

Western NY Southtowns Scenic Byway Announces Third Annual Photo Contest

Fall is officially here, and with it brings all the fabulous autumnal colors! Just in time for the change of season, the Western New York Southtowns Scenic Byway (WNYSSB) recently announced its third annual photo contest, running now through November 30, 2024.

You may have seen signs around Cattaraugus County for the Scenic Byway and wondered what it is all about. For those unfamiliar, the WNY Southtowns Scenic Byway is a 108-mile-long loop of highways connecting the suburbs of Orchard Park and East Aurora south of Buffalo to the charming towns and villages of southern Erie County and Cattaraugus County along US 219, NY 240, and NY 242. Traversing through the verdant foothills of the Allegheny Mountains, the southern-most terminus of the Byway is in Ellicottville. Through legislative vote in 2015, the Byway was officially expanded into Cattaraugus County in 2016.

"Originally, [the Byway] was from Orchard Park over to East Aurora, and then down to Springville," shared William (Bill) Even, long-serving vice president of the WNYSSB, in a phone interview with ellicottvilleNOW. "Then we expanded down to Ellicottville – it was a logical extension," he said. "We get a lot of Canadian visitors, especially around ski season that just drive down 219 and it makes sense to bring [the Byway] all the way down to Ellicottville because of that."

Founded in 2008, the WNYSSB's mission is "to promote economic development and community pride through the thoughtful stewardship of the natural, scenic, cultural, historic, and recreational resources of the byway region," according to the organization's website (www.wnyssb.org).

Even said that the inspiration for starting the photo contest in 2022 was "to raise awareness of the Byway and all the historical and natural beauty that we have along the route." He added that the WNYSSB is Western New York's only scenic byway. "There's a lot of natural beauty, especially in autumn; we're trying to push it now because there are so many opportunities to see some really magnificent scenery."



He added that, "This is year three [of the contest], and it has been growing - we had about

120 photos submitted last year, and I'd like to see that doubled."

With regard to this year's contest, there will be two categories for entry, same as last year: one for stand-alone cameras, and the other for mobile devices.

"There have been some amazing advances on mobile device cameras, but you still can't beat a nice Nikon or Canon camera, so we broke it into two categories," Even said. "I think the mobile device option give everyone the option, from ages 3 to 103, to participate."

Prizes for contest winners in both categories include \$150 and a copy of Nostalgic Buffalo, written by Even, for first place, \$100 for second place, and \$50 for third place. To further incentivize participation, Even included that, "The winning entries will be displayed across the Joylan Theatre in Springville and the Aurora Theatre in East Aurora," adding that the winning images will be showcased on the big screens before movies.

With regard to the contest details, there is no entry fee, and anyone is eligible to enter. Up to five submissions per applicant are permitted, and all participants are required to read and agree to the contest rules and regulations as set out on the WNYSSB's website under the 2024 Photo Contest tab.

Furthermore, submissions must be taken within the geographical boundaries of the Western New York Southtowns Scenic Byway as stated on the contest rules and regulations. See the organization's website for a map of the Byway boundaries.

Approximately 200 vendors will set up in the streets downtown for one of the largest arts & crafts shows in the region. From handcrafted jewelry to beau-tifully painted ceramics, attendees can browse unique creations that embody the spirit of autumn.

"Many vendors incorporate seasonal themes, offering items like hand-knit scarves, pumpkin spice candles, and festive decorations that capture the essence of the fall season," said Brian McFadden, Executive Director of the Ellicottville Chamber of Commerce. "And since we're in Bills country, you can expect a number of vendors offering Bills apparel and merchandise as well."

