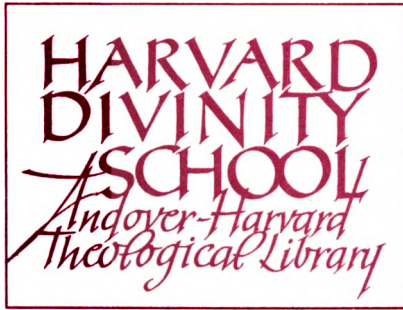

Organ Prelude.

(Minister and People rise, and the people remain standing until after the salutation.)

Doxology.

Invocation, closing with the Lord's Prayer, or the Creed, in which all join.

Salutation. (Minister.)

May Grace, Mercy, and Peace, from God the Father and Christ
Jesus our Lord, be upon you all. *Amen.*

(Or some other form chosen by the Minister.)

(People sit.)

Anthem. CHOIR.

Announce the Scripture Lesson, and after it has been read add
"The Lord bless the reading of His holy word."

Response. CHOIR.

* **Hymn. CHOIR.** (*Announced by Minister but not read.*)

Responsive Reading. — Gloria. (People standing.)

(Announce Selection, and wait for place to be found by Congregation. People rise as Minister reads the opening sentence. The Gloria is sung by Choir and Congregation at the close of the reading.)

Prayer.

Hymn. CHOIR. (*Announced, but not read, by Minister.*) (People standing.)

Offering. (*If one is to be taken.*)

Sermon.

Congregational Hymn. (*Announced by Minister.*) (People standing.)

(People sit at the close of the Congregational Hymn, and remain seated during the Prayer and Benediction which follow.)

Prayer. — Benediction.

(The "Amen" of the Benediction is given by Choir and Organ.)

Organ Postlude.

* This hymn may be omitted at the evening service.

The Ten Commandments.

I. Thou shalt have no other gods before me.

PREFACE.

THE following pages contain portions of the Sacred Scriptures selected chiefly from the Psalms, but also from the Prophets, the Gospels, the Epistles, and the Revelation, for the use of Christian congregations in public worship. The most of them are appropriate to the ordinary services of the Lord's Day. The rest are adapted to the special services of Christmas, Easter, Thanksgiving Day, Fast Day, missionary meetings, and the Lord's Supper.

These selections are not designed to be read with the aim of instruction, but to be recited for the ends of worship. The book is not a lectionary, but a manual of devotion.

In the view of the writers, both of the Old Testament and the New, worship¹ is the offering to God of thought and emotion in some form of expression. The worshiper is not passive, but active; not the subject of impressions, but the agent of expressions. It is enough that his mind be engaged in thought, his heart excited to emotion. He must "direct," "lift up," his soul to God, and signify or utter his sentiment, his thoughtful emotion, to him.

This is clear enough with respect to those exercises which all agree in recognizing as acts of worship. These are all directed to God and expressive. Otherwise they are not complete, however proper and salutary they may be to the spiritual life. Contemplation of the majesty and perfection of God with emotions of reverence and admiration is not *adoration*; recollection of the divine mercies with the emotion of gratitude is not *thanksgiving*; consideration of dependence and need with the feeling of desire is not *prayer*. If the familiar lines,

"Prayer is the soul's sincere desire,
Uttered or unexpressed,"

be interpreted in the strict sense of the words and taken as a true description for guidance in practice, the result will be perilous, if not

fatal, to that life which is quickened and sustained by communion with God. The poet is in error, unless by "uttered" he means *spoken*, and by "unexpressed," *unspoken*. Desire may be signified, and so become supplication or petition, by other tokens than those of articulate speech, as the poet himself says in his stanzas following. But, still, speech is the natural medium of devotion. Our Lord, when asked to teach his disciples how to pray, responded: "When ye pray, say, Our Father," etc. The apostle teaches, "In everything, by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known unto God." He who is revealed in the High-priest, who "can be touched with the feeling of our infirmities," no doubt regards the "burden of a sigh," and the "falling of a tear,"—so he does the fall of a sparrow, but it is not a prayer.

From the earliest ages, among all races which have cherished the religious sentiments, song has been a natural, though not universal, means of expression in worship. The poet has framed the language of emotion in the lyrical form, and the musician has adapted to it fit melodies, sung often with the accompaniment of instruments.

These hymns have been, for the most part, devotional, not indirectly, but directly so, addressed to God. The call to sing them might appropriately have been that which was so familiar to the Hebrew people, "O come let us sing *unto the Lord!*" Among their own psalms, preserved to us, by far the greater number were utterances of penitence, confession, aspiration, thanksgiving, petition, faith, hope, love to God. Though sung by sentences alternately, or, as we say, "responsively," or "antiphonally," they were sung in the spirit of the apostle's exhortation, "speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your hearts unto the Lord."¹

There are, indeed, psalms in which the patriotic blends with the religious sentiments, and even such as the worshipers were wont to address to each other, designed to excite the emotions and incite to noble action in the service of Jehovah. But these simply make it evident that song has no religious uses aside from the ends of pure worship. But even these battle-songs and triumphal anthems were sung as in the presence of Jehovah, in the spirit of another exhortation of the same apostle, "teaching and admonishing one another in

psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts unto the Lord.”¹

Song, then, has been a natural, though not universal, means of devotional expression; not universal inasmuch as all men are not endowed with musical gifts, bodily and mental. Speech alone is general and nearly universal, and must be always the common medium of worship.

If it be asked whether the deaf and dumb, the feeble, the paralyzed, and the dying, can not acceptably worship, and, especially, “make their prayer unto God,” the answer is plain. It is not to be doubted that they may direct their souls to God, and so seek him as to find him, so ask as to receive. But they can not present those offerings of worship which we are taught in the Scriptures to offer to God. Men, from any cause defective, can not perform perfect acts, though their intention is accepted. The will is taken for the deed.

There can be no question, however, concerning the manner of common worship. Without some form of expression it can not be the united offering of the worshipers. It is true there may be a leader of devotions, whose utterances the people may understand and adopt. But this implies all we have affirmed, though not completely. It would be better if the custom of the Christian assemblies of apostolic times were followed, the people saying, Amen, at the pauses, or at the close of the prayer. It is one of the lasting excellencies of a liturgy that it provides for utterances from the people in unison, and, accordingly, in “decency and in order.”

