Foster Cattaraugus to Host Adult Prom Fundraiser

If you never had a chance to go or would like to relive the magic – perhaps with the person who is now your true love – the time is now! Foster Cattaraugus, a brand new non-profit organization, is hosting an Enchanted Forest Adult Prom on Saturday, August 10th from 7:00-10:00pm at Woodside Tavern in Olean.

All proceeds from the adult prom benefit Foster Cattaraugus, a non-profit organization that is dedicated to helping foster care in Cattaraugus County. Amanda Clute, one of the founding members of the organization, said the organization was formed in April of this year and grew out of a need that she and others recognized when children enter foster care. "There's a growing number of kids and a growing number of needs for foster homes," Clute explained. "When kiddos come into care, there's kind of a mad rush, and there are needs that aren't reimbursed by the state. In an effort to support the county, we came together to create a non-profit that might provide for some of those intake needs: hygiene items, diapers, the initial formula before WIC begins - those basic items that maybe are a little bit hard up front for a foster parent to take care of and hard for the county with a growing number of kiddos."

Indeed, the number of children in foster care in Cattaraugus County has increased significantly, even since last year. "The number of children has grown so much," said Clute. "This time last year, there were about 50 kids, and there must be close to 90 this year." She explained that Foster Cattaraugus exists to help bridge the gap between what the children need and what the county can immediately provide to "make that beginning for kiddos that are already in a traumatic situation better."

Children in foster care range in age from newborn up to age 21, Clute shared, which means the needs of each foster family can be very different. Foster Cattaraugus works closely with the county to understand what the intake needs are in order to support families as they welcome a new child into their homes. In addition to providing for families' physi-

THE BASKET BARN

An Ancient Art in a Modern World

Every kid comes home at one point in their early school years with a colorful construction paper strip basket that they made, likely filled with Easter straw. I know I did and many, many years later, my own children did.

Basket weaving is an art introduced to us at an early age. Perhaps it's because it is so ageless. While basket weaving is one of the widest spread crafts in the history of any human civilization, no one can say for sure how old, because the natural materials like wood, grass, and animal remains used in making baskets decayed over time. From Wikipedia, we learn that the oldest known baskets were discovered in Faiyum in upper Egypt and have been carbon dated to between 10,000 and 12,000 years old, earlier than any established dates for archaeological evidence of pottery vessels, which were too heavy and fragile to suit far-ranging hunter-gatherers. Baskets were a staple item. We needed them throughout civilization. Even through the World Wars, baskets were used for dropping supplies of ammunition and food to the troops.

You know how it goes, you take a class doing something, enjoy it, go back for more and suddenly you are hooked and it becomes your life. What started out as a fun project for herself to make a few baskets for her own collection turned into "Can you make one for me?"

It got to the point that so many people asked her to weave for them, she started selling her baskets at Artisan Shows. From there, well, it grew like Topsy. (This old phrase alludes to the little African American slave girl in Harriet Beecher Stowe's Uncle Tom's Cabin, who when asked where she came from, replied, "I 'spect I growed. Don't think nobody never made me." The growth turned into her own basket shop where she teaches basketry classes from beginner to advanced skill levels.



As Nicole's student, one not only learns to weave but gets an insight into the different materials and techniques used in weaving. An extra bonus is that it is relaxing and takes the weaver's mind off everything but the project at hand. She presently does workshops at Tri-County Arts Council in Olean, has taught at local schools, Pfeiffer Center, Senior Services and OMRDD who she says were some of her best students.

Her new workshop in Allegany is still a work in progress. Located on 10 acres of land with magnificent pastoral views, the shop is located behind the house. Nicole refers to it as a "hidden gem" which adds to the calming, quiet environment weavers discover when signing on for basket making classes.

Nicole told this writer: "I offer my 'Signature' Basket Classes which are classes I designed that students can register for on the website www.andrewsfarmsbasketbarn.com and I offer private basket classes for small groups here at the shop. Everyone weaves at a different pace, but in general, basket classes are usually about 3 hours long, but larger, more complicated baskets take much longer. Students have the option to stain their basket after class as well."

Now, the best way to learn more about what is offered in the way of making baskets is to go online. Take your time, push the info tab on each basket class offered and you will get a good feel for what is offered and what is expected. Classes will be held outdoors unless there is inclement weather, then in the classroom. Prepare yourself with adequate bug spray and know that there are animals on the property (dogs, cats, horses) so take care of your allergies before attending. Wear comfortable clothing, bring snacks and lunch, and plan to discover a talent you never knew you had!

You will find Nicole at this year's Cuba Garlic Festival in September, and at the Christmas in the Country show at the Hamburg Fairgrounds Grange Building in November. Nicole's shop is 17 minutes from Ellicottville up Chapel Hill Rd. to Morgan Hollow. If you would like to learn more about Basket Classes, you can email thebasketbarn@yahoo.com. CAPTAIN TOM & THE HOOLIGANS BRINGING THE FUN TO THE ELLICOTTVILLE DISTILLED & CHILLED MUSIC FESTIVAL

Captain Tom & The Hooligans will take the stage at 8:00pm on Saturday, August 17th and close out the 5th annual Distilled & Chilled Music Festival at the Ellicottville Distillery in Ellicottville, NY.

