

Priority Recruitment: How it Works

At the end of every round, Potential Members (PMs) will prioritize the sororities whose parties they have attended. At the same time, the sororities are submitting their selection of PMs to invite back. Each PM's preferences and sorority's selections are processed to generate invitations to the next round. Before the parties begin for the next round, PMs will receive their schedule for that day via email. A PM will not know which of the 12 sororities have invited her back until she receives her schedule.

For example, after the end of Ice Water videos, PMs will make their selections on the Companion Application on their mobile device. The PMs will have learned about all 12 sororities this round. The maximum amount of sororities a PM can virtually attend during Round 2 is 9. Therefore, a PM will "cluster rank" the 9 she would most "LIKE" to visit to as #1 and the remaining 3 in preferential order with numbers 2, 3, and 4. This does NOT guarantee that a PM will receive invitations to her top 9. This simply guides the National Panhellenic Conference Recruitment Specialist in guiding sororities on the number of Potential Members they may invite. The purpose of this is to create a culture of equality of invitations among sororities. This process will continue for rounds 2 and 3. PMs may only prioritize, they may not "delete" any sororities. A PM may only prioritize sororities that they have attended parties for that round and cluster up to the maximum number that they can visit the next round. The maximum amount for Round 2 is 9, for Round 3 is 6, and Round 4 is 2. In some cases, a PM may not have attended the maximum amount; therefore, she will only place the number of sororities she has visited.

What is a Recruitment Violation?

The Recruitment process is intended to give each PM an equal opportunity to become familiar with all the sororities within the LSU Panhellenic Council. In order to keep the process fair for all parties involved, recruitment guidelines have been established with the expectation that they will be followed. However, violations may occur that include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Receiving gifts such as t-shirts, sorority presents, etc. from a sorority member or alumnae
- Receiving invitations to events such as teas, dinners, etc. during the spring or summer (excluding events sponsored by the Panhellenic Council)
- > Having more than two actives speak with you in a room alone during recruitment week
- > Receiving a promise of a future bid from a sorority or its members
- Receiving contact such as phone calls, text messages, etc. from ANY active sorority member, alumnae, etc., regarding recruitment during silence (Aug. 10, 2020 Aug. 24, 2020)

If you experience any of the above violations or are feeling uncomfortable as a potential member, you are being treated unfairly by the sorority. This special treatment may seem as though the sorority is guaranteeing you membership into their chapter. However, the recruitment process holds no guarantee for anyone. Please see the next page on how to report a recruitment violation.

Recruitment Rule Violations: What to do?

If for any reason, you feel that you have witnessed or become part of a recruitment rule violation, it is highly encouraged and respected that you file the circumstance with Panhellenic. By doing so, you are helping Panhellenic and the Greek Community at LSU by promoting fair, ethical behavior. Recruitment violations unfortunately happen, and it's up to you to help prevent them! If for any reason you need to file a report, or simply discuss the situation with someone, here's what you do:

- Be a good detective. Do your best to gain specific details of the situation. Try to get names, exact wording, and setting.
- Don't spill the beans to everyone. Tell only someone that can help solve the problem or prevent further similar circumstances. Tell your Gamma Chi, the Panhellenic office, any Panhellenic Executive officer, or email lsuphcrecruitment@gmail.com (Emily Wood, VP of Recruitment).
- > Don't think that you'll be considered a tattle tale. Be confident that you did the right thing. You have helped prevent future unethical behavior.

If you don't feel comfortable filing a report, call the Recruitment Infraction Hotline: **225-578-7788**

*This hotline allows you to tell what happened or what you heard (even if you don't have all of the information directly!). You can choose to remain anonymous if you wish. Simply call and let the answering machine hear your story.

Rules for Active Sorority Members Concerning You, the Potential Member:

- 1. High school students may not be invited to sorority-sponsored events where alcohol is present (ex. grubs, formals, exchanges, crawfish boils, etc.). They may be invited to attend overall Greek events (ex. Songfest).
- **2.** Inappropriate contact with PMs shall be prohibited. Inappropriate contact shall be defined as but not limited to:
 - > Transportation to and from bars
 - > Providing and/or purchasing alcohol
 - > Contacting PMs by members who don't have a prior relationship with that PM
 - Specifically promoting your sorority or speaking negatively about other sororities at LSU
 - Organizing gatherings, events, and/or events for the purpose of chapter members to meet PMs
- **3.** No flowers or gifts may be sent to a PM from collegiate members, alumnae, collegiate members from other chapters, and mothers of collegiate members and new members.

- **4.** Only Panhellenic publications and/or invitations can be mailed to potential members. Individual sorority publications may not be sent to potential new members.
- 5. Silence will go into effect Saturday, August 10th until the distribution of bids. ALL SOCIAL CONTACT, TO INCLUDE TELEPHONE CALLS, EMAIL, LETTERS, FACEBOOK, TWEETS, SNAPS, & TEXT MESSAGING, between actives and PMs, actives and PMs' guardians, actives and boyfriends/friends, and/or actives and a PMs' siblings MUST CEASE THROUGH BID DISTRIBUTION except during recruitment functions scheduled by Panhellenic.

The use of social media by chapter members is **PROHIBITED** starting 7 days prior to recruitment through the completion of bid distribution. This includes both personal and chapter affiliated accounts and "use" includes but is not limited to: liking, posting, sharing, tweeting, etc. Social media includes but is not limited to: Facebook, Twitter, Snap chat, Instagram, etc. In addition, chapter affiliated accounts may not be used by anyone for any reason starting the day of silence, 7 days before recruitment, through the week of recruitment.