This exposition of the Scriptural conception of worship is designed to encourage the adoption of such methods in our religious services as may engage the entire congregation in acts of devotion, directed immediately to God, expressive of thought and emotion to him. It is also intended to meet the objection made by respectable authorities that such selections as these here presented are essentially, and most of them formally, lyrical, and, accordingly, proper to be sung and not to be read. Indeed, it has recently been asserted that it is quite absurd to read them as we commonly do, that the correct thing is to have them sung antiphonally by different choirs, in case of the Psalms, which consist of parallel phrases reiterating the sentiment, and, in case of the Doxologies, in full chorus. This, no doubt, might

be best if all congregations were composed of singers, and all the singers were trained to the task.

At present, in many congregations, the services are such as make no call and afford no help to the people to engage in acts of worship. Prayer is made for them or on their behalf; praise is sung for them, this too often nominally, while, in fact, music is performed for æsthetic effect—is not spiritual or even religious in design and tone; and preaching is addressed to them. In the churches in which the people speak audibly in prayer, and so many as are able sing in praise, the recitation of the Psalms affords an opportunity for expression to those who have neither the voice nor the musical ear for song. It is for this purpose that these selections have been prepared. By way of emphasis, it is repeated, they are not intended to be read as lessons. For each of them the rubric of the Canticles in the prayer-book would be gladly adopted “to be SAID or sung.”

The division into phrases for alternate recitation by the minister and the people has been made with care, and, as far as practicable, is natural, according to the movement of the sentiment. In many instances the parallelisms of the original have been followed. Where the phrases are short they have been neglected, since experience has shown that otherwise there can not be such rhythm and flow in the recitation as are needful to the best effect. In this departure pains have been taken to secure congruity and symmetry in the alternate parts.

The Revised Version has been used for the reason that it is a more exact expression of the original text. Such use of it as is here contemplated may incidentally furnish a test to a common objection to the Revised Version, namely, that its style is not rhythmical and fluent, and, therefore, resonant and impressive in the utterance.

RESPONSIVE READINGS.

PSALM I.

Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the wicked,

Nor standeth in the way of sinners,

Nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.

But his delight is in the law of the Lord ;

And in his law doth he meditate day and night.

And he shall be like a tree planted by the streams of water,

For thou hast smitten all mine enemies upon the cheek
bone ;

Thou hast broken the teeth of the wicked.

Salvation belongeth unto the Lord :

Thy blessing be upon thy people.

PSALM IV.

Answer me when I call, O God of my righteousness ;

Thou hast set me at large when I was in distress :

But know that the Lord hath set apart him that is godly for

And put your trust in the Lord.

Many there be that say, Who will show us any good ?

Lord, lift thou up the light of thy countenance upon us.

Thou hast put gladness in my heart,

**More than they have when their corn and their wine are

In peace will I both lay me down and sleep :

 For in death there is no remembrance of thee:
In Sheol who shall give thee thanks?
 I am weary with my groaning;
Every night make I my bed to swim;
I water my couch with my tears.
 Mine eye wasteth away because of grief;

 For thou hast made him but little lower than God,
 And crownest him with glory and honour.
 Thou madest him to have dominion over the works of thy

Yea, lightnings manifold, and discomfited them.

At the blast of the breath of thy nostrils.

He delivered me from my strong enemy,

And from them that hated me, for they were too mighty for me.

They came upon me in the day of my calamity :

But the Lord was my stay.

He brought me forth also into a large place ;

He delivered me, because he delighted in me.

The Lord rewarded me according to my righteousness ;

According to the cleanness of my hands hath he recompensed me.

For I have kept the ways of the Lord,

And have not wickedly departed from my God.

For all his judgments were before me,

And I put not away his statutes from me.

I was also perfect with him,

And I kept myself from mine iniquity.

Therefore hath the Lord recompensed me according to my righteousness,

According to the cleanness of my hands in his eyesight.

With the merciful thou wilt show thyself merciful ;

With the perfect man thou wilt show thyself perfect ;

With the pure thou wilt show thyself pure ;

And with the perverse thou wilt show thyself froward.

For thou wilt save the afflicted people ;

But the haughty eyes thou wilt bring down.

For thou wilt light my lamp :

The Lord my God will lighten my darkness.

For by thee I run upon a troop ;

And by my God do I leap over a wall.

As for God, his way is perfect :

The word of the Lord is tried ; he is a shield unto all them that trust in him.

For who is God, save the Lord ?

And who is a rock beside our God ?

The God that girdeth me with strength, and maketh my way perfect.

He maketh my feet like hinds' feet : and setteth me upon my high places.

Thou hast also given me the shield of thy salvation :

**And thy right hand hath holden me up, and thy gentleness
hath made me great.**

Thou hast enlarged my steps under me, and my feet have
not slipped.

PSALM XIX.

The heavens declare the glory of God ;

And the firmament showeth his handywork.

Day unto day uttereth speech,

And night unto night showeth knowledge.

There is no speech nor language ;

Their voice cannot be heard.

Their line is gone out through all the earth,

And their words to the end of the world.

In them hath he set a tabernacle for the sun,

**Which is as a bridegroom coming out of his chamber, and
rejoiceth as a strong man to run his course.**

His going forth is from the end of the heaven,

**And his circuit unto the ends of it: and there is nothing hid
from the heat thereof.**

The law of the Lord is perfect, restoring the soul :

The testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple.

The precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart :

The commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes.

The fear of the Lord is clean, enduring for ever :

The judgments of the Lord are true, and righteous altogether.

More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine
gold :

Sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb.

Moreover by them is thy servant warned :

In keeping of them there is great reward.

Who can discern his errors ?

Clear thou me from hidden faults.

Keep back thy servant also from presumptuous sins ;
 Let them not have dominion over me : then shall I be perfect,
 and I shall be clear from great transgression.
 LET THE WORDS OF MY MOUTH AND THE MEDITATION OF
 MY HEART BE ACCEPTABLE IN THY SIGHT, O LORD,
 MY ROCK, AND MY REDEEMER.

