

# **The New Mill Street Parking Lot is Open!**

FREE Parking and EV Charging Just a Short Walk from the Center of Ellicottville

If you've ever been in Ellicottville on a busy festival weekend, you know that finding a parking space can be a bit of a nightmare. (Here's looking at you Fall Fest.) Mayor John Burrell and the Village Board addressed this situation and put forth a solution. Following a year of planning and development, spearheaded by Village Board Trustee Doug Bush, the new parking lot on Mill Street is NOW open to the public.

Made possible through a joint grant with Cattaraugus County, the Mill Street Parking Lot is a result of many board meetings, lots of paperwork, and much dedication. Created in part to help ease the congestion experienced during busy weekends, the lot is designed with 125 parking spaces and 4 electric charging stations, and is just a 5-7 minute walk from the center of downtown.

The lights are on for night parking. A footpath is in process of development that will allow users to go from their vehicles directly to Martha Street, in front of where Good for the Spirit Gifts is located. So you'll be able to pop right

Village Hall Welcomes Erica Linderman to its Staff





Owners Bryan and Renee Scharf have always strived to bring great activities to their slice of Ellicottville, and like all great ideas, this one was created during a random late night conversation. Renee was bemused, "One night we were just sitting around considering world problems and the idea of a race down the creek somehow came up. Last year was the first year we did it and it turned out to be an event much bigger than we ever thought. It was so much fun and our turnout was HUGE, so we decided this was going to be a yearly event!"

Visitors are encouraged (but it's in no way mandatory) to wear their Derby best for the day - the hats of course, being the biggest draw, with their flamboyant regalia and over-the-top design to complement the more formal dress suits or cocktail dresses. (This year's trends according to kentuckyderby.com will see a lot of glacial blue, roses and more "preppy" styles.) But at Ellicottville Distillery, it's all about just having a good time, so you can come as you like. As for the Ducky Derby and how it works? Renee explained that they've been reserving spots for the races (of which there are as many as people want; last year there were seven) on their Facebook and on the day, all of the "horse ducks" are numbered and will be poured into the creek in the designated course area. There is a line at the end and whichever crosses the finish line first is the winner. The person who's duck takes the lead doesn't have to be present to win, so if you can't make it out and your duck clears the line, you're still a winner!

All that being said, I have an important announcement for the snowboarders of Western New York: refrain from cleanup! You have one more opportunity to shred!

Presented by Loud Performance, Loud Underground, and Daily City Train, the first annual Showdown Throwdown snowboard event is set for Saturday, April 27th. Using the last few mounds of snow from Holi-Mont, the Loud Underground/DCT parking lot at 2 Bristol Lane (next to Tim & Bonnie's Pizza) will be completely transformed for this jam-format snowboarding event! The \$35 registration fee will give you the chance to show off your skills and vie for some really cool prizes, including a new snowboard, skateboard, and cold hard cash! Tons of other prize packs will be awarded in a number of categories.



Registration will open the morning of the Throwdown from 10:00am-noon, with the event kicking off promptly at noon. Chris Perks, owner of Daily City Train is excited about the upcoming jam and how it'll hopefully amalgamate the winter season into a summer of skateboarding. "We're trying to create a scene here in Ellicottville, something that's been missing in this resort town for many years," he said.

An Ellicottville native and lifelong snowboarder and skater, Chris is deeply passionate about the freestyle scene and understands it on multiple fronts, as he heads up Holi-Mont's Parks department and recently designed and opened his own indoor skatepark, Daily City Train. "I love giving back in that aspect; freestyle terrain built by someone who uses it," commented Chris.



Chris, along with the event's co-host, owner of Loud Performance/Loud Underground, Dee Dippel, have been friends since the installation of HoliMont's Bike Park, which Chris and his Parks team have a strong hand in. Dee, being heavily involved in Ellicottville's local bike rental scene, was often around when Chris would work his magic on the bike trails. Following many conversations, the two decided to go in on some space together; two businesses that complement each other, housed under one roof. "We decided to split on the building here, and now we're hosting this sick rail jam together," said Chris.

Of course you can't forget the live entertainment. Local favorites Porcelain Train will be playing live from 3:00-6:00pm. Porcelain Train is an acoustic Americana duo performing original music from singer/songwriter Tamala Fonda on acoustic guitar and vocals, and her husband Ralph Fonda on percussion and vocals. They play a unique blend of rhythm and harmony combined with thoughtful lyrics. "Porcelain Train are super great people; we really enjoy having them!"



