### **ABOUT LA VS HATE**

LA vs Hate is a community-centered program designed to support all residents of Los Angeles County. Led by the Human Relations Commission, LA vs Hate partners with community partners from all five County districts, representing a diverse coalition of voices committed to ending hate. By tracking and reporting hate we can ensure that resources are allocated appropriately, that those targeted by hate receive the support they need, that offenders are held accountable, and that together, we can build respectful and resilient communities.

In September, 2019, LA vs Hate started accepting reported hate acts through 211-LA, providing help from experienced, empathetic case managers, and a multi-disciplinary team of advocates, mental health professionals, mediators, and legal professionals. Through August 30, 2021, over 1,300 callers have reached out for help and nearly 1,000 have worked with these case managers to heal from the trauma of hate.