PSALM XX.

The Lord answer thee in the day of trouble ; the name of
 the God of Jacob set thee up on high ;
 Send thee help from the sanctuary, and strengthen thee out
 of Zion ;
 We will triumph in thy salvation, and in the name of our
 God we will set up our banners :
 The Lord fulfil all thy petitions.
 Now know I that the Lord saveth his anointed ;
 He will answer him from his holy heaven with the saving
 strength of his right hand.
 Some trust in chariots, and some in horses :
 But we will make mention of the name of the Lord our God.
 They are bowed down and fallen : but we are risen, and
 stand upright.
 Save, Lord : let the King answer us when we call.

SELECTION FROM PSALM XXII.

I will declare thy name unto my brethren :
 In the midst of the congregation will I praise thee.
 Ye that fear the Lord, praise him ;
 All ye the seed of Jacob, glorify him ; and stand in awe of
 him, all ye the seed of Israel.

For he hath not despised nor abhorred the affliction of the afflicted ;

Neither hath he hid his face from him ; but when he cried unto him, he heard.

A seed shall serve him ;

It shall be told of the Lord unto the next generation. They shall come and shall declare his righteousness unto a people that shall be born, that he hath done it.

PSALM XXIII.

The Lord is my shepherd ; I shall not want.

He maketh me to lie down in green pastures : he leadeth me beside the still waters.

He restoreth my soul :

He guideth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil ; for thou art with me :

Thy rod and thy staff, they comfort me.

Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies :

Thou hast anointed my head with oil ; my cup runneth over.
Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life :

And I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

PSALM XXIV.

The earth is the Lord's, and the fulness thereof ;

The world, and they that dwell therein.

For he hath founded it upon the seas,

And established it upon the floods.

Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord ?

And who shall stand in his holy place ?

He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart ;

Who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity.

And hath not sworn deceitfully.

He shall receive a blessing from the Lord,

And righteousness from the God of his salvation.

This is the generation of them that seek after him,

That seek thy face, O God of Jacob.

Lift up your heads, O ye gates ;

And be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors :

And the King of glory shall come in.

Who is the King of glory ?

The Lord strong and mighty,

The Lord mighty in battle.

Lift up your heads, O ye gates ;

Yea, lift them up, ye everlasting doors :

And the King of glory shall come in.

Who is this King of glory ?

The Lord of hosts,

He is the King of glory.

PSALM XXV.

Unto thee, O Lord, do I lift up my soul.

O my God, in thee have I trusted,

Let me be not ashamed ;

Let not mine enemies triumph over me.

Yea, none that wait on thee shall be ashamed :

They shall be ashamed that deal treacherously without cause.

Shew me thy ways, O Lord ;

Teach me thy paths.

Guide me in thy truth, and teach me ;

For thou art the God of my salvation ;

On thee do I wait all the day.

Remember, O Lord, thy tender mercies and thy lovingkindnesses :

For they have been ever of old.

Remember not the sins of my youth, nor my transgressions :

According to thy lovingkindness remember thou me,

For thy goodness' sake, O Lord.

Good and upright is the Lord :

Therefore will he instruct sinners in the way.

The meek will he guide in judgement :

And the meek will he teach his way.

All the paths of the Lord are lovingkindness and truth

Unto such as keep his covenant and his testimonies.

For thy name's sake, O Lord,

Pardon mine iniquity, for it is great.

What man is he that feareth the Lord ?

Him shall he instruct in the way that he shall choose.

His soul shall dwell at ease ;

And his seed shall inherit the land.

The secret of the Lord is with them that fear him ;

And he will shew them his covenant.

Mine eyes are ever toward the Lord ;

For he shall pluck my feet out of the net.

Turn thee unto me, and have mercy upon me ;

For I am desolate and afflicted.

The troubles of my heart are enlarged :

O bring thou me out of my distresses.

Consider mine affliction and my travail ;

And forgive all my sins.

Consider mine enemies, for they are many ;

And they hate me with cruel hatred.

O keep my soul, and deliver me :

Let me not be ashamed, for I put my trust in thee.

Let integrity and uprightness preserve me.

For I wait on thee.

Redeem Israel, O God,

Out of all his troubles.

PSALM XXVI.

Judge me, O Lord, for I have walked in mine integrity :

I have trusted also in the Lord without wavering.

Examine me, O Lord, and prove me ;

Try my reins and my heart.

For thy lovingkindness is before mine eyes ;

And I have walked in thy truth.

I have not sat with vain persons ;

Neither will I go in with dissemblers.

I hate the congregation of evil-doers,

And will not sit with the wicked.

I will wash mine hands in innocency ;

So will I compass thine altar, O Lord :

That I may make the voice of thanksgiving to be heard,

And tell of all thy wondrous works.

Lord, I love the habitation of thy house,

And the place where thy glory dwelleth.

Gather not my soul with sinners,
 Nor my life with men of blood :
 In whose hands is mischief,
 And their right hand is full of bribes.
 But as for me, I will walk in mine integrity :
 Redeem me, and be merciful unto me.
 My foot standeth in an even place :
 In the congregations will I bless the Lord.

PSALM XXVII.

The Lord is my light and my salvation ; whom shall I fear ?
 **The Lord is the strength of my life ; of whom shall I be
 afraid ?**
 When evil-doers came upon me to eat up my flesh,
 Even mine adversaries and my foes, they stumbled and fell.
 Though an host should encamp against me,
 My heart shall not fear :
 Though war should rise against me,
 Even then will I be confident.
 One thing have I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after ;
 **That I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my
 life,**
 To behold the beauty of the Lord, and to inquire in his temple.
 For in the day of trouble he shall keep me secretly in his
 pavilion :
 In the covert of his tabernacle shall he hide me ;
 He shall lift me up upon a rock.
 And now shall mine head be lifted up above mine enemies
 round about me ;
 And I will offer in his tabernacle sacrifices of joy ;
 I will sing, yea, I will sing praises unto the Lord.
 Hear, O Lord, when I cry with my voice :
 Have mercy also upon me, and answer me.

When thou saidst, Seek ye my face ; my heart said unto thee,
Thy face, Lord, will I seek.

