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Background of the Giftedness in Adults Rating Scale

Our research on giftedness in adults began at the University of Denver in 1980, where we initiated the Dabrowski Study Group. This led to the formation of our nonprofit, Institute for the Study of Advanced Development (ISAD) in 1985. Since 1989, ISAD has published the only journal on adult giftedness: *Advanced Development*. The journal showcases Dabrowski's theory of positive disintegration and promotes gifted women. In 2011, we organized the first symposium on gifted adults. In 2012, we organized an International Congress on Dabrowski's theory. And, on June 2nd, 2018, we are hosting the first symposium on Gifted Women.

Our *Giftedness in Adults Rating Scale* (Silverman, 2005) was posted on Gifted Development Center's website in 2005. It is a self-rating instrument composed of 38 items on a Likert scale from 1 (not at all) to 5 (very true). The reliability and predictive validity of the scale have been demonstrated in two independent published studies. Perrone, Perrone, Ksiazak, Wright, & Jackson (2007) found high internal validity (Cronbach's alpha .88). Law & Haron (2016) studied 263 Malaysian adults, all of whom had attained bachelor's degrees. They found that scores on the *Giftedness in Adults Rating Scale* predicted creativity on the *Creative Personality Scale* and postformal thinking (higher ethical judgment) on the *Postformal Thought Scale*.