### UP NEXT AT ELLICOTTVILLE DISTILLERY

The Ellicottville Distillery's event season is just getting started. After the Ducky Derby you can look forward to their annual "Welcome to Summer" bonfire on May 25th starting at 12:00pm. This is one of the best ways to kick off the season, with a roaring fire and a party that will feature live music from long-time favorites Kody & Herren from 5:00-8:00pm. If you decide to come out for the Derby, they'll be ready to entertain you! As Renee stated, "We are just really looking forward to nicer weather and being able to get outside and do fun things! See you on May 4th!"

Sick indeed, and Dee over at Loud Performance is just as excited about what the Showdown Throwdown will bring to the community. "I've always been a two-wheel person," said Dee, an avid mountain biker. He says Loud Underground's later addition of snowboards to their in-

ventory supports a year-round season. "Our whole team here not only mountain bikes, but we're big into snowboarding as well, so it made sense to offer snowboards alongside fat bikes in the winter."

Getting a parking lot rail jam together at the end of April is certainly no easy feat, especially after the winter we had. All hands are on deck here, with HoliMont donating a feature along with real snow! "HoliMont actually saved us a little bit of snow, and we couldn't have done it without them," added Dee.

The folks over at DCT and Loud are certainly working hard to change up everything you think you know about Ellicottville, by blending the winter seamlessly into our summer with this one-of-a-kind event. Limestone Volunteer Fire Department member, Meronica Deitz, and her boyfriend, Collin Rounsville, fourth assistant department chief, are organizing this brand new event, which is a re-imagining of Limestone's Old Home Days. While the Covid-19 pandemic put an end to the Old Home Days tradition, Deitz is looking forward to this new event, which is taking place at the Limestone Community Center at 616 Main Street.

The event includes a rubber duck race down the creek across from the fire department, which is next door to the community center. Ducks are \$5 each (just 120 ducks per race); races will be held at noon, 1:00pm and 2:00pm, and the winner splits the prize money with the fire department in this 50/50 style raffle.

Last year, Deitz organized a craft show to benefit the fire department, and the event was so popular that she decided to incorporate it into New Home Day. "Last year, there were around 20 vendors, and now I'm close to 40 vendors with over 55 booths," she said. The craft show begins at 11:00am and includes booths located inside the Community Center and outdoors. Booth items include sublimated crafts, such as tumblers, handmade candles, local honey, freeze dried candy, baked goods, resale items, nail decals, and more. Everyone loves a spring event, especially when it involves food and music and shopping with various vendors (including a brewery) and a ginormous basket raffle, and did I mention acoustic music and sunshine and fun? All this for an entrance donation of \$1 per person!!!! Mark May 11th on your calendar and put the address 1420 Yubadam Road Portville, NY into your GPS. From Ellicottville it will take about 40-45 minutes.

Hint: If you are familiar with Sprague's Maple Farms, you are right smack in the neighborhood. While we are learning about new locales with odd names, check out Typna-

hda Mountain, which is where all this fun takes place in the heart of the Enchanted Mountains. Bonus for you if you have ever heard of it! Pfeiffer Nature Center's Trail Sale is one of the largest fundraisers for the Center, and once you see it, you will see why it's so important to have a hand (or a dollar) in keeping it open for all to enjoy. Incidentally, since a raffle is involved, and there will likely be small business vendors, you would do well to tuck a bunch of \$10s and \$20s in your pocket so you don't miss out on the fabulous raffle items. The Trail Sale will run from 10:00am-6:00pm.



### THE HISTORY OF PFEIFFER NATURE CENTER

The 188-acre Pfeiffer Nature Center was established in 1998 by Wendy Pfeiffer Lawrence to honor her father, Timothy N. Pfeiffer. It is located in the Portville community where her mother, Eleanor Knox Wheeler, was born and raised. Wendy wanted to keep alive the wonderful environment that created some of her fondest memories of growing up as a youngster on the property and made clear in her donation that the environment would be preserved, as is, for future generations.

In 2002, the Center's initial holdings were tripled by a generous gift of 460 acres from a friend of Wendy Pfeiffer Lawrence, Col. Charles Eshelman. Unlike Wendy's goals for the land, Col. Eshelman had a strong desire that an active management style be used, and that the property be returned to its farming roots if possible. Thus, they found a young family with a desire to caretake and to renovate and move into the original homestead and establish a small farm. There is also a woodlot that is managed, maple trees that are rented during sugaring season, meadows remain open, and they remain on alert to combat invasive species as they appear. In 2006 trails began being built on the east side of Yubadam Road. A year later, 31 trail markers were added made from 100-year-old staves out of a silo from the old farming operations in the past, thus incorporating their historical roots into even the ordinary. Trail maps following these trails can be picked up at the Pfeiffer Visitor Center.