Hide not thy face from me ;

Put not thy servant away in anger :

Thou hast been my help ;

Cast me not off, neither forsake me, O God of my salvation.

For my father and my mother have forsaken me,

But the Lord will take me up.

Teach me thy way, O Lord ;

And lead me in a plain path,

Because of mine enemies.

Deliver me not over unto the will of mine adversaries :

**For false witnesses are risen up against me, and such as
breathe out cruelty.**

I had fainted, unless I had believed to see the goodness of
the Lord

In the land of the living.

Wait on the Lord :

Be strong, and let thine heart take courage ;

Yea, wait thou on the Lord.

PSALM XXVIII.

Unto thee, O Lord, will I call ;

My rock, be not thou deaf unto me :

Lest, if thou be silent unto me,

I become like them that go down into the pit.

Hear the voice of my supplications, when I cry unto thee,

When I lift up my hands toward thy holy oracle.

Blessed be the Lord,

Because he hath heard the voice of my supplications.

The Lord is my strength and my shield,

My heart hath trusted in him, and I am helped :

Therefore my heart greatly rejoiceth ;
 And with my song will I praise him.
The Lord is their strength,
And he is a strong hold of salvation to his anointed.
 Save thy people, and bless thine inheritance :
Feed them also, and bear them up forever.

PSALM XXIX.

Give unto the Lord, O ye sons of the mighty,
Give unto the Lord glory and strength.
 Give unto the Lord the glory due unto his name ;
 Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.
The voice of the Lord is upon the waters :
 The God of glory thundereth,
 Even the Lord upon many waters.
The voice of the Lord is powerful ;
The voice of the Lord is full of majesty.
 The voice of the Lord breaketh the cedars ;
 Yea, the Lord breaketh in pieces the cedars of Lebanon.
He maketh them also to skip like a calf ;
Lebanon and Sirion like a young wild-ox.
 The voice of the Lord cleaveth the flames of fire.
 The voice of the Lord shaketh the wilderness ;
The Lord shaketh the wilderness of Kadesh.
 The voice of the Lord maketh the hinds to calve,
 And strippeth the forests bare :
And in his temple every thing saith, Glory.
 The Lord sat *as king* at the Flood ;
 Yea, the Lord sitteth as king for ever.
The Lord will give strength unto his people ;
The Lord will bless his people with peace.

PSALM XXX.

I will extol thee, O Lord ; for thou hast raised me up,
And hast not made my foes to rejoice over me.

O Lord my God,

I cried unto thee, and thou hast healed me.

O Lord, thou hast brought up my soul from Sheol :

And give thanks to his holy name.

For his anger is but for a moment ;

In his favor is life :

Weeping may tarry for the night,

But joy cometh in the morning.

As for me, I said in my prosperity,

I shall never be moved.

**Thou, Lord, of thy favour hadst made my mountain to stand
strong :**

Thou didst hide thy face ; I was troubled.

I cried to thee, O Lord ;

And unto the Lord I made supplication :

What profit is there in my blood, when I go down to the pit ?

Shall the dust praise thee ? shall it declare thy truth ?

Hear, O Lord, and have mercy upon me :

Lord, be thou my helper.

Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing ;

Thou hast loosed my sackcloth, and girded me with gladness :

To the end that my glory may sing praise to thee, and not
be silent.

O Lord my God, I will give thanks unto thee for ever.

PSALM XXXI.

In thee, O Lord, do I put my trust ; let me never be ashamed :
Deliver me in thy righteousness.

Bow down thine ear unto me ; deliver me speedily :

Be thou to me a strong rock, an house of defence to save me.

For thou art my rock and my fortress ;

Therefore for thy name's sake lead me and guide me.

Pluck me out of the net that they have laid privily for me ;

For thou art my strong hold.

Into thine hand I commend my spirit :

Thou hast redeemed me, O Lord, thou God of truth.

I hate them that regard lying vanities :

But I trust in the Lord.

I will be glad and rejoice in thy mercy :

For thou hast seen my affliction ;

Thou hast known my soul in adversities.

And thou hast not shut me up into the hand of the enemy ;

Thou hast set my feet in a large place.

Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am in distress :

Mine eye wasteth away with grief, yea, my soul and my body.

For my life is spent with sorrow, and my years with sighing :

But I trusted in thee, O Lord :

I said, Thou art my God.

My times are in thy hand :

Make thy face to shine upon thy servant :

Save me in thy lovingkindness.

Let me be not ashamed, O Lord ; for I have called upon thee :

Oh how great is thy goodness, which thou hast laid up for
 them that fear thee,

**Which thou hast wrought for them that put their trust in
 thee, before the sons of men !**

In the covert of thy presence shalt thou hide them from the
 plottings of man :

**Thou shalt keep them secretly in a pavilion from the strife
of tongues.**

Blessed be the Lord :

**For he hath shewed me his marvellous lovingkindness in a
strong city.**

As for me, I said in my haste, I am cut off from before thine
eyes :

**Nevertheless thou heardest the voice of my supplications
when I cried unto thee.**

O love the Lord, all ye his saints :

**The Lord preserveth the faithful,
And plentifully rewardeth the proud doer.**

**BE STRONG, AND LET YOUR HEART TAKE COURAGE,
ALL YE THAT HOPE IN THE LORD.**

PSALM XXXII.

Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is
covered.

**Blessed is the man unto whom the Lord imputeth not iniquity,
And in whose spirit there is no guile.**

When I kept silence, my bones waxed old

Through my roaring all the day long.

For day and night thy hand was heavy upon me :

My moisture was changed as with the drought of summer.

I acknowledged my sin unto thee, and mine iniquity have I
not hid :

I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord ;

And thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin.

For this let every one that is godly pray unto thee in a time
when thou mayest be found :

**Surely when the great waters overflow they shall not reach
unto him.**

Thou art my hiding place; thou wilt preserve me from trouble;

Thou wilt compass me about with songs of deliverance.

I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go:

I will counsel thee with mine eye upon thee.

Be ye not as the horse, or as the mule, which have no understanding:

**Whose trappings must be bit and bridle to hold them in,
Else they will not come near unto thee.**

Many sorrows shall be to the wicked:

But he that trusteth in the Lord, mercy shall compass him about.

