



Speaking of flowers, why not have a gardening afternoon, planting some new posies in mom's garden, or if she has gone on to her adventure into eternity, place some bright fresh flowers at her gravesite, her final resting place if her ashes were scattered on land, or in your own yard in a sweet memorial garden.

Is mom a book lover? Introduce her to a book club, help her start one in her own community, or set her up online for a book-a-month. As for me, I'd love a commemorative brick at the Ellicottville Library or the Arboretum (or both).

A MYSTERY TRAPPED IN TIME

Enchanted Mountain Challenge Launches Third Season

For Shaun and Kristen Thomson, experiencing local history isn't just about admiring the architecture of an older building or noticing historic street markers. For them, history is an immersive experience and the core of a community's identity. This passion laid the groundwork for the first Enchanted Mountain Challenge, which was held in 2022. Now, the Thomsons are thrilled to share the third season of the Challenge, which runs from May 25th through October 14th. With elements of a scavenger hunt, an escape room, geocaching, and hiking, the Enchanted Mountain Challenge is designed to be a weekend-long adventure, although participants can begin on any day of the week and return to continue at any point until October 14th.

Each challenge takes participants on a journey - historically and geographically - through Ellicottville, Franklinville, and Olean to solve riddles and discover clues related to historical people and places in these communities. "Every challenge we create relates to our local history," Kristen Thomson explained. "It is really important for us to highlight the history of any area we work with. Was your house custom built two years ago? Awesome! But I can assure you that your very plot of land was something very different 100, 200, 300 or more years ago! Let's embrace the amazing history of our area. Let's see how our current existence interacts with and corresponds to our past."

This year's Challenge involves two mysteries and the history of two local artists, beginning with Franklinville's own Norman Maffei. "There are a lot of twists and turns this year," she said. "We work so hard to try to create something that is challenging, but also super fun and engaging. We create our clues with all kinds of brains in mind. You don't have to be a crossword puzzle fan to enjoy this Challenge. There is truly something for everyone, and the more minds, the better your chances are to solve the mystery!"

Whether you'd like to attempt the Challenge on your own or gather family or friends together, you can register online now at www.enchantedmountainchallenge.com. Upon registering, participants will receive information on how and where to get started. The Challenge can take a full weekend to complete; however, participants can begin on any day of the week and return to finish the Challenge if they're not able to spend more than a day working through the riddles and clues. "The Challenge this year, like those in the past, involves visiting different businesses as well as exploring our outdoors," Thomson noted. "Our hikes/outdoor clues are of easy to medium difficulty, but we always have plans



medium difficulty, but we always have plans in place to make it accessible to anyone who cannot or doesn't want to complete the more physical parts of the Challenge."

For those who may be new to the area, the Challenge is a fun opportunity to explore the region and discover local businesses and points of interest. Thomson said, "We constantly try to highlight new businesses in our towns, and the majority of our clue stops this year are brand new destinations! But we have an incredible amount of support from our past and current sponsors and work hard to incorporate them into each Challenge."

Everyone who successfully completes the Challenge by October 14th will be entered into the prize drawing, and their participation also supports the community. "This year, we will continue to provide a donation to our local historical society as well as offer a prize to our finishers, using a randomizer," explained Thomson. "This is not a race; it's about enjoying the experience and embracing the storyline. That's why all finishers are entered into the final contest from which our winners are chosen. But this year we are adding another benefit by providing a scholarship to a senior at Ten Broeck Academy/ Franklinville Central School District who has a passion for the arts."

Thomson is pleased to share that the Challenge grows each year. During its inaugural year, the Challenge had 40 groups of one to four people each; in the second year, they had 400 groups participate! Kristen and Shaun are already hard at work planning next year's Challenge and have half of next year's clues finished! "Our favorite part about developing the Challenge is when our minds align and our creativity flows," she reflected. "It is such an incredible feeling! I wish I could explain the euphoria when we agree upon

Breakaway Classic Adventures: Classic Canoeing Revisited

Nostalgia is being swept away in a tsunami of modern technology - cars that are smarter than we are, phones that really are smarter than we are, and now AI giving us advise on virtually everything. Put life on cruise control and take a break. Pick up a paddle, jump into a canoe and head out on the open water to clear that head of yours!

Don't try to overthink it; just close your eyes and imagine what life could be like... slow in pace, quiet and peaceful, the only possible distraction is the soft lapping of the waves in your mind. A classic cedar strip canvas canoe is just the ticket to get you lost in tranquility. Wood, canvas and water are all organic in nature and belong together, melting into each other smoothly and quietly. Fiberglass, plastic and aluminum are foreign and unnatural and serve a different purpose and a different frame of mind. While wood is warm and absorbs noise, those other materials are cold and annoyingly amplify sounds, not conducive to solitude and relaxation!

