





Keelin will be attending Gannon University as a Pre-Medicine major.



Get a Little Dirty, Have a Lot of Fun

You know it's officially summer in Ellicottville when Holiday Valley invites everyone to get a little dirty at the annual Mudslide race, coming up on June 15th. That's right, I said they're inviting everyone to get muddy! It's a yearly tradition around these parts. ellicottvilleNOW recently connected with Holiday Valley's Marketing Director, Dash Hegeman, who give us the dirt on this year's event.

eNOW: The Mudslide is a staple event to kick off summer. Can you give us some background on it and how it originated?

DASH: Mudslide has become an event that many people look forward to participating in year after year. I believe this is year 12 of the event and aside from it just being a great way to get people together to have a lot of fun outside, one of the reasons that Mudslide came about was because there were a number of pretty intense mud run events and Holiday Valley wanted to offer people who were looking to challenge themselves but weren't looking to navigate things like barbed wire or electric shocks. Mudslide offers two different courses, a 4.2-mile short course and a 5.4-mile long course for people who are looking to challenge themselves a bit more. The features are a lot of fun but definitely offer a degree of difficulty that adds to the excitement. And everyone gets to finish the race by sliding down a hill into a large pit of mud. It's a blast!

eNOW: What's happening this year that people can get excited about?

DASH: The courses have been redesigned a little and we've added some new features into the mix. So for people who have done the run before, it'll be a new experience but the same great vibes that they know and love.

eNOW: What's your favorite part?

DASH: It's a great combination of fun, exercise, and being in the great outdoors. You can make it as competitive as you want to or just go out as a team and enjoy having a bunch of laughs together while cheering your family and friends on. The entire event is entertaining, but my favorite part has to be what the event is named for. Watching people come down the mudslide at the end and the look on their faces after they emerge from the large pit of mud is priceless.



eNOW: Can you hook us up on the food and beverage that will be available?

DASH: Yes, there will be food and drinks. The Holiday Valley Food & Beverage team will be serving up pulled pork sandwiches, hot dogs, veggie burgers, and a few different drink options. 42 North Brewing Co. and Ellicottville Brewing Co. will both be on-site and doing beer tastings for the 21+ crowd.

eNOW: How do people register?

DASH: The 2024 Mudslide will take place on Saturday, June 15th. Registration opens at 8:30am. The Long Course race (\$70) begins at 10:00am and the Short Course race (\$65) begins at 11:15am. The Kids Mudslide race (\$20) begins at 1:30PM. Prices go up after May 31st. All the details on this year's Mudslide including registration can be found at holiday-valley.com/mudslide.

eNOW: What's upcoming after the Mudslide?

DASH: There's so much to do at Holiday Valley every summer. Fans of golf have access to one of the most unique courses in the area with the Double Black Diamond Golf Course. For people seeking some outdoor excitement, Sky High Aerial Adventure Park is the best. It's the largest aerial adventure park in New York State; every route in the 5-acre park is a blast and some of the more difficult courses can be a legitimate workout for even the best of athletes. The Public Pools are now open and are the perfect way to stay cool on some of our hot summer days. The Ellicottville Chamber's Summer Music Festival takes place over the July 4th holiday weekend and features another fun lineup. Plus, if you haven't been here for it before, there is always a really popular fireworks display. It's definitely a crowd pleaser.

eNOW: Anything else you would like to share with the community?

DASH: As much fun as Ellicottville is in the winter, it's just as captivating in the summer. There's no shortage of things to do, great places to eat or grab a cold, refreshing beverage, and the village has fantastic shops that are run by amazing people so it makes stopping in to browse a really enjoyable experience. 

This sounds like a pretty epic time. Should you maybe leave the kids behind? Renee stated, "While there aren't specific activities tailored for younger attendees, the venue is located within a local park, complete with traditional park amenities as well as a disc golf course. Mayor John Burrell welcomed members of the Ellicottville Village Board to the May meeting, held May 21st. Business quickly entered the floor with good news for all. Recently announced by USA Today, the Village of Ellicottville was named one of the top 10 Main Streets in the United States.

