          And what I was able to include in your
    packet was a copy of all the Resolutions. You
25
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have the Resolutions themselves but you also have
a list of the Resolutions and you also have the
cap -- the money cap that's attached to each one
of the Resolutions because, of course by your
direction, the Chairman's direction, a cap was
always included in all our Resolutions and in all

7 our contracts with the -- with those people who

8 | will be awarded the -- through the Resolutions.

So when they get to the award they will do their contract. The contract will also state the cap and sign -- sign with that cap as well.

I want to point out to you that this is the third year that we're doing this and as far as the cap on all these items, we -- we went to the 15 percent decrease and all the caps some three years ago we still have that 15 percent decrease today, with showing we're having a consistency. And this is our third year of 15 percent decrease.

And while we're always interested in providing the best services possible for our tenants and for our residents, at the same time we're always looking for cost-efficiency and looking for cost savings. And by holding that percentage down, we're able to, you know, have

daily operations that will make it, you know,
economically feasible and for all of us here at
the Authority.

So with that being said, please bear with me. I have about 13 Resolutions that I must read to you this afternoon and I'll -- I'll try to be as, you know, as thorough as possible but at the same time try to save some time as well.

You'll see that they're a combination of Resolutions here this afternoon. Some being as related to the New Jersey Finance Board; some being related to finance as far as our audit that we must submit each year to the State and, of course, present to you.

We're also going to have Resolution as to some of the vendors, which I mentioned. And we're also going to have three of our Resolutions as to some of our professional services that we'll be awarding this afternoon -- professional services, which will include our computer services, fee accountant services, and auditing services.

I do want to take a minute to thank three of our Board members who were part of our Selection Committee -- Miss Jetter, Miss

- Gutierrez, Miss Capizzi -- who spent some time

 here last week to look over the -- going through

 the, you know, all of the -- the submittals for

 people with the RFPs and in taking the time to do
- that through our point scoring system, makingthose selections.

And their recommendation and their selections are certainly brought us to the decision of who we're recommending this evening through our Resolutions and through your -- and, of course, through your vote.

So with that being said, the first one I'd like to do is the Resolution Number 149, which is something that's required by law.

All of you had signed this evening -- I hope have signed this. And it has to do with our auditing.

Please do not leave this evening without signing this very important Resolution. It has to do with the -- the governing body of each local authority to cause an annual audit of its accounts to be made, and whereas, the annual audit report for the fiscal year June 30th, 2017 has been completed and filed with the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey; and

Requires a governing body of the Authority
to, within 44 (sic) days of receipt of the annual
audit, certify by resolution to the Local Finance
Board that each member has personally reviewed
the annual audit report, --

A copy of that report, of course, is in your -- in your packet.

-- and therefore personally reviewed that, as well as the sections of the audit report entitled "General Comments" and

"Recommendations," and has evidenced same by group affidavit -- prescribed Finance Board.

That affidavit is what you're signing this evening and that will -- you know, will serve to cover that area.

Therefore let it -- be resolved that the governing body of the Housing Authority, City of Union City, requires the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that each governing body member has personally reviewed the audit and -- as of June 30, '17, and has made these -- and has looked over all these requirements.

Number 150.

Housing Authority, City of Union City,
Resolution Authorizing the Housing Authority to

1 Re-Bid for the Boilers and Fire Side and Water2 Side Cleaning.

And, basically, to -- to make this very simple, we did not get the bidders to help us with the -- what we usually do each year for boilers and fire side/water side cleaning in a -- you know, in emergency capacity.

So we're asking to re-bid again and we're going to do our best to get the word out to one -- you know, a number of the companies to maybe come in and, you know, help us towards that.

So we're looking to recruit, get the word out that we are looking for people to do this.

But it is an important item, so we're asking you to allow us to re-bid this evening for that one and that is item Number 150.

Resolution Number 151.

Resolution Approving Bid Submission and Contract for Landscaping Services.

And, whereas, the City of Union City
Housing Authority sought bids for landscaping
services.