Be glad in the Lord, and rejoice, ye righteous:

And shout for joy, all ye that are upright in heart.

PSALM XXXIII.

Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous:

Praise is comely for the upright.

Give thanks unto the Lord with harp:

Sing praises unto him with the psaltery of ten strings.

Sing unto him a new song;

Play skilfully with a loud noise.

For the word of the Lord is right;

And all his work is done in faithfulness.

He loveth righteousness and judgement:

The earth is full of the lovingkindness of the Lord.

By the word of the Lord were the heavens made;

And all the host of them by the breath of his mouth.

He gathereth the waters of the sea together as an heap:

He layeth up the deeps in storehouses.

Let all the earth fear the Lord:

Let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of him.

For he spake, and it was done ;

He commanded, and it stood fast.

The Lord bringeth the counsel of the nations to nought :

He maketh the thoughts of the peoples to be of none effect.

The counsel of the Lord standeth fast for ever,

The thoughts of his heart to all generations.

Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord ;

The people whom he hath chosen for his own inheritance.

The Lord looketh from heaven ;

He beholdeth all the sons of men ;

From the place of his habitation he looketh forth

Upon all the inhabitants of the earth ;

He that fashioneth the hearts of them all,

That considereth all their works.

There is no king saved by the multitude of an host.

A mighty man is not delivered by great strength.

An horse is a vain thing for safety :

Neither shall he deliver any by his great power.

Behold, the eye of the Lord is upon them that fear him.

Upon them that hope in his mercy ;

To deliver their soul from death,

And to keep them alive in famine.

Our soul hath waited for the Lord :

He is our help and our shield.

For our heart shall rejoice in him,

Because we have trusted in his holy name.

Let thy mercy, O Lord, be upon us,

According as we have hoped in thee.

PSALM XXXIV.

I will bless the Lord at all times :

His praise shall continually be in my mouth.

My soul shall make her boast in the Lord :

The meek shall hear thereof, and be glad.

O magnify the Lord with me,

And let us exalt his name together.

I sought the Lord, and he answered me,

And delivered me from all my fears.

They looked unto him, and were lightened :

And their faces shall never be confounded.

This poor man cried, and the Lord heard him,

And saved him out of all his troubles.

The angel of the Lord encampeth round about them that fear him,

And delivereth them.

O taste and see that the Lord is good :

Blessed is the man that trusteth in him.

O fear the Lord, ye his saints :

For there is no want to them that fear him.

The young lions do lack, and suffer hunger :

But they that seek the Lord shall not want any good thing.

Come, ye children, and hearken unto me :

I will teach you the fear of the Lord.

What man is he that desireth life,

And loveth many days, that he may see good ?

Keep thy tongue from evil,

And thy lips from speaking guile.

Depart from evil, and do good ;

Seek peace, and pursue it.

The eyes of the Lord are toward the righteous,

And his ears are open unto their cry.

The face of the Lord is against them that do evil,

To cut off the remembrance of them from the earth.

The righteous cried, and the Lord heard,
And delivered them out of all their troubles.

**The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart,
And saveth such as be of a contrite spirit.**

Many are the afflictions of the righteous :
But the Lord delivereth him out of them all.

**He keepeth all his bones :
Not one of them is broken.**

Evil shall slay the wicked :
And they that hate the righteous shall be condemned.

**The Lord redeemeth the soul of his servants :
And none of them that trust in him shall be condemned.**

PSALM XXXVI.

The transgression of the wicked saith within my heart,
There is no fear of God before his eyes.

**For he flattereth himself in his own eyes,
That his iniquity shall not be found out and be hated.**

The words of his mouth are iniquity and deceit :

He hath left off to be wise and to do good.

He deviseth iniquity upon his bed ;

He setteth himself in a way that is not good ;

He abhorreth not evil.

Thy lovingkindness, O Lord, is in the heavens ;

Thy faithfulness reacheth unto the skies.

Thy righteousness is like the mountains of God ;

Thy judgements are a great deep :

O Lord, thou preservest man and beast.

How precious is thy lovingkindness, O God !

**And the children of men take refuge under the shadow of thy
wings.**

They shall be abundantly satisfied with the fatness of thy house ;

And thou shalt make them drink of the river of thy pleasures.

For with thee is the fountain of life :

In thy light shall we see light.

O continue thy lovingkindness unto them that know thee ;

And thy righteousness to the upright in heart.

Let not the foot of pride come against me,

And let not the hand of the wicked drive me away.

There are the workers of iniquity fallen :

They are thrust down, and shall not be able to rise.

PSALM XXXVII.

Fret not thyself because of evil-doers,

Neither be thou envious against them that work unrighteousness.

For they shall soon be cut down like the grass,

And wither as the green herb.

Trust in the Lord, and do good ;

Dwell in the land, and follow after faithfulness.

Delight thyself also in the Lord ;

And he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.

Commit thy way unto the Lord ;

Trust also in him, and he shall bring it to pass.

And he shall make thy righteousness to go forth as the light,

And thy judgement as the noonday.

Rest in the Lord, and wait patiently for him :

Fret not thyself because of him who prospereth in his way,

Because of the man who bringeth wicked devices to pass.

Cease from anger, and forsake wrath :

Fret not thyself, it tendeth only to evil-doing.

For evil-doers shall be cut off:

But those that wait upon the Lord, they shall inherit the land.

For yet a little while, and the wicked shall not be :

Yea, thou shalt diligently consider his place, and he shall not be.

But the meek shall inherit the land ;

And shall delight themselves in the abundance of peace.

The wicked plotteth against the just,

And gnasheth upon him with his teeth.

The Lord shall laugh at him :

For he seeth that his day is coming.

The wicked have drawn out the sword, and have bent their
bows ;

To cast down the poor and needy,

To slay such as be upright in the way :

Their sword shall enter into their own heart,

And their bows shall be broken.

Better is a little that the righteous hath

Than the abundance of many wicked.

For the arms of the wicked shall be broken :

But the Lord upholdeth the righteous.

The Lord knoweth the days of the perfect :

And their inheritance shall be for ever.

They shall not be ashamed in the time of evil :

And in the days of famine they shall be satisfied.