Add in a full outdoor food court along with the flavors of Ellicottville's already-established restaurants, and you will without a doubt satisfy your tastebuds. "In addition to all the food, our local craft breweries, distilleries, and wineries will be featuring seasonal drink specials," added Brian. "A taste of pumpkin ale or spiced cider can be the perfect way to toast to the changing season. This year's Fall Festival in Ellicottville will welcome special guest Eric Jones. You may recognize his name as a finalist in Food Network's *Halloween Wars*. Fall Weather Brings the Return of EVL Half Marathon & 5k, Among Other Races

In high school, I had two loves. Two after-school activities whose seasons both fell between September and December. They were theater and cross country, and all four years of high school they played a mental tug of war in my head. Theater was my creative outlet and my way of working with a team. Cross country taught me discipline, how to stay in shape, and the importance of meeting goals.

Ultimately, I gave up cross country my senior season to be in one last show. And while I don't regret my decision, I do regret the fact that I stopped running. It's one of the best feelings to be out in the fresh air with nothing but your thoughts, and this fall, Ellicott-ville wants more people to discover that joy.

The EVL Halloween Half/5K run is almost here! With the spooky season comes run season in Ellicottville, and the twelfth year of this classic run, which promises to be bigger than ever before. It's a half marathon, 5k, and relay. The race takes place on Saturday, October 26th.

The Fall Scramble at Holiday Valley is only a few weeks before that, on October 12th. It's newer, as this is only its fifth year, but it's just as much fun. The race starts at 9:00am at Yodeler with a chairlift ride to the top of the mountain and offers a 4- and 8-mile terrain course. Scaling the hills of Holiday Valley in this timed scramble is not for the faint of... foot?



Both of these races are presented by Endurancefactor, an event management company located here in Ellicottville specializing in endurance sports. If you need anything running, cycling, or triathlon, they are the ones to call on.

I spoke with Doug Bush, the 15-year owner of Endurancefactor. Not only does Doug race direct several events in Ellicottville and the surrounding area, but Doug also raises money through a select few events. Namely, the run for St. Jude Cancer Hospital with 21,000 runners raises \$18 million, and his EA2EVL charity bike ride has raised \$150,000 for the Erie Cattaraugus Rail Trail Association. Locally, Endurancefactor has donated over \$30,000 to various community charities.

For those looking for more adventure during Fall Fest, head to Holiday Valley and enjoy another round of fun! The resort will be offering chairlift rides to the top of the mountain, where leaf peeping and live entertainment await. HoliMont will also offer chairlift rides to the top of Expo, plus the HoliMont Bike Park will operate its final weekend of lift access for the season. And just down the road from Ellicottville, Pumpkinville of Great Valley is one of the largest pumpkin patches in the region which also boasts a corn maze, beer garden, its very own cider mill, a cow train, and plenty of fun games and activities for the whole family.

At its heart, the Fall Festival is a celebration of community. The festival also serves as a platform for local organizations and charities, fostering a spirit of giving back. Look for information booths and donation drives throughout the weekend as you saunter through the village. For more information about this year's Fall Festival, go to ellicottvilleny.com.

Doug, a serious triathlete who has competed in multiple Ironmans, got into the management business by meeting other directors during his time as a racer. "Ironman brought a bike race to Ellicottville around 14 years ago and I was a local director for that. I decided after that to find more local events for the community," Doug said.

"It's after Fall Fest, kinda before ski season, and we wanted to do something that would bring people together in the community and bridge the gap between the two seasons."

Ellicottville Brewing Company is hosting the after-party, complete with a band and a DJ. Music will be bumping all throughout the course though, but you better not get too distracted, because earning one of the "one-of-a-kind" finisher medals is a highlight of the event. "Those medals are something we've become known for, coupled with our cool merchandise t-shirts and quarter zips," Doug said.



The Village Board of Ellicottville began their September meeting on the evening of September 17th at 6:00pm. With Mayor John Burrell and Clerk Amy Hayward in attendance at the NYCOM Conference, discussions were called to order by Board Member, Doug Bush.

