


Entrepreneurs drive almost all job growth.

Right to Start Acts are comprehensive pro-entrepreneur policies. The first-ever passed the Missouri House in 2021. Since then, many state legislatures have introduced their own Right to Start Acts.

But America is in a startup slump.

Since the 1970s, America's rate of entrepreneurship has fallen by nearly half. Data from the U.S. Census shows the downward trend in new business formation.

Our policy recommendations:

5% to Start

Dedicate a small percentage of current funding to new entrepreneurs & young businesses, and track the impact:

- 5% of Government Contracts
- 5% of Workforce Development
- 5% of Economic Development
- Office of Entrepreneurship
 Designate official liaison(s) for
 entrepreneurs and their issues
- Zero Barriers to Start
 Reduce or eliminate registration
 costs and fees for new businesses
- Reduce Licensing Issues
 Reduce or eliminate occupational
 licensing burdens and permits for
 businesses, including home-based
 ones
- Early Tax Hassles

 Reduce tax hassles by allowing businesses to defer state income tax deadlines and/or skip filing income taxes for a year if net income is below \$5,000
