

Both Holiday Valley and HoliMont are getting excited about fall as well; it's the gateway to preparing for the winter season. That's enough to get us all excited! What does the fall season at our local resorts look like exactly? Let's dive in...

HOLIDAY VALLEY RESORT

When asked about the summer activities winding down, Holiday Valley Marketing Director Dash Hegeman said, "It's been a fast but fantastic summer here at Holiday Valley. Between Sky High Adventure Park, our lodging guests, The Double Black Diamond Golf Course, public pools and the Cabana Bar, summertime events, weddings, and of course all of the conferences that we host, it's been an action-packed summer. The public pools are now shut down for the season, and since school is back in session, Sky High and the Sky Flyer Mountain Coaster are scaling back to a Friday-through-Sunday schedule. Their lodging guests will be happy to hear that renovations which started last summer at both The Inn and the Tamarack Club are in year two of a threeyear project timeframe, right on schedule.

Okay, let's talk events. Fall Festival is a huge deal around here, and Holiday Valley packs their fair share of entertainment. "Fall Festival is always a fun one here in Ellicottville," said Dash. "We'll be running the Mardi Gras 6 lift for scenic chairlift rides, where there will be live music, food and drinks at the top. Chairlift rides will also be available on the Spruce Lake lift for anyone who wants to go walk around the lake or any of the hiking trails." The following month, Holiday Valley will host their Crawl Outta Fall and and Beer & Wine Festival, November 8th and 9th, respectively. It's their last big hurrah before their planned opening day of ski season on Friday, November 29th. The Crawl Outta Fall is an event that was created last year as a pre-party for lodging guests who are attending Beer & Wine Festival. It kicks off at the Tamarack Club, then invites participants to make their way into the village for a fun night of drink specials at a number of bars and restaurants in Ellicottville. On Saturday, Nov. 9th, Holiday Valley's staple fall event, Beer & Wine Festival, will welcome craft breweries and wineries from all over the region, pouring samples for event-goers in a high-energy atmosphere complete with live music inside the Main Lodge.

For now, Holiday Valley continues to welcome guests and encourages you to come soak up the rest of summer's sunshine. "We are looking to finish the summer strong and show each and every one of our guests a fun-filled time," said Dash. "At the same time, we are gearing up for winter and making sure that everything is ready so that when the weather allows, we can maximize our incredible snowmaking system in order to get the entire resort open as quickly as possible. Everyone at Holiday Valley is very excited for the upcoming winter season and seeing skiers and snowboarders back out on the slopes!'


HOLIMONT RESORT

They also have a 1900s style crank tractor that gives the chance to hand turn the engine if you put the muscle into it!





A REUNION RIDE

Zoar Motopark to Host 2nd Annual Racing Event September 28th

Over 50 years ago in May of 1973, the first motocross race was held at Zoar Motopark, and a legacy was begun. For 10 years, area motocross racers and enthusiasts enjoyed the beautiful track, which sat vacant for about 40 years until recently. Zoar Motopark promoter Ed Abdo has been thrilled to be a part of the revival of the track and is pleased to welcome everyone to the second annual Reunion Ride, which is set for the weekend of September 28th.

In 1973, the area that became Zoar Motopark was an unassuming plot of vacant land. Abdo explained, "The land itself was just barren land at the time, but it's all natural with hills and valleys, and it's part of Zoar Valley, which is a beautiful place." Zoar Motopark's original promoter noticed the beautiful property and approached the landowner about creating a motocross track and holding events there. "The original promoter's desire was to not have to travel so much to take his kids to motocross races back in the early seventies," Abdo explained. Fortunately, the landowner agreed, and the land was cleared by spring of 1973.

"Races ran here for 10 years, and then the promoter passed away," Abdo said. "One of his sons that raced was killed in a car accident, and the other son was running the races here. Basically, he said 'That's enough,' and walked away from the track. It sat for 40 years." Abdo noted that over the decades, quite a bit of tree growth and brush took over the track - a disappointing situation for all who'd enjoyed races there.

Abdo and his friend, Mike Bender, had always talked about bringing Zoar Motopark back to life, but they figured this was an impossibility due to conflicts between the land-owner and the promoter at the time. "We always thought it was a neat dream," Abdo recalled. "And then I met the current owner, who's part of the family from the original owners. This land has been owned by the same family since the 1800s."