But the wicked shall perish,

And the enemies of the Lord shall be as the excellency of
the pastures :

They shall consume ; in smoke shall they consume away.

The wicked borroweth, and payeth not again :

But the righteous dealeth graciously, and giveth.

For such as be blessed of him shall inherit the land ;

And they that be cursed of him shall be cut off.

A man's goings are established of the Lord ;

And he delighteth in his way.

Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down:
For the Lord upholdeth him with his hand.
I have been young, and now am old;
Yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken,
Nor his seed begging their bread.
All the long day he dealeth graciously, and lendeth;
And his seed is blessed.
Depart from evil, and do good;
And dwell for evermore.
For the Lord loveth judgement,
And forsaketh not his saints;
They are preserved for ever:
But the seed of the wicked shall be cut off.
The righteous shall inherit the land,
And dwell therein for ever.
The mouth of the righteous talketh of wisdom,
And his tongue speaketh judgement.
The law of his God is in his heart;
None of his steps shall slide.
The wicked watcheth the righteous,
And seeketh to slay him.
The Lord will not leave him in his hand,
Nor condemn him when he is judged.
Wait on the Lord, and keep his way,
And he shall exalt thee to inherit the land:
When the wicked are cut off, thou shalt see it.
I have seen the wicked in great power,
And spreading himself like a green tree in its native soil.
But one passed by, and lo, he was not:
Yea, I sought him, but he could not be found.
Mark the perfect man, and behold the upright:
For the latter end of that man is peace.

 I am consumed by the blow of thine hand.

And his enemies shall lick the dust.

The kings of Tarshish and of the isles shall bring presents :

The kings of Sheba and Seba shall offer gifts.

For he shall deliver the needy when he crieth ;

And the poor, that hath no helper.

He shall have pity on the poor and needy,

And the souls of the needy he shall save.

He shall redeem their soul from oppression and violence ;
And precious shall their blood be in his sight :
 And they shall live ; and to him shall be given of the gold
 of Sheba :
And men shall pray for him continually ;
They shall bless him all the day long.
 There shall be abundance of corn in the earth upon the top
 of the mountains ;
The fruit thereof shall shake like Lebanon :
 And they of the city shall flourish like grass of the earth.
His name shall endure for ever ;
His name shall be continued as long as the sun :
 And men shall be blessed in him ;
All nations shall call him happy.
 Blessed be the Lord God, the God of Israel,
 Who only doeth wondrous things :
And blessed be his glorious name for ever ;
And let the whole earth be filled with his glory.
 AMEN, AND AMEN.

PSALM LXXIII.

Surely God is good to Israel,
 Even to such as are pure in heart.
But as for me, my feet were almost gone ;
My steps had well nigh slipped.
 For I was envious at the arrogant,
 When I saw the prosperity of the wicked.
For there are no bands in their death :
But their strength is firm.
 They are not in trouble as other men ;
 Neither are they plagued like other men.
Therefore pride is as a chain about their neck ;
Violence covereth them as a garment.

Their eyes stand out with fatness :

They have more than heart could wish.

They scoff, and in wickedness utter oppression :

They speak loftily.

They have set their mouth in the heavens,

And their tongue walketh through the earth.

Therefore his people return hither :

And waters of a full cup are wrung out by them.

And they say, How doth God know ?

And is there knowledge in the Most High ?

Behold, these are the wicked ;

And, being alway at ease, they increase in riches.

Surely in vain have I cleansed my heart,

And washed my hands in innocency ;

For all the day long have I been plagued,

And chastened every morning.

If I had said, I will speak thus ;

Behold, I had dealt treacherously with the generation of thy children.

When I thought how I might know this,

It was too painful for me ;

Until I went into the sanctuary of God,

And considered their latter end.

Surely thou settest them in slippery places :

Thou castest them down to destruction.

How are they become a desolation in a moment !

They are utterly consumed with terrors.

As a dream when one awaketh ;

So, O Lord, when thou awakest, thou shalt despise their image.

For my heart was grieved,

And I was pricked in my reins :

So brutish was I, and ignorant ;

I was as a beast before thee.

Nevertheless I am continually with thee :

Thou hast holden my right hand.

Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel,

And afterward receive me to glory.

Whom have I in heaven but thee ?

And there is none upon earth that I desire beside thee.

My flesh and my heart faileth :

But God is the strength of my heart and my portion for ever.

For, lo, they that are far from thee shall perish :

Thou hast destroyed all them that go a whoring from thee.

But it is good for me to draw near unto God :

I have made the Lord God my refuge,

That I may tell of all thy works.

PSALM LXXVII.

I will cry unto God with my voice ;

Even unto God with my voice, and he will give ear unto me.

In the day of my trouble I sought the Lord :

My hand was stretched out in the night, and slacked not ;

My soul refused to be comforted.

I remember God, and am disquieted :

Thou holdest mine eyes watching :

I am so troubled that I cannot speak.

I have considered the days of old,

The years of ancient times.

I call to remembrance my song in the night :

I commune with mine own heart ;

And my spirit made diligent search.

Will the Lord cast off for ever ?

And will he be favourable no more ?

Is his mercy clean gone for ever ?

Doth his promise fail for evermore ?

Hath God forgotten to be gracious ?

Hath he in anger shut up his tender mercies ?

And I said, This is my infirmity ;

But I will remember the years of the right hand of the Most High.

I will make mention of the deeds of the Lord ;

For I will remember thy wonders of old.

I will meditate also upon all thy work,

And muse on thy doings.

Thy way, O God, is in the sanctuary :

Who is a great god like unto God ?

Thou art the God that doest wonders :

Thou hast made known thy strength among the peoples.

Thou hast with thine arm redeemed thy people,

The sons of Jacob and Joseph.

The waters saw thee, O God ;

The waters saw thee, they were afraid :

The depths also trembled.

The clouds poured out water ;

The skies sent out a sound :

Thine arrows also went abroad.

The voice of thy thunder was in the whirlwind ;

The lightnings lightened the world :

The earth trembled and shook.

Thy way was in the sea,

And thy paths in the great waters,

And thy footsteps were not known.

Thou leddest thy people like a flock,

By the hand of Moses and Aaron.