"There is also a silent auction," said Deitz. "There will be raffle baskets – each booth is donating one. And we also have donations from surrounding businesses, like Zippo." Deitz is also working on organizing a cornhole tournament as part of New Home Day. Forms to register a team are available at the Limestone Firemen's Club, and registration is \$20 per team. The single-elimination tournament will begin at 12:30pm, with a prize awarded to the top team.

All the proceeds from the New Home Day events, including the cornhole tournament, the duck races, the chicken barbecue, and the craft vendor booth fees, support the Limestone Volunteer Fire Department. Rounsville explained, "The department raises money to maintain our equipment, which is all of the equipment on the trucks, all the gear, fuel for our small engines, property maintenance for the station itself, and maintenance for the Community Center, which the fire department owns." He added that fundraisers like New Home Day help pay for volunteer training and equipment, which are vital to the future of the department.

This, from their website: The forests, fields, streams, and ponds on this property are a combination of nature's handiwork and human influence. The original farmers needed the diversity of landscape for their livelihood, and the Nature Center continues to actively manage the property to retain its character for human and non-human visitors alike. With plenty of transitional zones (the edges of fields and forests, streams, and meadows), wildlife abounds. These edge areas are alive with bird populations spring through fall. Quiet visitors are likely to encounter deer, turkey, bears, raccoons, beavers, otters, muskrats, and a wealth of reptiles, amphibians, and insects.

Pfeiffer Nature Center is a tax-exempt, not-for-profit organization committed to building a foundation of knowledge, understanding and appreciation of the intrinsic values and aesthetic qualities of the natural world while instilling a sense of responsibility and stewardship for the natural world within the global community. The Center is run primarily by three paid individuals, a volunteer board of directors and a score of other volunteers. More than 4,000 individuals attend their programs and over 5,000 hike their trails on their own. For more information go to pfeiffernaturecenter.org.

Side note: While you are in the neighborhood, head back on Route 417 toward Weston's Mills and take a right turn up Promised Land Road in Portville for an optical illusion that makes you shake your head. Head up the road, go past the 1015 address maker. Turn around and put the car in neutral. If you do it right, the car will travel backward instead of forward, as if you are going up hill. Google it, then try it. Enjoy your Southern Tier adventures!

This motto can be found behind the front desk of the Eldred World War II Museum. ### TICK BLITZ: VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Community Asked to Collect Tick Specimens for Study

ELLICOTTVILLE - This spring, volunteers representing NYFOA, Allegheny Foothills Chapter (AFC) and Master Gardener Volunteers from CCE Cattaraugus/Chautauqua will team up to get the word out about the New York State Tick Blitz and to collect tick specimens from our region for identification and testing.

The NYS Tick Blitz is a community-engaged project that works with volunteer participants to help determine the presence and distribution of newly invasive tick species. The project is a partnership between Cornell University Department of Entomology, the Northeast Regional Center for Excellence in Vector-Borne Diseases (NEVBD) program and the NYS Integrated Pest Management Program. The goal of the NYS Tick Blitz is to understand the presence and range expansion of two invasive tick species that are not monitored through the NYS Department of Health's extensive monitoring program. These two tick species are the Asian Longhorned Tick (Haemophysalis longicornis) and the Lone Star Tick (Amblyomma americanum). 

Holistic Therapist Suzy Woo operates her healing and consulting practice from the office adjacent to the retail space. "I have a \$12,000 light and sound therapy bed, a redlight sauna, and PEMF (pulsed electro magnetic field) biomats that are all sitting in a closet unable to be utilized because I didn't have a space to set them up. The original plan was after one year, we would move into the full rear of the building with plenty of extra space, but that project fell further and further behind. It's been almost three years in our current setup. The retail side never got the foot traffic to sustain its overhead. A reallocation of the floor space in this manner allows us to provide the services that people are in dire need of such as ways to heal, ways to reduce stress, ways to relax and ground their energy. People will still be able to buy crystals and healing tools before or after a session and our full inventory will be online as well."

be offered, and participants will learn about tick habitat, tick bite prevention, and get hands-on experience in entomological research.

How does the Tick Blitz work? Volunteers will be trained to collect ticks properly and safely in their community. Ticks will be collected during the Tick Blitz and the specimens will be mailed to Cornell University where they will be identified by a team of entomologists and results will be made available through a public website and shared with volunteers.

Training will take place in-person and virtually in early June. CCE Cattaraugus is hosting in-person training on June 4th from 12:00-1:30pm in Ellicottville. You can register to participate before May 24th through the Tick Blitz registration: bit.ly/2024TickBlitz.
