








EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



- The Greater Nogales Santa Cruz County Port Authority, its board of directors, and its many stakeholder partners, have been advocating for the modernization of the DeConcini Port of Entry as it no longer meets the mission requirements for U.S. Customs and Border Protection and continues to be one of the most outdated and congested ports on the entire U.S.-Mexico border.
- After receiving a \$500,000 congressional appropriation, the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) has initiated the
 multi-year process for the modernization of the port, the first step being a Project Feasibility Study. That study will
 provide a conceptual design, possible modification to the port's footprint and and estimated cost.
- The Greater Nogales Santa Cruz County Port Authority has partnered with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to support the community outreach efforts as part of the Nogales Downtown Revitalization Study.
 - Special thanks to GSA for the critical role they played in securing the technical assistance from the EPA.
- The Downtown Revitalization Study is designed to help the community leverage the anticipated federal investment at the DeConcini Port of Entry by defining strategies to renew and improve downtown Nogales and significant sectors of the community. The study is an opportunity for the community to define a vision for the future. The vision can include future initiatives or projects that will help ensure sustainable growth and enhance quality-of-life for Nogales, AZ.
- As part of the community outreach effort, the Port Authority prepared and distributed an online public survey that was available for approximately 3 weeks.
- Survey gathered 456 responses.
- Survey questions were intended to understand the public's cross-border experience, their motivations for crossing the border, and their vision for the future of Nogales.



DeConcini Modernization

KEY FINDINGS: 456 RESPONSES!

- Broad cross-section of the Ambos Nogales community participated in the survey.
 - 92% of respondents are from Ambos Nogales/Santa Cruz County.
- Majority of respondents use DeConcini over Morley or Mariposa.
 - But 66% of respondents report that their crossing behavior has changed from previous years.
- Wait times at border continue to be the major deterrent for cross-border travelers.
- Personal vehicles was the dominant mode of cross-border travel among respondents.
 - 60% use personal vehicles while 38% cross by foot.
- Pedestrians favor crossing at DeConcini over Morley Gate.
 - 43% stay on foot after crossing while 29% rely on a family member or friend to pick them up.
 - Must consider multimodal drop-off and pick-up locations for pedestrians



KEY FINDINGS (CONT.)

- Electric mobility is nascent, in Nogales, allows for time in planning to deploy, and market a vehicle-charging network for residents, tourists, and visitors.
 - A key marketing tool for visitors to Nogales
- Wait times for northbound traffic continues to be a major concern.
 - Far more than southbound traffic
- Need to promote greater use of the SENTRI/Global Entry program.
 - Only 45% of respondents reported being SENTRI/Global Entry users.
- Border crossers generally have a neutral or negative experience about the DeConcini POE & Morley.
- Wait times, staffing, and the number of open lanes affect the perception of border crossing experience.




KEY FINDINGS (CONT.)

- A very positive perception of Nogales but many respondents from Mexico indicated that they do not know where Santa Cruz County is located.
 - Serves as a marketing opportunity in Nogales, Sonora of destinations throughout the county.
- Clear interest in more dining, shopping, and recreation options,
 - These three categories account for 50% of total responses.
- Respondents point to what is "lacking" in Nogales, including: opportunity, business incentives, vision
 - Offers the opportunity to educate on vision for the community and communicate on projects and accomplishments

- Desire to make Nogales a destination for shopping, tourism, jobs, and business.
- Morley Avenue is not a frequent destination, but there is strong interest by all in seeing it revitalized.
 - 59% visit only on "special occasions" (40%) or "never" (19%)
 - Respondents indicated that they would prefer to see a more "welcoming" scenery upon entering Nogales, AZ.
- Respondents confirm that due to long wait times they are open to paying a fee for access to expedited crossing lanes.
 - Offers an opportunity to promote SENTRI/GLOBAL ENTRY