PSALM LXXX.

Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel,
 Thou that leadest Joseph like a flock ;
Thou that sittest upon the cherubim, shine forth.
 Before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh, stir up thy
 might,
 And come to save us.
Turn us again, O God ;
And cause thy face to shine, and we shall be saved.
 O Lord God of hosts,
 How long wilt thou be angry against the prayer of thy
 people ?
Thou hast fed them with the bread of tears,
And given them tears to drink in large measure.
 Thou makest us a strife unto our neighbours :
 And our enemies laugh among themselves.
Turn us again, O God of hosts ;
And cause thy face to shine, and we shall be saved.
 Thou broughtest a vine out of Egypt :
 Thou didst drive out the nations, and plantedst it.
Thou preparedst room before it,
And it took deep root, and filled the land.
 The mountains were covered with the shadow of it,
 And the boughs thereof were like cedars of God.
She sent out her branches unto the sea,
And her shoots unto the River.
 Why hast thou broken down her fences,
 So that all they which pass by the way do pluck her ?
The boar out of the wood doth ravage it,

Take up the psalm, and bring hither the timbrel,

The pleasant harp with the psaltery.

I proved thee at the waters of Meribah.

Hear, O my people, and I will testify unto thee :

O Israel, if thou wouldest hearken unto me !

There shall no strange god be in thee ;

Neither shalt thou worship any strange god.

I am the Lord thy God,
Which brought thee up out of the land of Egypt:
Open thy mouth wide, and I will fill it.

**But my people hearkened not to my voice;
And Israel would none of me.**

So I let them go after the stubbornness of their heart,
That they might walk in their own counsels.

**Oh that my people would hearken unto me,

**Yea, the sparrow hath found her an house,

My King, and my God.

**Blessed are they that dwell in thy house:
They will be still praising thee.**

Blessed is the man whose strength is in thee;

In whose heart are the high ways to Zion.

Passing through the valley of Weeping they make it a place
of springs;

Yea, the early rain covereth it with blessings.
 They go from strength to strength,
Every one of them appeareth before God in Zion.
 O Lord God of hosts, hear my prayer :
Give ear, O God of Jacob.
 Behold, O God our shield,
 And look upon the face of thine anointed.
For a day in thy courts is better than a thousand.
 I had rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God,
 Than to dwell in the tents of wickedness.
For the Lord God is a sun and a shield :
 The Lord will give grace and glory :
No good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly.
 O LORD OF HOSTS,
BLESSED IS THE MAN THAT TRUSTETH IN THEE.

PSALM LXXXV.

Lord, thou hast been favorable unto thy land :
Thou hast brought back the captivity of Jacob.
 Thou hast forgiven the iniquity of thy people,
 Thou hast covered all their sin.
Thou hast taken away all thy wrath :
 Thou hast turned thyself from the fierceness of thine anger.
Turn us, O God of our salvation,
And cause thine indignation toward us to cease.
 Wilt thou be angry with us for ever ?
Wilt thou draw out thine anger to all generations ?
 Wilt thou not quicken us again :
That thy people may rejoice in thee ?
 Shew us thy mercy, O Lord,
And grant us thy salvation.

I will hear what God the Lord will speak :

For he will speak peace unto his people, and to his saints :

But let them not turn again to folly.

Surely his salvation is nigh them that fear him ;

That glory may dwell in our land.

Mercy and truth are met together ;

And hearken unto the voice of my supplications.

In the day of my trouble I will call upon thee ;

For thou wilt answer me.

There is none like unto thee among the gods, O Lord ;

Neither are there any works like unto thy works.

All nations whom thou hast made shall come and worship

before thee, O Lord ;

And they shall glorify thy name.

For thou art great, and doest wondrous things :

Thou art God alone.

Teach me thy way, O Lord ; I will walk in thy truth :

Unite my heart to fear thy name.

I will praise thee, O Lord my God, with my whole heart ;

And I will glorify thy name for evermore.

For great is thy mercy toward me ;

And thou hast delivered my soul from the lowest pit.

O God, the proud are risen up against me,

And the congregation of violent men have sought after my
soul,

And have not set thee before them.

**But thou, O Lord, art a God full of compassion and gracious,
Slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy and truth.**

O turn unto me, and have mercy upon me ,

Give thy strength unto thy servant,

And save the son of thine handmaid.

Shew me a token for good ;

That they which hate me may see it, and be ashamed,

Because thou, Lord, hast holpen me, and comforted me.

**Mine ears have heard my desire of the evil-doers that rise up

The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree :

He shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon.

They that are planted in the house of the Lord

Shall flourish in the courts of our God.

They shall still bring forth fruit in old age ;

They shall be full of sap and green :

To shew that the Lord is upright ;

He is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him.

 The hills melted like wax at the presence of the Lord,
 At the presence of the Lord of the whole earth.
 The heavens declare his righteousness,
 And all the peoples have seen his glory.
 Ashamed be all they that serve graven images,
 That boast themselves of idols :
 Worship him, all ye gods.
 Zion heard and was glad,
 And the daughters of Judah rejoiced ;
 Because of thy judgements, O Lord.
 For thou, Lord, art most high above all the earth :
 Thou art exalted far above all gods.
 O ye that love the Lord, hate evil :

THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS THE CHRIST.

But now hath Christ been raised from the dead, the first fruits of them that are asleep.

For since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead.

For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.

We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump:

For the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality.

But when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory.

O death, where is thy victory? O death, where is thy sting?

The sting of death is sin; and the power of sin is the law:

But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

But having the same spirit of faith, according to that which is written, I believed, and therefore did I speak; we also believe, and therefore also we speak;

Knowing that he which raised up the Lord Jesus shall raise up us also with Jesus, and shall present us with you.

Wherefore we faint not ; but though our outward man is decaying, yet our inward man is renewed day by day.

For our light affliction, which is for the moment, worketh for us more and more exceedingly an eternal weight of glory ;

While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen :

For the things which are seen are temporal ; but the things which are not seen are eternal.

For we know that if the earthly house of this tabernacle be dissolved, we have a building from God,

A house not made with hands, eternal, in the heavens.

