## **CARCERAL CLOTHS**

Carceral Cloths are oil paintings on unstretched cotton duck that reimagine early, immigrant floor cloths as contemporary prison rugs. These rugs echo spatial limitations of prisons and emphasize the meaningfulness of institutional colors. They link poverty to incarceration and

suggest the ways in which incarceration follows us home. The front design uses symbolic images of incarceration, and the back of each rug contains a call for action. The following are the Carceral Cloths presented.



**Ban the Box** Carceral Cloth is 6' x 8,' the size of a standard incarceration cell. The border imagery suggests guard towers, handcuffs, razor wire, sexuality, and money. The squares represent cinder blocks. On the back of this floorcloth is a linocut printed, "Ban the Box."

**Procedural Default** Carceral Cloth measures 5' x 6' in a checkerboard of deprivation suggesting the size of the unencumbered space in a standard incarceration cell. The imagery aims to illustrate beauty separated from incarceration. On the back is screen printed one of my own redacted criminal documents containing the phrase, "procedural default," a legal doctrine that impedes miss-imprisoned people from attaining justice.

Make Some Noise Carceral Cloth is 72" x 36." This floor cloth is the size of the standard incarceration cell door. The border imagery suggests guard towers, handcuffs, razor wire, sexuality, and money. The squares represent cinder blocks. On the back is screen printed one of my own criminal pleadings redacted to read, "Make some noise," alluding to the voiceless locked behind the prison doors.

Peckerwood Hill Carceral Cloth is the standard size of a prison bed, 30" x 76," and is a depiction of the Captain Joe Byrd Cemetery, colloquially known as Peckerwood Hill, the main prison cemetery in Texas. On the back of this carceral cloth, painted grass green, I linoprinted, "Peckerwood Hill." Lichen-covered crosses mark all graves. The chiseled out markings on the crosses represent the death date, the prisoner's number and an "x" to show those executed. Nameless. Some sunken and gone. Over 180 unclaimed bodies.

The Prisoners Carceral Cloth, 37"x 69," represents wall space above the work table provided in some incarceration cells. The various uniforms are different colors that designate status. On the back is the Thirteenth Amendment. This rug is a companion to the Guards rug.

**The Guards** Carceral Cloth, 37"x 69," depicts guards in full combat gear ready for extraction. On the back is a portion of one of my filings in a death penalty case demonstrating pitiful representation by the appointed attorneys, a man I thought was innnocent.

#### P2P PORTRAITS BY GLYNN CARTLEDGE

The P2P oil paintings are of formerly incarcerated citizens painted as paper dolls on a stand in an iconographic stance. P2P is an exploration of the public perception of these citizens, tackling punishment commentary. They examine pejorative perceptions of felons while challenging the myths and stereotypes given those who have been released from incarceration. I aim to expand the conversation surrounding the residual and continuing punishment of the formerly incarcerated.

The recorded stories of Ramon, Bobby and Jerrod can be heard in the exhibition space.



P2P No. 40073, is of Ramon Garcia from south Texas where he was convicted of murder and sentenced to life with the possibility of parole. After serving twenty-five years, several of which were in solitary confinement next to Death Row, he came home to his wife and grown children. His story emphasizes the barbaric treatment of inmates. 36" x 26" x 4" oil on canvas \$5000



P2P No. 116590 is of Bobby Regado. Brutalized and barely surviving his time in prison, Bobby told me about the act of then Governor George Bush that saved lives, "The PREA. It was a shortened way to say, the Prison Rape Elimination Act. Before they passed that, you'd get beaten up and raped all the time. When the time came, the guards would know to turn their backs the other way — like, twenty-five of us in the shower and some dude would pick out the one he wanted. Helpless and cornered. I saw men jump from the upper tiers to avoid the horror."  $36" \times 26" \times 4"$  oil on canvas \$5000



P2P No. 99258 is a depiction of Peter Jackson, whom I met in Forsyth Park in Savannah, GA. When I first met Peter I was struck by his flat affect and his palpable despair. Peter was a young man, 6' 3" with a hefty constitution, who had recently arrived home from prison -- his first arrest -- and was struggling with employment and mental illness. 36" x 26" x 4" oil on canvas \$5000



P2P No. 87793, Nichole Foster, Nichole, full of vigor, came to my studio and said, "Paid for my crime. I was cast out of my house because of it and so that's who I am, I guess. I got out a week ago. Bus dropped me here. Lost all five of my children in the process but I'm going back home to Washington anyway. I'm going to start all over. No job worth going to. I might have to do something else to survive." 36" x 26" x 4" oil on canvas \$5000



P2P No. 26942, is a portrait of Jerrod Brown. Jerrod Brown is a rap artist and composer. Brown was formerly incarcerated in Georgia's most infamous maximum-security prison, Jackson State Prison. A deeply religious, gay, black man he has written and rapped about his incarceration and growing up in poverty in the deep south. Brown currently lives and works in Atlanta, Georgia. 36" x 26" x 4" oil on canvas \$5000



P2P No. 50018 is a portrait of George White from Savannah, GA

George: "I got locked up Jan 14, 2014 for a domestic violence situt situation involving my girlfriend of about a year. Jail time is nothing I would wish on my worst enemy. . . . . My exiperence during the first two-years was rough. I went threw a spell of depression. . . . I just prayed and coped by talking with my Grandmother like 3x's a week. I even eventually joined the chapling program. It was not easy at all. My grandmother would send me fifty dollars a week and I eventually picked up a lot of weight. Then like maybe 6 or seven months into my sentence time in jail the public defenders started coming with ple-deals. Offering me ten years I quickly declined. then about 2 years in my sentence they offered 5 year credit for time served and quickly accept."

P2P No. 540176, is portrait of Jennifer Pearse, who as a young woman, spent a total of seven years on drug charges and was incarcerated in Nevada prisons. I have known her for about twenty years. She rehabilitated herself with the help of God, family, and a supportive community. She is now fully employed, living a good life. Happy. 36" x 26" x 4" oil on canvas \$5000

#### **DEADPAN HEADSHOTS**

The oversized deadpan portraits are confrontational head shots. Post-incarceration obligatory duties to the system that imprisoned them overrides their personage. These portrayals of the formerly incarcerated signify entreaties to the system and the public for recognition and comprehension.

Two formerly incarcerated individuals agreed to have their image painted: Jennifer Pearce and Billy Copeland.



Jenni No. 1: Comply Oil on canvas 36" x 48" \$7000

Jenni lives in Nevada and was incarcerated for a total of seven years on drug charges. She was an MMA fighter and a former cowgirl. Open and frank about her history. Hug me, brother. God loves me; you know that, Mom.



Billy No. 1: Hush Oil on canvas 36" x 48" \$7000

Billy. A 6'4", blue-eyed, sinewy muscled man of forty-eight was a long term inmate in Texas. A long stint on the lam and finally caught in northern Florida. His son, Shawn, was one of his first prison guards. Childhood photos linger in an old photo album. Times were good down by the river, weren't they, Shawn?