Last year, Abdo approached the new landowner and asked if he could clear the land and restore the racetrack to its original configuration from 1973 and hold an event there. "And we did," Abdo said. "She said okay, and it was a big success! Everyone was very respectful of the land, and the owner came to me on the last day of last year's event and thought we should do it again. So we're doing it again!"

On the weekend of September 28th, Zoar Motopark is hosting a vintage motocross event, and all are welcome. On Friday, the gates are open from noon to 10:00pm, and on Saturday and Sunday, gates are open from 7:00am to 10:00pm. Weekend entry is \$30 and includes camping through Monday, if desired. Weekend food concessions will be provided by Goodes Restaurant. This weekend is the perfect time to catch up with old friends who enjoyed the track in the past, as well as meet folks who are new to Zoar Motopark! Friday evening features a movie on the big screen, and Saturday and Sunday will feature live music by Rainman. 

Get insight of the unexplained when Jamestown Paranormal Investigators host speakers and vendors on subjects such as Bigfoot, UFOs, ghosts and more.



Founded in 2010 by Mike Pollaro, a 20-year veteran ghost hunter and paranormal investigator, JPI is a volunteer group of paranormal enthusiasts, ghost hunters, and those seeking "to find proof of the paranormal," according to its mission statement. The group offers confidential investigations of private residents, businesses, and lands free of charge throughout greater Chautauqua and Cattaraugus counties. In a phone interview with Pollaro, ellicotvilleNOW got the scoop on ParaCon '24.

eNOW: How did you get the event off the ground? What was the impetus for ParaCon '24?

POLLARO: This will be Jamestown Paranormal Investigator's fourth ParaCon that we have done in the past. We have done them for a while now, and this one is trying to help children with epilepsy. Getting an event like this off the ground takes a lot of work. We have 17 different tables with vendors and auction tables. For speakers, we have a Bigfoot researcher and speaker, a UFO speaker, and a couple of other paranormal groups coming in. All the proceeds from any sales go to fight epilepsy, and ticket sales go to support the theater.





eNOW: Why did you choose Gowanda's Historic Hollywood Theater? Are there any hauntings or known paranormal activity there?

POLLARO: We have a good relationship with the theater. JPI has done investigations there and they classify us as their paranormal team. We have been doing events there for three years now and they said that they would like to do an event there, so I explained to them what ParaCon is and they said that's what they want. They have been really good

eNOW: Can you give us a sneak-peek of what folks can expect at ParaCon '24? POLLARO: We have 5 or 6 speakers – Peter Wiemer, a Bigfoot researcher/speaker; Cookie Stringfellow, a UFO speaker; Danielle Cervone and Hope Hill from JPI; Quentin Zarzynski, presenting on goblins and mysterious stuff like that. I have a couple other ghost groups that will come in, like CAPS, the Chautauqua Area Paranormal Society – Caleb Dopson is speaking. Freddy Krueger will also be walking around all day long. My granddaughter is going to do Samara Morgan. When people come in, I want them to be a part of the experience. If I have Freddy and Samara walking around and interacting with people, they will enjoy themselves better. I want them to be involved and to say, "Yes, this is what we want," to be a part of this. There will be 50/50 raffles, door prizes, and auction items. We have lot of donated items to sell, like an autograph from Nick Groff, formerly of *Ghost Adventures* and *Paranormal Lockdown*. There will be vendors selling all kinds of things, from homemade items to majestical crystals to creepy dolls stuff like that. All the money the vendors make off of their tables, they take home with them that night. I also have an author coming to sell his books.

eNOW: Is this a family-friendly event?

POLLARO: Yes, this is a family gathering; it is absolutely a family-friendly event! There will not be any alcohol, so you don't have to worry about anyone drunk being in front of the kids. We'll have games for the kids, too.

eNOW: What cause is the event supporting?

POLLARO: The idea behind the ParaCons was to raise money for causes. The first

eNOW: That's a lot of music for everyone to enjoy! We want to promote that this is a family-friendly event. Can you give us some details on the activities you'll have set up for the littles?

KELLER: Kidsland is a staple feature at Borderland every year. The late David Nojaim, a dear friend of the Borderland team, curated the Kids Zone for years. Although he's no longer with us, his energy and spirit live on. The Kids Zone provides our youngest fans a fully immersive experience through instruments, animals, face painting, and more.

eNOW: You've always got a wide array of vendors. Who's setting up this year and what will they be offering?