Starting off the evening with some good news for the Village, an announcement was made to the Board regarding a recent visit by Congressman Nick Langworthy. The Congressman made the trip to the Village of Ellicottville on September 5th with his team to meet and discuss local projects within the area. Local business members joined in the day, including as Ed Youmans, General Manager for HoliMont; Dennis Eshbaugh, General Manager of Holiday Valley; Jeff Williams, a Western New York developer; Village Mayor John Burrell; and Brian McFadden, Executive Director of the Ellicottville Chamber of Commerce.

The day was well spent as they enjoyed walking along Washington Street, stopping at local shops, and admiring the charm of the village. Finishing up their stroll, they met with the Northrup team and checked out the Elizabeth Street project. Overall, the Congressman and his team were very impressed with the efficiency and implementation of resources throughout the village. It comes to no surprise as the Village has continued to be recognized for their positive progress among local businesses and community.

The mayor's report was held off this evening due to his absence from the meeting while at the NYCOM Conference alongside the Village Clerk, Ms. Hayward. Updates will be made during the October Board meeting to further discuss the conference, as well as other training opportunities, policy updates, and connections that may have been made during the event.

An update to the Village website has been made. They will now have monthly postings on the current short-term rental properties that are permitted within the village. Each month these listings will be renewed to reflect any changes that may have been made. Keep in mind, the rental of any residential property for a duration under 30 days is prohibited within the village unless they have obtained the required permits issued by the Village. To keep up-to-date with the notices and listings regarding property rentals, please refer to the official government website of the Village at www.ellicottvillegov.com.

The Village has moved forward in agreement with the Town to provide Village representation at the Town Board meetings to open discussions and joint communication regarding the Police Department. In this effort to better assist within the local governments, both the Town and Village can better provide to the needs and safety of the Ellicottville community. Village Board Members Doug Bush and Jolie Newpher have been appointed to this position and will now attend the Town Board meetings.

New business was brought to the attention of the Board with some shared news regarding local businesses. The New York State Liquor Authority (SLA) deemed the loss of Fin-

nerty's Tap Room's liquor license. The restaurant is listed as permanently closed online. A new proposed business will be taking place at the previous Subway location at 38 Washington Street. The Green Room Sports Lounge will be a golf simulator space and bar as they await approval from the SLA for their liquor license - a promising addition for golf enthusiasts, sports fans, and anyone looking to add a new experience to their evening out.

The Village has announced the hiring of Ben Gross as their Assistant Civil Engineer. This hire was also made by the Town of Ellicottville and will work throughout the area to best fit the position at hand. He is welcomed by the local Ellicottville governments and congratulations have been made.

It was noted that during Fall Festival this year, monetary donations are being asked for the Summer Youth Program with collections being held at the new Mill Street parking lot. Please feel free to bring any amount cash donation to support this cause.

As conversations came to a close, the Village Board meeting was called to adjourn. The Village Board will reconvene on a differently scheduled date for their October meeting, which will be held on the 8th of that month at 6:00pm at the Village Hall.

ELLICOTTVILLE TOWN BOARD

Ellicottville Fire Department Presents Proposal to Expand Current District; Public Hearing Set for October 15th

Returning to the monthly scheduled meeting, the Town Board of Ellicottville gathered on September 18th at 6:00pm to effectively discuss the evening's agenda. With the most recent discussions surrounding the usual Town business, some new information was shared regarding the Ellicottville Fire Department and a proposal to expand their current district.

Ellicottville Fire Department Commissioner, Mike Timkey, was in attendance to share with the Town Board the current contract and protections in place and what would be proposed to expand those areas. Currently the Ellicottville Fire District includes a contract to serve the Town of Mansfield Fire Protection District, however, that is to be dissolved no later than December 31, 2024. Now, a suggested plan is being made to include the eastern half of the Mansfield District with the Ellicottville Fire District to alleviate financial burdens and increase the efficiency of fire protection resources.