And on March $28^{\rm th}$, 2018, one bid was received by the Union City Purchasing Agent. And let -- let us remind you at this time that all

these bids were opened --1 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: City Clerk. 2 MR. SANGER: -- at the Union City City 3 Hall, --4 CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: City Clerk 5 6 receives --7 MR. SANGER: -- City Clerk's Office. 8 Yes. 9 Reviewed and opened at the City Clerk's 10 Office in the -- and at the City of Union City and has led to this -- the first -- you know, the 11 12 steps of this process, getting the assistance of City Hall and the City Clerk. 13 Also, the contract shall be paid in 14 accordance with the rates set forth in the bid 15 16 proposal submitted and not to exceed \$10,600.00. So we will be awarding this to Bill's 17 Landscaping. They have been with us -- this will 18 be their third year with us and our relationship 19 20 with them has improved last year. We had done some -- they already made some improvements and 21 work with us on how -- you know, basically, on 22 how we're looking to focus on certain areas and 23 make improvements, whether it be, you know, with 24 the -- with the grass, with spring cleanup, with 25

- 1 trimming some of our trees and bushes and things
- 2 of that nature. Just to beautify and to clean up
- 3 our area.
- 4 So, we will be working with Bill's
- 5 Landscaping on that item.
- 6 Also, Resolution Number 152.
- 7 Approving Contract for Truck and Car8 Maintenance and Repairs.
- 9 Not that we have that many trucks and -
 10 and cars as a part of our fleet here at the Union

 11 City Housing Authority. As you well know we do
- 12 have two brand new trucks. Hopefully the
- 13 maintenance of that is very minimal, --
- 14 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Yes.
- MR. SANGER: -- knowing that they're new trucks and new items. We have two new trucks
- 17 that now are on its second year that -- you know,
- 18 | -
- 19 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Um-hum.
- 20 MR. SANGER: -- have been certainly a, you know, positive addition to us and working with our maintenance men and everyone.
- So, this is -- this is an item that was seldom used now but we do have it if any of our equipment does breakdown as related to where

- we're doing this at \$65.00 per hour, which is the going rate. And we'll be -- that will be awarded to Delvalle -- Delvalle Auto Clinic here in Union City.
- 5 Number 153.

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- Resolution Approving Contract for

 Stenographer Services at the Board of -- at the

 Board of Commissioners Monthly Meeting.
 - And, of course, we're very happy with the stenographer who works with us -- with Audio-Digital Transcript Services and -- a/k/a Debbie that works with us. And she does a fine job for us and we're looking to continue with those services. And we'll be working with Debbie with -- in a contract with her with the bid submitted and not to exceed \$235.00 per -- per attendance. And we worked that out -- a formula with her for that.
 - So and that's very well in the past and we're looking to continue with that.
- 21 Number -- Resolution Number 1-5-4 -- 154.
- 22 Resolution Approving Contract for 23 Afterhours Telephone Answering Service.
- 24 As most of you know, our office does 25 shutdown at four o'clock. We do have a number of

people who answer the phones here on a regular
basis and that has worked out very well the last
two years or so.

Prior years we may have not had had -- you know, we've had -- the calls were being bumped to an answering service and whatever during the day.

But now we do have a live voice --

VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Um-hum.

MR. SANGER: -- that are receiving calls and working with the people and working with the community and taking those calls. So it's done in a more professional way and more of a -- more of a customer service way in assisting those people.

But at four o'clock we do go home and then we do with the -- an answering service does kick in at four -- from four o'clock in the evening -- the afternoon until eight o'clock the next morning when it's turned on again by our daily staff.

VICE CHAIRPERSON GUTIERREZ: Um-hum.

MR. SANGER: So that -- we are working with and awarding that to the Academy Group who are -- who work out of Hackensack.

And it's a flat rate of \$321.00 for 13

billings a year. So, it's a flat rate, 13 times
a bill of \$321.00.

The Resolution Approving -- Number 155.

Approving Contract for Painting Service for Union City Housing Authority Administrative Office.

