The Village Board of Ellicottville reviewed a number of topics on their April agenda. A large focus was made for planning and sorting current budget needs, as well as discussing the current conditions of the Village Park's tennis courts and the decision to increase the cost to reserve the Village Park shelter.

Ellicottville's Town Board also covered a full agenda in April. Town Planner Greg Keyser has set a public hearing for the rezoning of North Park Innovations, which looks to expand and add 10,000 square feet to their current building. Town Trustees also reviewed minor updates to the Crosby Mini Mart application and Simmons Solar Farm project.

What does community actually mean? By definition, it is a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common. But that's a textbook answer, not a real life one.

Community is a part of who we are. It's where we grow up, who we grew up with, who our parents, and maybe us one day, will raise our families with, the place where our roots were planted. It should mean a great deal to all of us, which should encourage the people of our communities to keep it clean, beautiful, inclusive and safe for everyone. No one understands that more than the Tri-County Arts Council (TCAC) in Olean, NY.

Located at 110 W. State Street in Olean, NY, TCAC is a hub of artistic interaction, hosting classes and displaying local art for everyone to see. Then they had a great idea: Not everyone can come down to view the art, so why not bring it to the people and beautify some local landmarks at the same time? Thus the public mural project was born.

MURAL #1: THE HEART OF OLEAN



Two years ago, artist Meg Saligman worked on a project that encompassed all four sides of the Liberal Arts Center building at the SUNY JCC Cattaraugus County Campus. Her "The Heart of Olean" mural had about 10% of the Olean population working on it with her crew and herself, proudly creating a display based on an American poet but also an Olean native.

"Deep meaning comes for me when people gather together to create something purposeful and beautiful with their hands," Meg had said prior to her project launch. "Let's plan for the beautification of Olean while providing an opportunity for open-ended engagement. We invite all to participate and hope this project will be a pilot that will help bring more world class public art to my hometown, Olean, NY."

MURAL #2: COMMUNITY TIES

The following year, artist Alex Derwick brought his mural proposal to the Arts Council's attention and it was approved to be created last summer and featured on the wall of the William O. Smith Rec Center in War Vets Park titled, "Community Ties," which featured someone leaning down to help another tie their shoes. Again, members of the community came out to help make this project a realization during a community paint day. It was a beautiful success.

This year, Olean has been presented with a wonderful opportunity AGAIN by Olean native, Alex Derwick, who is planning to create a mural entitled, "Community Sports". The new mural is planned for the Sports Locker complex's west-facing wall this summer and will depict various local sports like baseball, basketball and soccer. Alex, born in Olean but now a resident of Baltimore, came out originally to help Meg on her mural project before submitting his own idea. He is greatly looking forward to this year's project. Currently, TCAC is looking for businesses and community partners to support their current mural project like for the Heart of Olean Mural and Community Ties in previous years. At the moment they are currently at 40% fully funded for the project starting in June! Like last year, they will be hosting an open Paint Day for the community on or near June 16th, depending on weather.





MEETING NOTES

ELLICOTTVILLE VILLAGE BOARD

Trustees Discuss Village Budget, New Street Lights, Tennis Court Repairs, and Price Increase for Park Pavilion Use

The Village Board of Ellicottville gathered on April 16th to discuss a number of topics on the evening's agenda. A large focus was made for planning and sorting current budget needs, as well as some updates throughout the Village, such as the official opening of the Mill Street parking lot, and the mayor's upcoming NYCOM conference.

Approaching May 15-17, 2024 is the annual NYCOM conference held in Bolton Landing, New York. NYCOM - or New York State Conference of Mayors and Municipal Officials - first started in 1910, with the aim to unite local government officials and network effective services throughout New York State. They advocate for the local government that is closest to their people to hold the interests intended. The annual conference serves as a source of practical information, ongoing training, workshops, and further education. They provide shared information on government operations, finance, economic development, ethics, open meetings, and more. Mayor John Burrell, with the approval of the Village Board, will be in attendance this year to experience the benefits that NYCOM continues to offer. The motion was passed without hesitation.

The Village budget is being processed and underway of any needed adjustments. Mayor Burrell and Village Clerk Amy Hayward have been working together to review and discuss the numbers. We can expect an update to be made during the May Village Board meeting.