For verily in this we groan, longing to be clothed upon with our habitation which is from heaven :

If so be that being clothed we shall not be found naked.

For indeed we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened ;

Not for that we would be unclothed, but that we would be clothed upon, that what is mortal may be swallowed up of life.

Now he that hath wrought us for this very thing is God,

Who gave unto us the earnest of the Spirit.

Being therefore always of good courage, and knowing that, whilst we are at home in the body, we are absent from the Lord ; we are of good courage, I say,

And are willing rather to be absent from the body, and to be at home with the Lord.

Who shall lay anything to the charge of God's elect ?

It is God that justifieth ;

Who is he that shall condemn ?

It is Christ Jesus that died, yea rather, that was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us.

Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or anguish, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.

For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to his great mercy begat us again unto a living hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

Unto an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you, who by the power of God are guarded through faith unto a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us, unto him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus unto all generations for ever and ever.

Now our Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God our Father which loved us and gave us eternal comfort and good hope through grace, comfort your hearts and stablish them in every good work and word.

Worthy is the Lamb that hath been slain to receive the power, and riches, and wisdom, and might, and honour, and glory, and blessing.

Unto him that sitteth on the throne, and unto the Lamb, be the blessing, and the honour, and the glory, and the dominion, for ever and ever.

- And it shall be said in that day, Lo, this is our God ; we have waited for him, and he will save us ;
This is the Lord ; we have waited for him, we will be glad and rejoice in his salvation.
- We have a strong city ; salvation will he appoint for walls and bulwarks.
Open ye the gates, that the righteous nation which keepeth truth may enter in.
- Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee : because he trusteth in thee.
Trust ye in the Lord for ever : for in the Lord Jehovah is an everlasting rock.
- Lord, thou wilt ordain peace for us : for thou hast also wrought all our works for us.
O Lord our God, other lords beside thee have had dominion over us ; but by thee only will we make mention of thy name.
- How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace,
That bringeth good tidings of good, that publisheth salvation ;

That saith unto Zion, Thy God reigneth !

The voice of thy watchmen ! they lift up the voice, together do they sing ;

For they shall see, eye to eye, when the Lord returneth to Zion.

Break forth into joy, sing together, ye waste places of Jerusalem :

For the Lord hath comforted his people, he hath redeemed Jerusalem.

The Lord hath made bare his holy arm in the eyes of all the nations ;

And all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Sing, O barren, thou that didst not bear ; break forth into singing, and cry aloud,

For more are the children of the desolate than the children of the married wife, saith the Lord.

Enlarge the place of thy tent, and let them stretch forth the curtains of thy habitations ;

Spare not ; lengthen thy cords, and strengthen thy stakes.

For thou shalt spread abroad on the right hand and the left ; and thy seed shall possess the nations.

Fear not ; for thou shalt not be ashamed : neither be thou confounded ; for thou shalt not be put to shame :

For thou shalt forget the shame of thy youth, and the reproach of thy widowhood shalt thou remember no more.

For thy Maker is thine husband ; the Lord of hosts is his name :

And the Holy One of Israel is thy redeemer ; the God of the whole earth shall he be called.

For a small moment have I forsaken thee ; but with great mercies will I gather thee.

In overflowing wrath I hid my face from thee for a moment ; but with everlasting kindness will I have mercy on thee, saith the Lord thy redeemer.

And all thy children shall be taught of the Lord ;

And great shall be the peace of thy children.

Awake, awake, put on strength, O arm of the Lord ;

Awake, as in the days of old, the generations of ancient times.

Art thou not it which dried up the sea, the waters of the great deep ;

That made the depths of the sea a way for the redeemed to pass over?

And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come with singing unto Zion ;

And everlasting joy shall be upon their heads: they shall obtain gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

lie down together :

And the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain :

**For the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as
the waters cover the sea.**

And it shall come to pass in that day, that the root of Jesse,
which standeth for an ensign of the peoples, unto him
shall the nations seek ;

And his resting place shall be glorious.

And in that day thou shalt say, I will give thanks unto thee,
O Lord.

**Behold, God is my salvation ; I will trust, and will not be
afraid :**

For the Lord Jehovah is my strength and my song ;

And he is become my salvation.

Therefore with joy shall ye draw water out of the wells of
salvation.

**Give thanks unto the Lord, call upon his name, declare his
doings among the peoples, make mention that his name is
exalted.**

Sing unto the Lord ; for he hath done excellent things :

Let this be known in all the earth.

Cry aloud and shout, thou inhabitant of Zion :

For great is the Holy One of Israel in the midst of thee.

The Lord is my portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in him.

For the Lord will not cast off for ever.

For though he cause grief, yet will he have compassion according to the multitude of his mercies.

For he doth not afflict willingly, nor grieve the children of men.

Wherefore doth a living man complain, a man for the punishment of his sins?

Let us search and try our ways, and turn again to the Lord.

Let us lift up our heart with our hands unto God in the heavens.

I called upon thy name, O Lord, out of the lowest dungeon.

Thou heardest my voice; hide not thine ear at my breathing, at my cry!

Thou, O Lord, abidest for ever;

Thy throne is from generation to generation.

Wherefore dost thou forget us for ever, and forsake us so long time?

Turn thou us unto thee, O Lord, and we shall be turned; renew our days as of old.

Though the fig tree shall not blossom,

Neither shall fruit be in the vines;

The labour of the olive shall fail,

And the fields shall yield no meat;

The flocks shall be cut off from the fold,

And there shall be no herd in the stalls:

Yet I will rejoice in the Lord,

I will joy in the God of my salvation.

Jehovah, the Lord, is my strength,

And he maketh my feet like hind's feet, and will make me to walk upon my high places.

Wherefore do ye spend money for that which is not bread ?

And your labour for that which satisfieth not ?

Hearken diligently unto me, and eat ye that which is good, and let your soul delight itself in fatness.

Incline your ear, and come unto me ; hear, and your soul shall live.

Seek ye the Lord while he may be found,

Call ye upon him while he is near :

Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts : and let him return unto the Lord, and he will have mercy upon him ;

And to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

For my thoughts are not your thoughts,

Neither are your ways my ways, saith the Lord.

And my thoughts than your thoughts.