KELLÉR: Craft vendors are a huge part of Borderland. We have about 40 vendors every year that set up in the historic Knox Farm Stables. You can shop all weekend for things like tie-dyes from Jengle, apparel from Fish U.S., watch live art with Muse Jar or even get a henna tattoo.

eNOW: There is also a variety of food and beverage options. Can you provide us some info on what will be available?

KELLER: Come hungry! The Dopest Dough Grilled Cheese Truck will be back in action along with baked goods from East Aurora's Blue Eyed Baker, pizza from Al Forno

The First National Bank Has New Life: Find the Works of Theresa Heinz and Other Artists Inside

Thanks to Savarino Development, an iconic Olean bank whose presence has stood for over 100 years has been given a facelift, an overhaul, and new life. The former First National Bank features apartments with retail and commercial spaces on the ground floor. The 44,000 square-foot, steel and brick framed building consists of six floors and one mezzanine. Construction began in November of 2020 and was completed in the Spring of 2023.

The First National project is the historic renovation of the thirty years long-abandoned 1915 First National Bank building and the adjacent former Siegel's Shoes building in downtown Olean, New York. The 10-story First National building, known locally as the "Manny Hanny Building" because its former occupant, Manufacturer's Hanover Bank, now houses 21 market-rate luxury apartments on floors 2-10. The former bank floor and mezzanine will house an event facility.

As with many projects that begin with someone asking, "why don't we?," this one with First National Bank Art Studios & Lobby Gallery was created by ChaShaMa with help from Paula Bernstein at the Tri-County Arts Council and Savarino Development. It happened because of an email chain which included Bernstein, who planted that seed. The project provides five artist studios and exhibition space through December 31, 2024. The artists featured will be Theresa Heinz of Cuba, Sean Huntington of Olean, Fileve Tlaloc Palmer of Great Valley, Eva Potter of Allegany, and Tara Walker of Olean.

The studios are open to the public Tuesday 10:00am-4:00pm, Thursday 3:00-7:00pm, and Saturday 10:00am-4:00pm. They are located on the first floor of the First National Bank Building, 108 N. Union Street. The Tri-County Arts Council advocates for the creation and appreciation of arts and culture in the region, and this opportunity would not have happened without the partnership of Chashama and Savarino Properties.

You are invited to take classes at the Arts Council (110 West State Street), that range from snow sculpting and pumpkin carving to tree painting and pet portraits, and most anything in between. Go to tricountyartscouncil.org for more information or look for them on Facebook at Tri-County Arts Council.

The first one-person exhibit will feature the work of resident artist Theresa Heinz of Cuba beginning Friday, September 15th (6:00-8:00pm) through October 5th. You are invited to attend the opening of her show named "Expansion. How a Space Alters the Creative Process." In speaking with the artist, she laughed as she explained how the presentation got its name. You see, Heinz has worked consistently with small pieces, partly because her home studio is tiny. She didn't realize that she was confined to "small" works because of the size of her surroundings until she walked into the studio space at the bank and was overwhelmed with the vastness of the creative space she could now use. She immediately had a paradigm shift.

Having already bought supplies consisting of 6x6 inch canvases, she immediately returned them and bought builder's paper, canvases measured by the foot, large tubes of

paint, large brushes and learned how to do art kneeling on the floor. Using a gelli printing process (printing without a press), Heinz creates the paper she uses for her collage work, putting to use the sheets of brown packing paper from Amazon! She has shifted from small, fine detailed pieces, some put down with tweezers, to a grand scale involving large tools and expansive ideas. She mentioned a field of hollyhocks, which this writer is partial to. Who remembers making hollyhock dolls with toothpicks and flowers when they were a child? The magic of art is that it invokes memories, feelings, emotions that can overtake us unannounced.

Theresa Hintz is a native of Cuba, retired from 31 years as a high school art teacher. She holds a BFA and MS in Art Education from Alfred University. She prefers the collage medium because it gives her the satisfaction of texture, color and perhaps a bit of serendipity when she adds just another gelli piece of paper to a creation. Married to her high school sweetheart (now, how sweet is that? She said that after 43 years they figured they might as well keep doing what they are doing because it obviously works), mom to two young women who live in Pittsburgh and Dansville respectively, and mom to her furbaby Jack Russell terrier, Ike. (knowing she has and loves this pupper should tell you reams about this lady!) She unabashedly smiles through her voice when speaking about the freedom to create that retirement has given her. Adding to that the gift of using this amazing, oversized bank space for the next few months has her giggling with joy. You will want to meet her just to catch her infectious joy and discover it exhibited in her work.