We've been working on this for about, oh a year and a half, two years, and this -- our facility here has not been painted in some 25 years.

CHAIRPERSON MARTINETTI: Wow.

MR. SANGER: And we're looking to do that.

And we've gone out for bids. We've had many companies come in and work on this with us and the sticking point in many of it was the fact that there was -- there was so much -- as you see these offices are really built like a maze here. It's kind of an older facility. And we have a lot of furniture and different things that had to be moved and cabinets and desks and file cabinets and things of that nature.

So it wasn't an easy job to get people to bid for. But we did have someone now who is coming in to do the painting services for that, which is the first step after that and we're

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looking to award that bid for $16,000.00 to

It's good that we have someone -- we've had bids were picked up of 17 five -- by five different companies and received 18 by the Union City Purchasing Agent at City Hall. 19 20 And the bid submitted by L&E Construction Company met all the requirements of the bid and 21 will be deemed legally sufficient. 22 23 And they have been awarded the bid, of course after your vote, and not to exceed 24 \$5,100.00 a year and an hourly rate of \$40.00 per 25

And one of those were -- the bid submitted 13 by Max Adamo met all the requirements of the bid 14 specification and was deemed legally sufficient. 15 16 And, therefore, the contract shall be paid in accordance with the rate set forth in the 17 proposal; not to exceed 4,495 for replacement of 18 19 steps, with railings; and rates of \$9.50 per 20 square foot of replacement of concrete; and \$4.75 per square foot for asphalt. 21 We've worked with Max Adamo in the past. 22 We've had a good relationship with him. He --23

with the bid and we're hoping to continue with

1 Next item is Number 158.

Resolution Approving the Operating Budget for the Housing Authority and Operating Budget for the State of New Jersey.

And whereas, the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority of Union City, voted to adopt Resolution Number 2018-158, to Approve Operating Budget for the Housing Authority and Operating Budget for the State of New Jersey Fiscal Year 7/1/18 to 6/30/19;

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority, City of Union City, adopt Resolution 158 and hereby establish on this date of April 19th.

And some of you may ask about our budget and with that you'll see here the -- you know, some attachments that are here. These attachments I put here for you so you could see the fiscal year. You could see the actual -- which was sent to -- being sent to the State of New Jersey and, of course, to HUD. And you'll also see the budget itself with the figures.

And I'm sure you don't have time to peruse through them now but if ever you do have some time you could see.

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And what I can say to you, our operating

Thank you to that Evaluation Committee.

And Angel Consultant was determined to be the lowest responsible bidder. And we'll be working with Angel to that. And that contract shall be in accordance with the bid not to exceed \$78.00 per hour.

And we've worked with Angel for a number of years now and he has been an asset and provided some quality services for efficiency here when it comes to anything with IT and technology and related to that.

So we're looking forward to again working with him on that.

Resolution Number 161.

1 Approving Contracts for Fee Accountant.

And two companies picked up the request for proposal. One company submitted a response for that proposal.

And they will not exceed \$13,080.00. And they did -- and they have worked with us very closely in -- through the auditing process.

And just recently has spent some extra time with us and gave us some -- some consulting and some advice and what things we can start doing now to maybe cut the costs here at the Housing Authority and our -- you know our ongoing efforts to be as, you know, you know as fiscally responsible as possible.

And they're working very closely with us making recommendations on the areas that we can concentrate on to cut some down -- cut down on some of our costs.

So we have really everyone working towards

The other is a Renaissance project at 2601 Central Avenue, which is currently being managed by the Union -- by the North Hudson Community Action Corporation.

We're looking to take over that facility
there with 36 units. And we've met with the -with the attorneys. We've met with the architect
there. We've done walkthroughs. We've done
assessments. We've met with the management
company there. We've met with the finance people
at -- CFO at the North Hudson Community Action
Corporation.

We're doing everything possible to, you know, -- due diligence to get a good research and to be sure that we're getting a good deal. And something that, you know, we know is going -- something we know is going to be very positive and something in the future that we know is not going to give us any -- any difficulties at all.

So we're working very closely on that.
