CALL TO ORDER: Commissioner Kathy Schwartz called the Public Board of Health meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

1. Commissioner Schwarz initiated introductions for all attendees and welcomed two new Board members to the NCPHD Board of Health, Julie Whetzel public member for Wasco County and Shawn Payne public member for Sherman County.

1. Approval of past meeting minutes.
 - 1 A motion was made and carried to approve the meeting minutes from 11/9/2021 as presented.

2. Approval of A/P Check reports.

NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. COVID-19 Update
 1. Dr. Miriam McDonell updated the board on the current COVID-19 status.
 2. Sherman County Cases: November – 26 cases; December - 4 cases.
 3. Gilliam County Cases: November - 22 cases; December – 5 cases.
 4. Wasco County Cases: November – 197 cases; December – cases.
 5. Hospitalizations have remained lower in recent weeks.
 6. Vaccinations: For 18 years and up. Includes state and federal data. (At least one dose)
 - a) Wasco – 79.6%
 - b) Sherman – 67.9%
 - c) Gilliam – 52.4%
 - d) Boosters are recommended for all 18 years and up.
 - e) Pfizer has gotten approval for boosters for 16 and 17 year olds.
 7. What's New:
 - a) Schools:
 - Test To Stay: If exposure occurs in a school setting, children may continue to attend school if no symptoms occur and they have 2 negative tests.
 - b) Variants: Omicron
 - Three cases have been identified in Oregon.
 - More unknown than is known at this point in time.
 - c) Therapies:
 - Molnupiravir: Oral anti-viral medication. Is said to reduce hospitalization by approximately 30%.
 8. NCPHD Vaccine Response:
 - a) Mass clinics continue to be routinely held at the Readiness Center
 - Boosters and all vaccines are available.
 - Clinics run once per week on Thursdays. Clinics will be added if the demand for vaccine remains high.
 - There will be no mass clinics held during the last two weeks of December in order to give NCPHD staff a much needed break.
 - Clinics will run on Thursdays again starting in January. Days and times will be adjusted based on need.
 - Work and planning continues for clinics, school assistance and educational outreach throughout all three counties, Sherman, Gilliam, and Wasco.
 - b) Pediatric vaccine and dispersal has been taking place.
 - Vaccinations and clinics for children 5 – 11 are being organized and carried out in all three counties.
 - Outreach and education work continues to help inform parents.

- All pharmacies, except Safeway, carry the pediatric vaccine and have appointments available.
 - MCMC family and pediatric clinics and One Community Health also provide pediatric vaccine for all 5-11 year olds.
- 9. Discussion, questions, and feedback were requested.
- 2. Fiscal Report FY 2020-2021
 1. Brita Meyer reviewed the NCPHD Fiscal Recap Report 7/1/20 to 6/30/21 with the board.
 2. Overall, NCPHD is where it should be based on the budgeting for this fiscal year.
 3. Brita also reviewed the most current COVID funding amounts.
 - ✚ 2022 and beyond COVID Funding Total: \$2,789,181
COVID Expenditures July – December 1, 2021.
 - a) YTD Personal Services expenses: \$377,659.
 - b) YTD Materials and supplies expenses: \$227,643.
 - c) Total expenditure: \$605,302.
 - d) Balance: \$2,183,879.
 4. Discussion, questions, and feedback were requested.
- 3. Tobacco Retail Licensing Presentation: Neita Cecil, TPEP Coordinator
 1. Neita updated the board on the new Oregon Tobacco Retail Licensing law which was passed in this year's legislative session.
 2. The new licensing law for tobacco retailers takes effect on January 1, 2022.
 3. The law requires every retailer who sells tobacco or vape products containing nicotine to get a state license and be inspected yearly.
 4. Discussion, questions, and feedback were requested.
- 4. Gilliam County update by Commissioner Pat Shannon
 1. Gilliam County Court will meet on Wednesday, December 15, 2021 to pass the final vote on the dissolution of the Gilliam, Sherman, and Wasco County Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) so they can move forward to create their own public health district.
 2. Gilliam County will then formally notify NCPHD, and the NCPHD Board of Health, of their intent to dissolve the IGA by December 31, 2021.
 3. Once the notification is received by NCPHD and the board, Gilliam County will have 180 days to ensure the transfer of public health services from NCPHD to Gilliam County effective as of July 1, 2022.
 4. Discussion, questions, and feedback were requested.
- 5. Contracts Summary
 1. **OHA AGREEMENT 172924.** The THEO Security and Privacy Agreement between the State of Oregon and North Central Public Health District (NCPHD) for managing Maternal and Child Health programs, home visiting programs, and access to THEO data tracking services which is a state-provided software used by the home visiting program.
 - a. *Fiscal Impact:* No fiscal Impact.
 2. **AGREEMENT** between Kathleen Boxx and North Central Public Health District. This agreement is a contract to provide WIC dietician and nutritional services.
 - a. *Fiscal Impact:* Not to exceed \$925.00 per month.

3. **AmeriCorps VISTA/Oregon Public Health Partnership Host Site AGREEMENT August 2021 cohort** between the Oregon Health Authority-Public Health Division and North Central Public Health District (NCPHD).

- a. *Fiscal Impact:* Cost to NCPHD of \$17,250 which was paid in August of 2021.

Re: NCPHD Proposal for Premium Compensation

January 11, 2022

In 2020 the Governor of Oregon declared a state of emergency due to the COVID Pandemic. As the local public health authority, NCPHD stepped in to facilitate the role out of the emergency protocols which included outreach, education, communication, testing, contact investigation, contact tracing and vaccinations. This has continued through today as the declaration is still in effect and the work at NCPHD continues.

During the past 22 months, staff at NCPHD have worked an unprecedented amount of hours providing not only the above mentioned services for the pandemic but also carrying on traditional public health services. Non-exempt staff and exempt staff have worked many 10 to 12 hour days, some 6 to 7 days a week for the past 22 months.

We are able to support non-exempt staff with flex and/or comp time for their hours, which in many cases we paid out their flex, comp and vacation time with CARES Act (The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act) funding due to not having the ability to provide actual time off. This funding from the CARES Act has been provided to LPHD's specifically to support staffing needs and compensation.

Leadership staff has not received compensation during this time for the additional hours worked. Many LPHD's around the state have provided Premium Pay to exempt staff to offset the unprecedented hours, above and beyond normal, and the level of intensity of the work during the pandemic. I am asking the NCPHD Board of Health to support a 7% Premium Pay for Leadership Staff to offset the number of additional hours served during the pandemic. The payment will be pro-rated based on the number of months employed and served on the Leadership Team during the pandemic. The funds will be covered with our COVID CARES Act funding. The total expenditure for the 22 months will be \$53,232 (7%).

I appreciate your support on this request.