The Town Board concluded that to best address the potential change in the existing Ellicottville Fire District, a public hearing will be held. This public hearing will take place at the Town of Mansfield Town Hall, at 7691 Toad Hollow Road, Little Valley, NY on October 15, 2024. During this meeting, all persons interested in expressing their interest or concerns on the Ellicottville Fire District extension into the Mansfield Fire Protection District will be heard and noted. Following the Public Hearing, both Towns will agree to a joint meeting to further arrange the next steps dependent on previous discussions. A vote will be made available to those in the proposed extended portion of the Town of Mansfield to determine the standing of the proposition.



Moving on to the Department reports of the evening, the Police Department started by commending one of the Town's officers who was able to make an arrest on a federal crime. This diligence was recognized and applauded as fine police work, insuring community safety. Sheriff Jim Bouchard brought to the Board's attention that this year police coverage for the Fall Festival will be a higher expense than previous years. A lack of available part-time officers will mean that full-time officers will need to cover the event, but agreeably a price cannot be put on the safety of Ellicottville residents and tourists. The Chamber of Commerce and Town agreed to the set terms of cost and split the expense each year. The Ellicottville Fall Festival draws in thousands of visitors each year creating an influx in all areas of the Town and Village. As the largest festival of the year, providing the necessary police presence and protection is one of the most important aspects to ensure a successful event. This year's Fall Festival will take place on October 12th-13th.


The Highway Department's Scot Brumagin updated the Town Board on the recent repairs and projects in place. The Holiday Valley Road project, which was completed by a hired contractor, was found to have been missing some expected details and the lack of completion did not hold to the Town's standards. The issues at hand have been documented and completed by the Town Highway Department, and the expenses of the unfinished work will be subtracted from the contractor's final payment to balance the budget of the project. The Cotter Road box culvert replacement has been finished and fully restored. The Highway Department wanted to express their appreciation to the County for all the help they provided on the project. The project came in as \$30,000 under budget, which Supervisor McAndrew noted was mostly due to the County providing assisted labor which they did not charge the Town for. This shared service is thanked and recognized by the Town of Ellicottville with plans to reciprocate as needed in the future.

A new appointment has been made within the Departments as the Town welcomes Ben Gross as the Assistant Civil Engineer as of September 23, 2023. Congratulations to a welcomed addition within the Town.

Some noteworthy discussions were that of the Short-Term Rental Law, which had a brief update involving application fees and a Public Hearing to be set for November. The EVGV Trail is planning a fundraising tailgate party at Villaggio; once the event is set details will be announced. The abandoned property at 6515 Donlen Drive, under the control of the lender, will now move forward to a foreclosure action.

As discussions came to be resolved, the Town Board meeting was called to adjourn with further conversations to be made next month on October 16, 2024. For additional information, visit the Town's official website at www.ellicottvillegov.com.



The walk will pass 45 of these trees ranging in size from .85" DBH, 8 ft tall to 9.4" DBH, 50 ft tall. The owner will share his experiences over the last year as well as his passion for Chestnut trees. Several experienced members of The American Chestnut Foundation are also expected to be in attendance (Jim has recently become a member), providing a broad base of experience for answering questions and discussing expectations.

The woodlot is 100 acres and the walk will be on 2 of the 3 stands on the property where you'll see other tree species to include Red Oak, Red Maple, Sugar Maple, Black Birch, and Beech. You may see signs of bear, fox, bobcat, deer, and turkey. Recently planted Chestnut seedlings in a cleared area will also be seen. The first stand is about 30 acres, last harvested about 25 years ago. The second stand is about 50 acres, high graded by the previous owner about 6 years ago. The elimination of the canopy on this stand resulted in full sun, allowing young Chestnuts to thrive.

The program will proceed rain or shine, unless there is a severe weather warning issued. Please dress for the weather. The elevation change is about 250 ft and the walk will be about 2 miles with a shorter one-mile option. Registration will take place from 9:00-9:30am. Location: 0 Indiana Ave, Olean, NY 14760. Park along the sides of the road or across from the gate in the grass.

Breakaway Classic Adventures: Early Deer Season

Early Archery Season is about to open in New York State on September 27, 2024 in the Northern Zone which includes the Adirondacks, and October 1, 2024 locally in the southern zone. The deer have just lost their velvet and the antlers from a good buck make for great décor!