As quoted in the article, "Washington Street is the picturesque main street in the charming village of Ellicottville in western New York. Known for its historic architecture, the street is lined with boutique shops, restaurants, and the popular Ellicottville Brewing Company, and it also serves as the focal point for festivals. The street's quaint atmosphere and proximity to Holiday Valley Ski Resort make it a central hub for both locals and visitors." The chatter the article has brought to the area is one to be celebrated and was recognized by Village Board members and officials alike.

The news of Ellicottville's Main Street success was also highlighted at the NYCOM Conference (New York Conference of Mayors). This year's focus revolved around community and how to support and maintain local business. Mayor John Burrell was present at the conference and many congratulations were made to the way the Village operates.

A grant opportunity is in the works as New York State has approved project needs within Ellicottville's wastewater treatment. The Water Infrastructure Improvement Grant is an opportunity to update any needed water system structures. Now that New York State has deemed the project within the intent of the grant, the Village will be able to submit their final proposal by June 14th.

The mayor had an updated report on the bond process which was accepted by the Village Board. This funding will cover the expenses of the newly opened Mill Street parking lot, Washington street lamps, and comprehensive Elizabeth Street Project. All necessary dates and documentation have been submitted and finalized.

Representatives of National Grid will be coming to the Village of Ellicottville on May 31st to highlight the implementation of the newly opened Mill Street Parking Lot. A full day of media coverage will highlight the Village's use of electric chargers at the parking lot. They hope to expand and promote chargers in rural areas for electric vehicles and have chosen Ellicottville as a model to this.

There are multiple summer events that are in the making and have gone through for approval by the Village Board. The annual Jazz & Blues Festival, Taste of Ellicottville, Rock N' Roll Weekend, and Fall Festival have been approved and planning will continue for these events. The Ellicottville Farmers Market was also approved for their 7-week series and will begin in early July.

With plenty to look forward to, the Board and village continue to work on all means to assure a fun and successful summer season.

Public Hearing for North Park Zoning Amendment Draws Concern from Local Resident; Lawncare Bids Awarded

The Ellicottville Town Board's May meeting was called to order by Supervisor Matt McAndrew. The evening's agenda was filled with updates concerning the area, including old and new business.

The first business to be addressed at the meeting was the public hearing for the zoning map amendment, which was requested by North Park Innovations, located at 6442 Route 242 E. This action would address the 10.9-acre parcel and would change the property from High Density Residential District to General Commercial.

North Park Innovations is a locally based company that specializes in high-tech training equipment and curriculum for HVAC/R and electrical trades. With their headquarters based in Ellicottville, NY they provide their services to clients around the world. The Ellicottville base is home to all manufacturing, shipping, customer service, design, financial, technical, and administrative services involved. Several employees of North Park Innovations were present for the public hearing to show their support for the company and its expansion. Many of the employees commented to the Town Board that North Park is not only a great place to work but that it also provides jobs for local residents.

During the public hearing, one resident voiced that while he does not have any objection to the expansion, he is worried that a large-scale rezoning of the parcel may lead to future consequences for development. He continued by asking the Town Board if they would look into alternatives beyond rezoning the entirety of the property. Moving on in the decision making, the zoning map amendment will be referred to the County and on May 30th a review will take place.

The Town Board continued discussions by addressing an update by the Short-term Rental Committee. Progress is being made with the drafting of a local law, which will regulate the short-term rental process. Greg Keyser, Town Planner, has been working on the drafted law and is hopeful that it will be ready to be presented to the Town Board at the next meeting. A goal has been set that aims for completion by January 2025. During this timeline, Board Members and residents alike will have the opportunity for public comments and hearings.

The Town had multiple bid requests placed recently for ongoing projects throughout Ellicottville. Starting off with the accepted bids, the Town agreed to the bid from West Side Handyman and Lawncare for lawn maintenance for the Nannen Arboretum for the Spring

to Fall seasons.

Another accepted bid is that of D&J's Lawn Service which includes the lawn maintenance for the Jefferson Street, Niles and Bryant Hill Cemeteries. This care will also take place for the Spring to Fall seasons.

The Town is still open for bids on the Town Hall Front Door Project and have extended the proposals until June 5, 2024. Experienced applicants can find further information on requesting a bid at the official Town website under Notices at www.ellicottvillegov.com.