The festival, which focuses on original music from the Western New York area, will showcase multiple bands and artists from 12:00-9:00pm along with craft beer, food trucks and craft vendors.

I caught up with Captain Tom (Tom Sieracki) recently to talk about the band's history and the type of music they play. Our conversation started out very different from most bands and artists I've interviewed because the debut of this band in 2019 came to a complete halt, shattering the excitement and dreams by an unforeseen event... the Covid-19 pandemic, that shut the whole world down.

With no real end in sight, the pandemic rearranged all that had been set in motion. Sieracki spent the time writing songs and finding the camaraderie among the band members and learning an instrument that was not what he played in the band, which you will read about in the following conversation.

Now in full swing and playing shows all over Buffalo, Western New York and Pennsylvania, adding Cleveland and Boston last year, they've become one of the most sought after acts out there.

With a set list of cover songs that have their own spin put on them, and original music written by Captain Tom himself, they cover any genre you can think of including Celtic Punk, Folk Rock, Americana, Eastern European Folk and Ska, with an emphasis on Polka, you can pretty much find them at any kind of festival

I asked Sieracki how he would describe the band and the music they play, to which he answered in the interview, but I like how it is summed up on their website, "Drinking songs and dance music... what else could you want?"

Indeed! Get your tickets and let the Captain Tom & The Hooligans get your body moving while experiencing the wild and fun atmosphere from a band that I'm sure you will want to see again and again.

A Conversation with Captain Tom

HULICK: We're looking forward to seeing you at the Distilled & Chilled Music Festival, August 17th in Ellicottville. When and how did the band start? **CAPTAIN:** The band was formed by myself, Captain Tom, with several of my high school friends around late 2019. We had played a Christmas party and one public gig, and then everything was quickly shut down due to Covid.

HULICK: How did you handle it? I know a lot of artists were devastated for themselves but also for their band members who needed to support their families, both local artists and world wide artists. I can't imagine how tough it was on you. As a fan of music I seriously felt lost with no concerts to go to. I

mean you could listen to music but there was that huge void of being present in the moment with artists and the audience.

CAPTAIN: Well, obviously, Covid was not a great time and it did prevent us from playing shows. It did allow us to work on ourselves and practice to develop sound and camaraderie among the band members. I wrote a lot of music, but couldn't perform. I took a lot of time to develop my accordion playing. Before Covid I was not the accordion playing. playing. Before Covid, I was not the accordion player in the band and could hardly play at the time, which is obviously not the case now!

HULICK: How would you describe your band to a newbie like me? **CAPTAIN:** Captain Tom & The Hooligans is what we like to call "a modern rendition of old world tradition," but really we just like to have fun. We like to mix in elements such as electric guitars, which are not traditional in genres like polka, to really drive the energy into the music! On top of this, we play a great variety of music such as Celtic Rock, Americana, Ska and of course

HULICK: You play so many different genres from A to Z. I don't know much

CAPTAIN: Ska is a genre that originated in Jamaican dance halls, and over time made its way to Britain and the United States where it combined with punk rock and became the genre it is today. I'd say two of the most important arts of Ska are its use of horns and its danceable beats.

HULICK: How many members do you have and what are their names? **CAPTAIN:** We have a rotating cast of characters, however at Distilled & Chilled we will consist of: Captain Tom - Accordion, Commodore Dave - Saxophone & Clarinet, Mike Bryzski - Electric Guitar, Trevor Jennings - Drums, Shavonne Pucula - Upright Bass, Karl Zielezinski - Trumpet, Ray Skalski -Trombone, Dom Testino - Trumpet... and everyone sings!

HULICK: You put your own vibe on songs that are popular, but you have your own original music as well. Who writes in the band and how does the process go... like do you write whenever you have an idea or do you consciously set time aside.

CAPTAIN: We do like to put a twist on the covers we do, but on top of that we have a whole bunch of original songs. We actually just released a full length album in April consisting of 18 songs, most of them original. We also have an EP we released about half a year ago which has six songs, half of which were originals we had that we haven't recorded yet to perform live. As far as writing goes I write most of the songs, both the lyrics and the music. I'm inspired all the time and I am constantly writing down ideas. Also my father, Commodore Dave, writes out a lot of the sheet music for the band and our arrangements, which is a huge help.

HULICK: I'm guessing "Lockport Ladies" is an original. What are a couple others that are fan favorites?

CAPTAIN: "Lockport Ladies" is an original tune. We like to write a lot about our local surroundings. We have found our fans really like the song "If I Had \$100" that we wrote and they're big fans of our cover of "Living Next Door to Alice," which we just call "Alice" on our album.

HULICK: Do you take requests at your shows?

CAPTAIN: At most of our shows, we are always open to taking requests, however, once we are up on stage I like to engage the crowd and just play what I feel the crowd will like in that moment.

HULICK: Do you do any songs from Bobby Vinton? When he first started out he played local proms and events in Pennsylvania where he was from. One of them was for my husband's mother's prom. It really is a small world. **CAPTAIN:** That's awesome! We do actually play some Bobby Vinton, most notably we cover his song, "My Melody of Love." It's become a favorite in the Polish American community.