There is a real advantage to learn to hunt with a bow and arrow as your deer hunting season starts well ahead of the November 16th regular hunting season when the deer are smart and hide during the day, so it seems every time I head out with my Winchester 30-30. At this time of year, the deer haven't yet been pressured and their education is just about to start.

I see so many deer on my 35-mile daily commute from Ellicottville to my shop in Houghton that I have to break at least once, if not twice or even three times, to avoid a collision. It seems that every year there are more deer roaming about and the hunting has little effect on these over-populated critters.

The odds of hitting a deer is in the 1-in-60 range so it's not 'if' but when every one of us will have the misfortune of crashing into one. The average cost of repairs from the impact with a deer is about \$4,000 and your insurance will do up around \$100+ per year as reported by the DEC. The only way to control the overabundance of deer is to hunt them as there are no natural predators other than human.

A quarter of all deer killed, about 280K deer in total, are accidentally by cars each year (70,000) while hunters harvested the other three quarters at 209,781 in the 2023-2024 season. A much grimmer statistic is that 238 people were killed in the US by deer collisions. All this adds up to rising costs and economic inflation that is devouring our hard-earned annual income so to do your part, go out and hunt!

To get your archery license in NY, you'll have to take a in-person bowhunter education course and possibly a hunter education course. This all-day course lasts a minimum of 6 hours. The next available locally offered course is at the Northern Chautauqua Conservation Club in Dunkirk, NY, Saturday, September 28, 2024 from 9:30am-5:30pm. At the time of writing there are 48 of 60 seats available.

A very good friend of mine, David Townsend, has successfully hunted deer all over New York State with his compound bow. Dave was kind enough to take the time to share some of his archery tips:

Technique: it's all about your grip (loose and relaxed) and not trying to hold the pin squarely on the bullseye. Let the pin float as you slowly squeeze the release and when it releases it should be a surprise. The object is to get that floating pin to waver in smaller and smaller circles as you aim.

Training and Practice: I start shooting in June pretty seriously, but only shoot a few arrows at a session. I start by spending an entire week of shooting with my eyes closed just to get the aiming and release procedure to be natural and relaxed. I will then periodically shoot a session with my eyes shut at close range. I acquire the target and get an appropriate pin on that spot, then close my eyes and go through the shot sequence. It is pretty amazing how tight the groups are.

Range and Distance: In terms of distance, I hardly ever shoot at a deer at more than 30 yards, but I routinely practice at 50 and 60 just to improve my consistency. It is also fun to shoot long distances so practice is not all work with no play.

Hunting Tips: My biggest archery tip is you can't beat a deer's sense of smell! Second is - don't over-hunt a stand. Establish several stand sites so you can rotate spots and properly play the wind.

Please remember that hunters are some the most conservation-minded individuals. The tax revenue from licenses and tags go to multiple non-profit organizations, including state management of public lands for everyone to enjoy.

After your deer has been harvested, it's time to consider what to do with it. Venison isn't for everyone but if cooked properly it is delicious and you'll wonder why you haven't tried it before. My dear but sadly departed friend, Mort Fadum, worked as a Colorado hunting



guide and knew something about preparing wild game so in his own words here is what he recommends. "Cookin' venison steak just one way. In a black iron skillet but a ¹/₄ inch of grease (bacon bein' best). When oil just starts to smoke, slap the deer to it. Cook 3 minutes, flip the steak... take the pan off the fire... Splash it with good hot sauce and eat... Keep her rare boys!"

Mort was also a very talented artist and poet publishing many of his art and poetry in several books. Here is his poem on preparing venison.


ABOUT COOKIN' VENISION A poem by M. Fadum

The proof is in the pudding so to speak as proven by Lew Wright and his son CJ from Belfast NY, with their nice archery buck pictured above. Archery is a life long skill and instead of spent ammo you can recover your arrows, how cool is that!
