If Given a Chance is celebrating its 25th year dedicated to Napa County youth. 2020 has been a year filled with innovation for our program and the need for flexibility to deal with today's rapidly changing environment. We have expanded our services and deepened our commitment to our vulnerable aspiring students in this, our twenty-fifth year thank you to our dedicated supporters who continue with us as we pivoted our Annual Awards Dinner to a six-day online video celebration sharing our students' stories, as we reached out to founding community board members and students from years past to share their personal experiences. Each year we highlight and honor one of our amazing alumnae. Cinthya Cisneros, a 2008 IGAC recipient, thanks to you is living her dream. Cinthya, who entered this country as an immigrant, grew up in a low income household.

Her parents worked extremely hard. She experienced unspeakable personal trauma. She did not believe that college was within reach. At that time there was no DACA or Dream Act and due to her immigration status, she was ineligible for most student aid programs. She was heartbroken that, while she was accepted to UC Berkeley, she had to decline because she lacked the necessary funds (\$30,000-\$50,000 a year).

Cinthya didn't give up. She was awarded financial and emotional mentoring from If Given a Chance throughout her years at Sonoma State University. Numerous times she didn't know if she would be able to "make it". Cinthya entered college as a frightened, economically insecure Latina student, not only in terms of her ethnicity, but also in regard to her career choice, science, a field dominated primarily by men

"Having the support of If Given a Chance through those years was essential to help me navigate my future, be able to go to college and ultimately give back."

Cinthya graduated from Sonoma State University with a Bachelors of Science degree in Chemistry and within days got her U.S. Residency that enabled her to work. She then went on to get her teaching credential and was a role model for high school students who share her passion for the field.
