
Walk 17 – A Winters Tale

Description: A Christmas cracker of a walk, taking you on a festive ramble around the Penshurst Estate.

Length: 2.93 miles / 4.7 km (approximately 1.5 hours, longer if stopping at Penshurst Place enroute)

Grade: Not too tough (this will be more challenging when muddy)

Good for: A Boxing Day walk

- 1. Begin your walk at Penshurst village hall. There is limited parking in the village and further up Penshurst Road, near the Fir Tree tea room.
- 2. Walk down Rogues Hill past the Leicester Arms pub and then turn left through the archway into Penshurst Place.
- 3. Follow the grass path between the driveway and the wall and when you reach the junction, continue straight along the driveway/road in the direction of Well Place.
- 4. Walk past two lakes and then turn left through the metal gate, before following the path uphill.

- 5. Go through a second gate and then continue to follow the path uphill.
- 6. At the top of the hill turn left and continue along the flat path until you reach a large gate then cross through the fence and continue straight on.
- 7. Continue along the concrete path, following this to the top of the hill before turning left and walking along a wide avenue of trees.
- 8. When you reach the end of this path, turn left and walk downhill. This is steep and slippery when muddy so do watch your step!
- 9. At the bottom of the hill walk past the giant oak tree and then follow the path to the right. On your right you will see the remains of the bear/Sidney oak.
- 10. Pass through the metal gate and then continue along the path past a lake ringed with hedge columns.
- 11. Go through the kissing gate and continue through Penshurst Park, heading towards the house.
- 12. Continue straight on and walk past the cricket pitch, keeping this to your left.
- 13. Keep going until you reach the metal fence and then cross through two kissing gates with a driveway between them.
- 14. Follow the path round, keeping Penshurst Place to your left. There will be a cluster of pine and fir trees.
- 15. Continue past the neatly trimmed hedge and wall surrounding the house until you reach a kissing gate that leads under a Holly bush and into the church yard.
- 16. Walk through the church yard and under the Guild house into Leicester Square.
- 17. Turn right and retrace your steps past the Leicester Arms pub and back to the village hall.
