Amanda Clute, founder of Foster Cattaraugus, a nonprofit organization that is dedicated to supporting foster care in Cattaraugus County, said the response to last year's prom was outstanding - so much so that this year's prom is extended by an hour due to feedback received last year. "We stopped at 10:00pm last year," said Clute, "and everyone was like, 'I wish it went longer,' so we decided to extend it to 11:00pm this year." Indeed, guests are in for a full night of fun, beginning with a cocktail hour with charcuterie board from 6:00-7:00pm. "Toad's Butcher Shop is sponsoring our meal and preparing that for us, and ZET's Italian Ice is doing our desserts," said Clute. "We have formal photography, so a lot of those things that we had last year that worked well are coming back.

Cocktail hour is the perfect time for photos and participating in the basket raffle. The event will also include two incredible door prizes that guests can enter to win! A \$20 gift card or a \$20 cash donation at the door provides an entry into the drawing for a pair of 1.00 carat diamond stud earrings (\$900 value) from ASK Design Jewelers or a 24 x 36" original painting "Aspens Poverty Hill, Ellicottville" by artist Sean Huntington (\$950 value). "We're asking for a \$20 donation or a \$20 gift card that we could use for kiddos that come into care; we use gift cards a lot, so that would be




Foster Cattaraugus has been supporting local foster families since spring of 2024. "A few of us work in the child welfare realm, and we noticed that as the number of children went up in care, the funds coming in from the state did not increase, unfortunately," Clute said. "There were a lot of gaps that didn't allow children to have normative experiences... We like to make sure kids have everything they need for sports or to go to camp, or maybe they need bunk beds when they come in. That's a lot of drain on the funding that we have for foster care, so we try to supplement what the county can't pay for kids in care so that they have the most traditional, normative experience in foster care that they can have. It takes off the burden of some of that for the foster parent who maybe doesn't have that upfront to put out for a kiddo."

The adult prom is Foster Cattaraugus' biggest fundraiser of the year, and tickets are still available. Order soon, as last year's event sold out! Tickets for this 21 and older event are \$40 (single) or \$60 (couple) and include dinner and dessert. A cash bar is available, and dinner (salad and pasta bar) will be served at 8:00pm. It wouldn't be prom without a theme, so consider wearing a mask for this year's masquerade theme! 
The Frank Pitillo Memorial Fund was created in 2022 by Nick Pitillo to honor his late brother, Frank "Frankie the Clam" Pitillo - a standout Ellicottville athlete and entrepreneur. Frank was a football captain at Ellicottville Central School (ECS) and the nation's top-ranked junior skier before his life was tragically cut short in a 1976 motorcycle accident. In his memory, the community raised funds, including hosting a spaghetti dinner with support from Buffalo Sabres and Bills players, to install the first stadium lights at ECS in 1977. This monumental effort enabled the community to enjoy its first night games and carry forward Frank's legacy of leadership and community spirit.

Decades later, with the original lights failing, Nick revived the effort to upgrade the system. The Frank Pitillo Memorial Lighting Fund set out to raise \$200,000 for new, energy-efficient lights, commemorative plaques, and maintenance - a goal reached in 2023 through golf tournaments, raffles, and other community events. The Frank Pitillo Memorial Scholarship Program was established shortly after, which annually awards scholarships to ECS seniors who exemplify Frank's qualities as scholar-athlete leaders and entrepreneurs.

"We've always believed that sports teach lessons that go far beyond the field," said Nick Pitillo. "Confidence, resilience, teamwork - those are values Frank lived by, and we want to make sure today's kids get to experience that same foundation."







The DRI transforms downtown neighborhoods and business districts into vibrant centers that offer a high quality of life and are magnets for redevelopment, business, job creation, and economic and housing diversity. The DRI is led by the Department of State, in close partnership with Empire State Development, NYS Homes and Community Renewal and New York State Energy Research and Development Authority.

The Village of Cattaraugus was nominated by the Western New York Regional Economic Development Council and selected by the State to receive a \$10 million award through the DRI program. The DRI investment will allow Cattaraugus to develop a Strategic Investment Plan and implement key catalytic projects that advance Cattaraugus's vision for revitalization of the Village. Projects selected for DRI funding will transform the community and support a vibrant local economy. Grants Up to \$35,000 Available Through Cattaraugus County

LITTLE VALLEY - Cattaraugus County Department of Economic Development, Planning and Tourism and the Cattaraugus County Economic Sustainability and Growth Corporation are excited to announce the launch of our recently awarded Microenterprise Assistance Program (MAP) awarded through a Community Development Block Grant from the New York State Office of Community Renewal.

This program provides grants of up to \$35,000 to eligible microenterprise businesses located in Cattaraugus County. A 10% equity contribution by the business is required. Funds from this grant can be used for fixed assets like machinery and equipment, furnishings and fixtures. Uses that enhance the long-term viability of the business such as the creation of a website or e-commerce system or purchase of a point-of-sale or CRM system are encouraged. Grant funds cannot be used for building improvements.

To qualify for the MAP grant, businesses must have five or fewer employees (including the owner) and be owned by a low-to-moderate income person or will have to, as the result of the grant, create at least one full-time equivalent job that is made available to low-to-moderate income persons. We encourage participation by start-up businesses and those that will fill a vacant storefront. All applicants should keep in mind that this is a reimbursement grant program for eligible expenses incurred after a fully approved MAP application and the completion of Entrepreneurship Training. A business plan is required to be submitted for both start-up and existing businesses. Cattaraugus County EDPT will be accepting applications from August 1, 2025 through October 31, 2025. on paper. She developed her own voice over time, creating her ripping technique and using 3-dimensional shapes to play with shadow and depth.

Despite personal challenges, Brawn's work communicates a sense of optimism that life "can be punctuated with pure kindnesses, simple pleasures, and inspiring beauty."

"If we can learn to integrate our lessons," Brawn says, "then maybe we will be able to find a beautiful wholeness."