A map, compass and canoe pack are your only companions on your escape, but somewhere you'll have to learn how to make the most of them, and of course basic paddling skills and wilderness know how. I learned mine when I was a pre-teen and my teacher and mentor was an officer with the Ministry of Natural Resources stationed out of a community called Bobcaygeon, Ontario. Bobcaygeon... now there is a fascinating name for a town, made famous by the Tragically Hip song of the same name in 1999. Bobcaygeon has always stuck in mind whenever I think of canoeing. The word stems from an Ojibway term meaning shallow currents or currented rocky narrows, both common encounters during a paddle either down a mystic river or across a lake with no name.

One of the first things my game warden friend taught me was how to sit in a canoe, not on the seat but resting your butt against it with your legs folded beneath you. The idea is to keep your center of gravity low, giving you and your canoe stability when rocked by waves or a sudden shift of cargo or passengers. Along with proper seating position is seat location. If you are a solo canoeist, then you locate yourself more midship, actually leaning against a thwart or the back of the bow seat. The reason behind this is to keep the canoe level in the water to improve wind resistance and maneuverability.

Going solo is the quintessential canoeing experience and requires additional skill, technique and practice. A tippy canoe and a solo canoeist go hand-in-hand and the less knowing would think the canoe is about to go over. In reality, the closer the gunnel is to the water the longer and more efficient your paddle stroke will be.

Keeping the canoe going in a straight line is all in the stroke of your paddle and not in the switching of your paddle from side to side. An experienced canoeist is able to keep on course by just paddling on one side or the other, switching only every so often to give arm and wrist muscles a brake. The magic paddle technique is called a J stroke, which is course correcting. At the end of every sweep of the paddle, the blade is turned and pushed out away from the canoe. This slight push away is the only course correction needed to keeping on the path of a straight line.

The understanding of these solo canoeing basics applies also to canoeing tandem with both a bow and stern paddler. The paddler in the stern is the driver and controls the direction and path of the canoe, while the bow paddler's job is to give additional power with simple straightline strokes always on the opposite side of the driver. The stern paddler acts like a coxswain, keeping a steady rhythmic beat between both paddlers.

A much-overlooked tip is in selecting the best paddle design and treatment. The paddle is your only method of propulsion and has to be one with you. The right height is probably its most important attribute. Too short and it's not efficient, too long and it's awkward. Generally speaking, your paddle should reach your chin, nose or forehead depending upon the length of your arms and comfort when holding it. The paddle shaft should be void of any varnish or wax that will cause blisters as your hands slide and twist upon it.

Earlier I mentioned something about a map and compass as your only companions and you

probably scratched your head since you're still in a high-tech mindset. "Getting away from it all" includes going to places where there is limited cell coverage and definitely no electricity to recharge dead phones or GPS devices, thus the necessity for a map and compass. Reading a map seems like second nature and common sense to some, but nowadays in everyday life they are hard to find. Once upon a time a map was to lead us to treasure, but now they are the treasure, only if you can get your hands upon a good one.

The maps that you'll need are obviously road maps, topographic maps, if your routes include portages, and hydrographic maps which, in a sense, are road maps on waterways. Knowing meters vs. yards, fathoms vs. feet and whether you will be climbing or descending are things you'll need to learn in order to study a map properly and get safely to your destination. A compass goes hand-in-hand with map reading and, if maps are hard to find, a good needle bearing compass even more so. Taking a compass bearing is a must! Even looking at a map, you still need to know where you are. A compass will orientate your map in the correct position so you can actually head in the right direction... oh so confusing!

The sun, the moon and even the clouds are a wealth of information and I am running out of space to detail how they can be in one instance your friend and in a blink of an eye your foe. The best guidance I can give you is just to take notes and record the changes that you observe and remember it for the next time. As an example, we were once paddling on a beautiful sunny day expecting the rest of the journey to be the same. Unbeknownst to us, those pretty little clouds in the sky forewarned of nasty weather ahead and sure enough our next day's journey was through driving wind and rain. Those pretty little wispy clouds were called Mare's Tails...remember them well!

Finally, a quick note about your pack(s). All your essentials need to be stowed away in a water-proof pack that is easy to carry yet does not roll around in the bottom of your canoe. Modern day dry sacks are good, and even greater to travel with if they have shoulder straps, but in true voyageur tradition, I will always choose a wax treated canvas backpack... makes for a soft and comfortable head rest at night as. Happy paddling!

He has since further developed his bird series, and his appreciation for all wildlife. After an artist residency and subsequent solo exhibition at Roger Tory Peterson Institute in 2023, Grice continued to expand upon his use of multiple media including oil, acrylic, watercolor, charcoal, and digital illustration. His current series of works explores the connections that we make with nature that help to heal and give us hope in a time when both are needed more than ever.

"Birds are like living, breathing works of art; their colors and patterns dance through the skies and treetops, making our world a more beautiful place to live. They symbolize hope, showing us that we have the strength to overcome adversity. They remind us to be fierce, elegant, communal, and kind, to be unapologetically ourselves," Joseph said. "My bird portraits not only speak to the beauty of the creatures that we share our planet with, but also remind us of the traits within ourselves that make us uniquely human."