INTRODUCTION



BACKGROUND


- In partnership with the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA), the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) awarded Technical Assistance Support to conduct a Downtown Revitalization Study as part of the broader federal process being carried out by GSA to modernize the DeConcini Port of Entry.
- The Downtown Revitalization Study is designed to help the community leverage the anticipated federal investment at the DeConcini Port of Entry by defining strategies to renew and improve downtown Nogales and significant sectors of the community. The study is an opportunity for the community to define a vision for the future. The vision can include future initiatives or projects that will help ensure sustainable growth and enhance quality-of-life for Nogales, AZ.
- The study process will also help inform GSA's strategy for the port modernization and identify federal and other resources to help fund the community implementation of its vision.
- Similar studies have been completed in San Luis and Douglas that have addressed downtown revitalization, multimodal transportation connectivity, and economic development.
- The EPA has hired Renaissance Planning to carry out the study and prepare the final report. The Greater Nogales Santa Cruz County Port Authority has partnered with the EPA and GSA to support the stakeholder outreach efforts throughout the study, which includes conducting public surveys.

- The Downtown Revitalization Study will be one of several opportunities for the community to share their thoughts, questions, and general feedback in what will be a multi-year process for the future of Nogales and the DeConcini Port of Entry.
- The U.S. General Services Administration is currently conducting a Feasibility Study for the modernization of the DeConcini Port of Entry that will determine any changes to the footprint of the port, provide a conceptual design for the modernized facility, and include an estimated project cost. The Feasibility Study is a federal-only process, and the final report will not be released to the public.

SURVEY METHODOLOGY // 456 TOTAL RESPONSES!

- Survey questions were intended to understand the public's cross-border experience, their motivations for crossing the border, and their vision for the future of Nogales.
- Questions were developed in consultation with the study team, and were made available in English and Spanish.
- Language of submissions: Approx. ¾ English, ¼ Spanish
- Survey available from July 11 to August 2, 2024
- Methods of distribution:
 - Port Authority's board members' networks
 - Port Authority e-blast via MailChimp (250+ subscribers)
 - Individualized email invitations
 - Social media channels (Website, X, LinkedIn)
 - Online pop-up ad (3 days) and e-blast (15,000 subscribers) via the Nogales International
 - Op-ed published in the Nogales International
- Total responses received: 456



- Survey data was collected using Microsoft Forms.
- Questions were multiple choice and open-ended text responses.
- To prepare the following report, data was cleansed, reorganized, and recategorized as appropriate to better demonstrate notable trends.
 - For example, new categories were created for several questions based on quantity of similar responses reported in "Other".
- "Word clouds" were auto-generated by Forms for open-ended text responses to highlight common keywords.







BROAD CROSS-SECTION OF AMBOS NOGALES COMMUNITY PARTICIPATED IN THE SURVEY







92% OF RESPONDENTS FROM AMBOS NOGALES/SANTA CRUZ COUNTY








PART II: USE OF DECONCINI PORT OF ENTRY









USE OF PERSONAL VEHICLES DOMINATES CROSSINGS




NB/SB CROSSING TIMES REFLECT DAILY EXPERIENCE








SUBJECTIVE ESTIMATES ON WAIT TIMES: NORTH-BOUND IS MUCH LONGER

- Must coordinate with deployment of access lanes from Mexican side.








Majority live in the U.S. and work in Mexico











NEXT STEPS

- Survey results to be shared with the Environmental Protection Agency to be integrated with the final report of the Downtown Revitalization Study.
- The Port Authority will be distributing the findings of the study via its website, social media channels, and work with *The Nogales International* to publish it in the local newspaper.
- The Port Authority will support the organizing of the Community Workshops that will be held in Nogales in late October.
 - Survey findings will help shape the discussions that will be moderated by the EPA's planning consultant.
- Other community outreach meetings may be scheduled as deemed appropriate, which may include presentations to industry and non-profit organizations in Ambos Nogales.
- Consideration may be given on creating follow-up surveys, particularly focused on amenities that should be offered in the community.