The big news around the village is the finished Mill Street parking lot, which is now open to the public with lights on and electric charging stations in place. The Board was happy to hear the completed parking lot has been received well by the village and commends Doug Bush who spearheaded the project. To continue the upkeep in some aspects Jolie Newpher, Board member, and Amy Hayward, Village Clerk, will work with the necessary



service teams to better familiarize the technical side of the electric stations and get them ready to begin utilization. In discussions of the parking lot, a suggestion was made by Mark Chudy, DPW Supervisor, to look into the possibility of port-a-bathrooms for visitors to have access to. A decision was not immediately made as the Board will continue to offer insight on how to make the space most accessible to locals and travelers alike.

New street lights have been ordered for the Washington Street Light project and the contract is being reviewed to make sure it meets the standards of the Department of Transportation. Another addition around the village are the freshly poured sidewalks on the East end of Elizabeth Street. The DPW will continue to work on sidewalks as the weather permits.

A concern has been brought to the attention of Sean Lowes, head of the Parks and Recreation Department and Board member, on the current state of the Village tennis courts. Mr. Lowes shared the matter with the Board and discussions began on the possibility and cost of potential repairs or replacement. A follow-up is expected to be made with the group as it was determined by the DPW the cost could be amounted to \$50,000.

Continuing with the Parks system, a new change has been made and is effective immediately. The Village Park shelter reservations have been raised from the price of \$50 to \$150 only to non-village and non-town residents. The \$50 rate will still be available to those who pay taxes in the village or town. In discussion, it was pointed out that most of these reservations are made by people coming in from out of town and the price change will allow for funding to be applied where needed back into the Village.

Wrapping up the evening, Mayor John Burrell called the Village Board meeting to an end. The Board will gather again next month on the third Tuesday of May at the Village Hall.

North Park Innovations Files for Rezoning to Expand Current Building; Public Hearing Set for May 15th

Ellicottville's April Town Board meeting was called to order by Deputy Supervisor Steve Crowley in the absence of Supervisor Matthew McAndrew. With plenty to discuss, the Board got right into business.

Getting into the conversations of the night, the Short-Term Rental Committee has made an update on the upcoming local law. The process has provided a drafted local law that is currently being formatted for approval at the next Planning Board meeting. Once met by approval, the adoption process can begin. The Local Law on short-term rentals has been well thought over and is highly anticipated among officials and residents alike.

Some updates were made during the Head of Department Reports. First, we heard from



Don Auge of the Police Department who briefed Board members that the new office is now 80 percent complete as they await the final stages.

The Highway Department, headed by Scot Brumagin, reported the snow was cleared on the hilltops which has accumulated to around 8 inches. Now, however as we start to see the constant of spring weather, they will begin cold patching as needed. Also in the works you will see Town employees addressing previous storm damage as well as drainage work to begin on Holiday Valley Road.

Town Planner and Engineering reports were lead by Greg Keyser who has set a public hearing for the rezoning of North Park Innovations. The business plans to expand and add 10,000 square feet to their current building. The Planning Board had recommended the approval of the rezoning at their March 25th meeting. Going forward, a date has now been set for the public to address any comments or concerns on the matter, May 15th at 6:00pm. The purpose of the plan is to allow for North Park Innovations, located at 6442 Route 242E, to go from Medium Density Residential to General Commercial.

Continuing on with the Planning Board, some minor updates were made. Crosby Mini Mart has revised their application with an extending of the sidewalk. This is expected to be moved along to the Zoning Board for further handling. The Simmons Solar Farm has begun tree clearing at the site. And the deadline for all bids for front door and sign replacement at the Town hall was set for April 25th.

Mark Burr, Consulting Engineer, was present and brought the Town Board up to speed on the Cotter Road Culvert project. It seems that everything is on schedule and should be completed by this summer. Mark your calendars because the Gazebo Series was approved for the Ellicottville Chamber of Commerce who now have permission to use the Gazebo for this year's events. The Gazebo Series, which starts Friday, July 5th and then continues on Thursdays through early August, will provide entertainment from 7:00-9:00pm. You can expect to hear a collection of genres including pop, jazz, rock, folk, and more!

The Chamber of Commerce was also granted permission to use the Gazebo on September 15th for their annual Rock n' Roll Weekend, as well as October 12th and 13th for Fall Festival. To find out more about the Gazebo Series and other events coming up, check out the Ellicottville Chamber of Commerce's official website at www.ellicottvilleny.com.

The Town Board was then called to adjourn as the evening came to an end. Gathering on the third Wednesday of the month, the Town of Ellicottville Board will reconvene in May.