HULICK: You play all over Buffalo and Western New York. Where else do

CAPTAIN: In the last year, we played both Cleveland and Boston, and have now played Pennsylvania a couple times. I have been playing more in Pennsylvania sylvania. Even though we mostly played in Buffalo and Western New York and love playing in this area, we have been expanding more to the surround-

HULICK: What is the song you would say is the most fun to do live? **CAPTAIN:** Picking out a favorite song is tricky, especially live because it changes from show to show, but lately, one of our favorites has been our original song "Dyngus Daze" on our new album *Proud.* It's a lively song about the Polish American holiday Dyngus Day.

HULICK: You won the "Best Other Band/Act" award from All for WNY Awards for 2020- 2021. Tell us a little about that.

CAPTAIN: From what I understand, there's a local collective musicians in Western New York that run a best contest in the music scene every year. Notably one of them has an online show called the Think So Joe Show







Breakaway Classic Adventures: Pheasants for Peasants

I had the opportunity to sit down with a friend who is big into hunting pheasants, starting with raising them from chicks to training his German Shorthaired Pointer to hunt them. His name is Tom McCormick and he resides in nearby Bliss, NY. Pheasant hunting is not a sport reserved for kings - in fact, the DEC releases birds every fall for anyone that has the time and inkling to do so.

So I asked Tom what makes Upland Bird in particular pheasant hunting so special for him. He answered, "Autumn in western New York is one of the more beautiful times to be out and enjoying our areas natural resources. Pheasant hunting has been our family tradition for decades."

According to Tom, Ring Neck Pheasants at one time roamed the farm fields and hedge rows in great numbers throughout the 1970s and 80s. However, as farming practices evolve and USDA Conservation Reserve (CRP) "set-aside" programs no longer were economically viable – paying farmers not to farm lower quality land – pheasant population suffered. Habitat diminished and natural predators devastated the wild population.

That has not dulled the enthusiasm for pheasant hunting though! One of the driving forces that helps feed this enthusiasm is the Reynolds Game Farm in Ithaca at the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Facility. The facility's purpose is to raise birds for release into the wild for hunting on New York Wildlife Management Areas, State Forests, Forest Preserve and State Parks. There are also several private clubs that offer upland bird hunting in our area. They provide outstanding experience for both experienced and first time adventure seekers alike. Most preserves provide a guide and a hunting dog if needed.

What really adds to the experience is having trusted partners with you. For Tom, that is both his wife and their German Shorthair Pointer, Bruno!

Tom affectionately explains that about 6 years ago Bruno came into their life. "We are lifelong dog lovers. Bruno was our first entry in bringing a highly effective hunting breed into our family. One of the most rewarding parts of our love of pheasant hunting is watching Bruno do what he was born to do... find this elusive bird every autumn and hoping not to disappoint him after the flush with a poor shot from his master! Training Bruno was a massively rewarding part of our love of pheasant hunting. Every sportsman may have a slightly different approach in training a highly effect bird dog. For us, we needed guidance. There are countless books, DVDs and free YouTube videos that are for sure helpful. However, what made the greatest impact was when we joined our local North American Versatile Hunting Association or NAVHDA. Without question this organization gives you a community of pheasant dog loving outdoorsmen that will speed up yours and your partner's learning curve and cement your love for the sport."

Tom explained that when he was a teenager he had various hunting dogs. "I was told by the local population that if you want your hunting dog to possess and maintain a strong hunting desire that they need to be kept outside, tied to a doghouse and in the element, never to see the inside of your house. For us with Bruno, that proved to be ridiculous! First off, a properly train upland dog knows when it's time to work! Bruno for the past 6 years has spent every night curled up in our bed!"

Tom goes on to say, "However, when I reach for my hunting gear, Bruno knows what is coming. I can't get him into the pick-up fast enough and when we arrive at the field, he converts to a laser focused hunting machine waiting for my command to 'hunt-em-up'".

Getting Bruno to that level was as rewarding as knocking a flushed rooster out of the air from 25 yards away. Training him myself allowed us to develop an incredible bond. We

are a team out in the field and at home. We know people that send their prized purebred off to a 'professional trainer'. To be clear, this is an excellent way to get your dog to hunt. That said, it's not the same. Its' just not. I can spend 10-15 minutes a day training Bruno with the basics. He is my only student. I learn his habits, he learns mine. And when we are done with the training, he follows me into the house or plays with our other dog, who happens to be a very lovable recuse, chasing sparrows or chipmunks in the yard." Tom and his wife look forward in great anticipation to being out with Bruno on a crisp frost-covered October morning flushing a rooster in the field.

Another great program that the DEC offers through the Reynolds Game Farm and that the Houghton Fly Fishing Club is scheduled to partake in is a customized pheasant hunt where they will come to your location of choice and release two birds per hunter, and all of this free of charge!

The HFFC is looking for anyone interested, but with a catch - the funds generated from signed up participants will go towards Wild Trout habitat improvements! Contact the HFFC by email at info@riverdogflyfishing.com, dates and location TBA.