Keeping up with the maintenance of the Town, Western New York Lawn Service will be hired to repair 8 headstones at the Jefferson Street Cemetery, along with 2 headstones at the Bryant Hill Cemetery. The Town of Ellicottville wanted to move forward with the process and fortunately Western New York Lawn Service made themselves immediately available to tend to the restorations.

The Town Board was happy to agree to the permanent appointment of a new employee. They welcome Rich Rinko, who will now act as the Civil Service Building Inspector.

In new business of the Town, the Ellicottville Championship Rodeo sent in their yearly plan for the upcoming Rodeo, which they have scheduled for July 4th-7th. Within this request they have included a noise permit to extend to 1:00am each night. Organizers have also requested the Town Board's support in their request for a temporary beer and wine permit to use for the intended weekend. This decision will ultimately be made by the State Liquor Authority but with the Town of Ellicottville's support it could make all the difference for the event.

In wrapping up another point of new business, a joint effort between the Town and Village of Ellicottville will be made to work together to obtain funding for upgrading the Sanitary Sewer System. While the Town and Village are known to work together, Supervisor McAndrew wanted to make note for the sag on Deer Crossing Road to be addressed in the project. The inter-municipal project is expected to reduce costs on the project, improve government efficiency, and better attract grant funding.

The Ellicottville Town Board will reconvene on the third Wednesday of each month. For more information on meeting dates and agendas, go to ellicottvillegov.com.





Core Performance: Proper Hydration is Essential to a Properly Functioning Body

When I complete a fitness assessment with any potential new client, I not only want to learn about their goals and limitations, but also, what their diets look like. My first dietary question is always about hydration. Shockingly, most people do not drink enough water/fluid throughout each day. Staying hydrated is essential for virtually every function of the body and it is crucial for them to work properly.

Dehydration can negatively affect many organs and body processes, with extreme cases leading to delirium, weakness or even death. Being slightly dehydrated is no good either - even a small amount of dehydration can impact our cognitive abilities, balance and physical performance. Plus, hydration plays a huge role in kidney and heart function as well as gut health (as anyone who's ever been constipated can attest).

We lose water through breathing, perspiration, urine and bowel movements, and our water supply needs to be constantly replenished. The best way to tell if you are well hydrated is to check out a urine color chart. As your day wears on with proper hydration, your urine should become almost colorless or just slightly yellow.

There is actually no RDA for water, but the National Institutes of Health and Nutrition Board has established an AI - or Adequate Intake - for fluid. AI for fluid is 2.7L/day for women (91 fluid ounces / 11 cups) and 3.7L/day for men (125 fluid ounces / 15 cups). I tell my clients that they should replenish their liquid with at least half of their body weight each day - more if they are performing vigorous activities or sweating due to hot spring/summer weather.

As much as I press my clients to just drink more water, I seem to be met with resistance since many find water tasteless and undesirable. The good news: AI guideline takes into account hydration you may get from a variety of beverages, fruits, vegetables and broth. Alcohol is NOT on that list and sodas and other sugar sweetened beverages are also not highly recommended.

To get enough hydration, I highly recommend you keep water with you at all times. Drink fluids throughout the day to reduce inflammation and bloating. If you have trouble remembering to drink water, drink on a schedule. For example, drink water when you wake up, at breakfast, lunch, dinner, and when you go to bed. Or drink a glass of water at the beginning of each hour. Make mini goals and see how staying hydrated affects your body.



Yes, you may need a to use a restroom a little more often, but as your body acclimates to your new hydration efforts, so too, will your urge to urinate. Staying properly hydrated will only benefit you by keeping every bodily system running smoothly.

The added chevron along the hoist features black, brown, light blue, pink, and white stripes to bring those communities - marginalized people of color, trans people, and those living with HIV/AIDS and those who have been lost - to the forefront.

This June, Pride month marks the 55th anniversary of Stonewall, a series of protests by the

LGBTQ community after a police raid during the early morning hours of June 28, 1969, on the Stonewall Inn in Greenwich Village. This became a seminal event in the history of the LGBTQ movement for equal rights in this country. As such, the flag-raising will include local speakers instrumental in building greater rights for the LGBTQ community in Jamestown and Chautauqua County. The rally will also include voter registration, refreshments and opportunities to purchase Jamestown Pride merchandise. The following Saturday, June 8, is the 2024 Jamestown Pride, with events occurring throughout the day in downtown Jamestown.