There shall never be more than **TWO** sorority women recruiting a potential member at any given time (hot boxing). Inappropriate language includes but is not limited to: "We hope to see you tomorrow!" and other references to potential participation in future rounds.

- **6.** No sorority may refer to any other sorority during any formal recruitment events to include questioning a potential member about her event schedule.
- 7. Sororities shall not detain potential members beyond the allotted time.
- 8. A bid is an oral or written invitation for membership. Bidding is prohibited during the formal recruitment process other than the preferential bidding scheduled by Panhellenic at the close of the formal recruitment process. NO PROMISE OR INVITATION FOR THE POTENTIAL NEW MEMBER TO RETURN TO THE CHAPTER IS MADE AT ANY EVENT. CHAPTERS FOUND IN VIOLATION OF THIS POLICY WILL RESULT IN SOCIAL SUSPENSION ON AND OFF CAMPUS FOR THE FALL SEMESTER.

Potential Member Rules & Procedures

- **1.** A PM must be a regularly matriculated (pursuing a degree), full-time student to be eligible to participate in recruitment. Visiting or provisionally accepted students cannot be pledged by any of the NPC sororities.
- **2.** A PM shall not be, or ever have been, an initiated member of a National Panhellenic Conference group. If in doubt, please contact Panhellenic.
- **3.** A PM shall not have been a new member to an NPC group, within one calendar year, at the same school where she is a Potential New Member.
- **4.** From August 8th, 2020 through the accepting of bids, no PM shall visit a sorority house except for events approved by the V.P. of Recruitment.
- **5.** All PM must attend virtual convocation, all meetings with Recruitment Counselors, all events, and the maximum number of invitational events throughout recruitment week. Failure to do so will result in the removal of the PM from further recruitment activities. In the event of illness, emergency, or University scheduled event such as band, orientation, cheerleading, Golden Girl, or athletic teams, the PM shall notify Panhellenic and/or her Recruitment

Counselor, who will notify the chapters involved. Conflicts must be submitted in writing to the Panhellenic Council via email, lsuphcrecruitmentreg@gmail.com or through her Gamma Chi.

- **6.** In order to participate in formal recruitment a student must plan to attend Louisiana State University, register with the LSU Panhellenic Council, and pay a registration fee of \$150.
- **7.** Formal recruitment shall begin at 7:00 p.m. Sunday, August 16, 2020 through 8:00 am, Monday August 24, 2020.
- 8. Refund Policy:
 - Refund Policy: Full refund of \$150, less a 5% processing fee charged by Greek Bill: If PM withdraws before August 7, 2020.
 - > **NO REFUND** for withdrawals after this date (unless authorized by the VP of Rec.)
 - Registration Refund of \$150: If PM has a death in family, severe illness, or any other extenuating circumstances reviewed by VP of Recruitment AT ANY TIME (ends on Saturday morning, August 15, 2020).
- **9.** PM's are expected to be on time for all meetings and events.

10. The Potential Member and sororities must honor all invitations to recruitment functions. In case of illness or other emergency, Panhellenic will notify the chapter with an official excused absence. Panhellenic Executive board shall establish procedures and protocols for PMs positively diagnosed with COVID-19 or any other highly contagious illness.

- **11.** After rounds 1-3, PMs must maximize their options by priority ranking all sororities after attending that round. Preference round is the only exception.
- 12. PM's must make their preferential selections immediately after the last event she attends. There shall be strict silence between PMs, and active sorority members, in observance from the time she leaves her last event until she receives her bid. PMs may consult a recruitment counselor at this time. Once the preferences are made, no changes may be made. By completing the MRABA:
 - **a.** PM is willing to accept an invitation to membership from any women's fraternity that PM lists on the agreement.
 - **b.** PM may limit choices to one or list the maximum amount of choices in which PM has attended a preference event and is willing to accept membership.
 - **c.** PM cannot change the order of her preferences or add or delete a preference once this agreement has been submitted to the College Panhellenic Association.
 - **d.** Once PM confirms this agreement, PM is bound by the National Panhellenic Conference calendar year rule. This rule states that if a PM receives an invitation to membership from any group PM has listed and PM chooses not to accept it, PM is ineligible to be pledged to any other inter/national fraternity on this campus for one calendar year.

- e. If PM does not receive an invitation to membership from a group that PM has listed, PM is eligible for continuous open recruitment among chapters that are eligible to participate.
- **13.** A PM must consult her Recruitment Counselor before withdrawing from recruitment. In the event that the PM feels she must withdraw, she should complete the withdrawal form or send an email to Panhellenic.
- 14. PMs may have no contact with actives beginning 7 days prior to formal recruitment until bid distribution at 5 p.m. (August 10, 2020 August 24, 2020).

Rules that your Gamma Chi must abide by:

- **1.** Gamma Chi's are not allowed to promote any sorority over the other. In addition, they are not allowed to announce their own sorority to any PM.
- **2.** Gamma Chi's are not allowed to facilitate or allow any games or debates by PMs about what sorority the PM believes them to be in. There shall be no "guessing games."
- **3.** Gamma Chi's must follow the Gamma Chi Code of Ethics and do the best job possible to aid PMs in experiencing a positive Recruitment process.

GPA Information

Upon admission to LSU, the Office of Enrollment Management evaluates your core grades and assigns you your GPA using LSU's standards. This GPA is the GPA our 12 sororities will be using. Grades are an important factor in sorority membership.
