Heather Lofdahl is a string teacher, conductor, and violist who is pursuing a PhD in Music Education at The University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Ms. Lofdahl teaches orchestra classes at Cone and Peck Elementary Schools and Guilford Preparatory Academy. She is an assistant conductor of the UNCG Sinfonia. Prior to returning to Greensboro in 2019, Ms. Lofdahl taught orchestra in Cobb County (GA). She has also taught elementary through university orchestra students in Illinois and North Carolina. While living in Greensboro from 2012-2015, she was the assistant conductor of the Greensboro Symphony Youth Philharmonic, so she is thrilled to be conducting the Greensboro Symphony Youth Strings this season! She also serves on the faculty of the Florida State University String Orchestra Camp every summer.

Ms. Lofdahl holds Bachelor of Arts degrees in Music Education and Viola Performance from Augustana College and Master of Music degrees in Music Education and Viola Performance from The University of North Carolina at Greensboro. She is an active guest conductor, clinician, and violist throughout the United States.

Colleen is an active freelance artist who performs throughout North Carolina and Virginia. She currently performs with the Greensboro Symphony and has been the concertmaster of the Danville Symphony Orchestra. Colleen is Suzuki certified in books one through six and has taught private and group lessons to preschool through college students at all levels. In addition, Colleen is a North Carolina certified teacher with experience teaching chorus, general music and orchestra.



## YOUTH ORCHESTRA MUSIC DIRECTOR



### **EVAN FELDMAN**

Dr. Evan Feldman has been engaged as Principal Guest Conductor for the Greensboro Symphony's 2020-2021 season. His duties will include: Music Director of the GSYO, conductor for the 3rd 4th, and 7th grade concerts in four counties, and for the annual Holiday concerts in Greensboro, Burlington, and Statesville. Dr. Feldman currently serves as Associate Professor at UNC Chapel Hill, leading the Wind Ensemble and Symphony Band and teaching courses in conducting and music education, as well as Music Director of the Triangle Wind Ensemble and cover conductor for the NC Symphony. Dr. Feldman is sought after both nationally and internationally as a guest conductor, with recent engagements throughout the United States, Romania, Belgium, Spain, and Tanzania. He has been described in the press as "...the real thing – a conductor with evident ensemble-building skills who knows his way around the podium."

Dr. Feldman earned the Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting from the Eastman School of Music, where he studied with Donald Hunsberger and Mendi Rodan. He received his Master of Music in Conducting from Ithaca College and his BA in Music from Duke University.

## ABOUT THE GSYO

The Greensboro Symphony Youth Orchestra provides a professionally directed environment for young musicians to study, prepare, and perform music, serves the community at large by providing high quality, free performances, complements school music programs, and encourages and advocates the arts, music, and music education in the Piedmont Triad region.

Composed of many of the Triad's best and brightest young musicians, the GSYO attracts outstanding students from Raleigh, Fayetteville, Charlotte, and Southern Virginia. Students in all groups enjoy unparalleled orchestral opportunities, lifelong friendships, a strong complement to their school music education, and a deeper connection with music. The GSYO season runs from September through May with frequent performances in the Triad's major concert venues.

The GSYO program includes three ensembles. The Youth Orchestra is a challenging and nurturing environment for highly advanced orchestral playing, including strings, woodwinds, brass, and percussion. The Youth Philharmonic, for advanced string players who are looking for an enriching

and motivating ensemble, is conducted by Greensboro Symphony violinist Colleen Chenail. The Youth Strings, conducted by Heather Lofdahl, is a string ensemble where students can focus on technical, musical, and ensemble skills in an environment with students of similar age. For 2020-2021, the Greensboro Symphony Youth Orchestra will offer online and in-person musical activities. Members accepted into a GSYO ensemble have the option of participating online, in-person, or in both ways. Youth Philharmonic members are rehearsing as a smaller group inperson, and participating online either live or on their own schedule. Youth Strings members have two exciting options a traditional Western Classical approach in-person, and a new online Music of World Cultures program. Youth Orchestra members have in-person ensembles for chamber music and chamber orchestra, as well as a new online course covering Theory and Analysis, and Composition, Improvisation, and Digital Audio. Online activities will feature guest artists from around the world!
