations to be worked out. 9 Pipes that were broken because of the deepfreeze. 10 And so, you know, our staff here worked 11 12 very -- you know, a lot of overtime but a lot of work in order to maintain, you know, that people 13 -- that the people have warm places and a roof 14 15 over their head and the one -- you know, one of 16 quality.

So we did a lot of work those three weeks when it was really cold. And you know Waldo and Jorge and just about everyone chipping in and -and, you know, taking phone calls all hours of the night and doing certain things. Being here late at night and early in the morning.

So I just want to say, you know, I think we
-- we met the -- you know, we -- we met the
demand so to speak of -- of what comes with

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1	frigid weather and and, you know, those issues
2	that come with heating, come with broken pipes,
3	the things like that.
4	So I think we did a good job of addressing
5	those issues and what it might be.
6	So, with that being said I think that's all
7	I have.
8	Are there any questions?
9	Any thoughts?
10	Okay. Okay.
11	
12	PUBLIC COMMENT:
13	
14	MR. SANGER: Yes, any any comments from
15	the public or anything like that?
16	CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: Did we open the
17	door?
18	MR. SANGER: Yeah.
19	COMMISSIONER DiNARDO: We didn't open the
20	door.
21	MR. SANGER: It was yeah, it was
22	VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Yeah, he
23	opened the door.
24	MR. SANGER: there was no one there.
25	COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: There was nobody out

25	COMMISSIONER CAPIZZI: Yes.
