2021-2022 Re-Enrollment / Enrollment News

Re-Enrollment for 2021-2022 is Coming SOON!

- Existing student re-enrollment will begin in late January and continue through the end of February for the 2021-2022 school year. To take advantage of the EARLY re-enrollment fee of \$150 re-enrollment packets must be submitted online by Sunday, February 28th This will also secure your child's space for the upcoming school year! All re-enrollment packets submitted on or after March 1st will incur the 2021-2022 re-enrollment fee of \$250.
- Online applications for new students continue to be accepted for the 2021-2022 school year. If you have a child that does not currently attend GSCS, but is interested in attending GSCS for the upcoming school year, please submit their application no later than January 31, to be considered for enrollment prior to new applicants. For more information on how to apply online, go to the school website, select Admissions from the main menu and then click on How to Apply (or request information from Holly Finke at hfinke@goodshepherd.org).
- Screenings for new students entering grades Kindergarten through 8th grades will begin in early February based on available openings.

Dear Middle School Parents,

I hope you and your loved ones are safe and healthy during these unprecedented times. Good Shepherd may resume CYS athletic activities such as team tryouts & practices as of January 4, 2021. CYS regular season girls & boys basketball games will begin the last week of January, 2021.

Good Shepherd team tryouts for basketball will be held after school dismissal next week, January 12th through January 15th. We will need an accurate count of those students participating in order to take measures for teams and proper social distancing. All students planning to attend tryouts should sign up no later than January 11th by 8:00am. Students will sign up by sending an email to Reba Fritz at: rfritz@goodshepherd.org. Please include the student's name and grade level. Tryouts are free and no sports fees are due until after our teams has been selected.

After the team has been selected, all student athletes must register through the CYS web site. The CYS sports fees must be paid "in full" in order to complete your registration. No athletes will be allowed to attend team practices unless registration process is complete. The GSCS sports fee will remain the same as our last school year at \$100. per athlete. All sports fees are non-refundable regardless of reason, including those resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

The health and safety of all our athletes, staff, and volunteers remain the highest priority while following CDC, state, local and Diocesan guidelines. COVID-19 Parent Reference Guide

HEALTHY NO SYMPTOMS

Proceed to school



CLOSE CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WITH GOVER-18 NO SYMPTOMS

Close contact is defined as being within 8 feet of someone positive for COVID-19 for 15 minutes

Cannot go to school



 Stay home for 14 days since last contact with person positive for COVID-19

SYMPTOMATIC for COVID-19 NO DIAGNOSIS

(exhibiting at least one Covid-19 symptom)

The meet common symptome of COMD-19 include: a fever of 100 A or above, chills, body sches, headsohe, sore fitrost, congestion, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new cough and new loss of taste or smell.

Cannot go to school



- If confirmed positive for COVID-19, follow section
 Positive for Covid-19 (Asymptomatic or Symptomatic)
- If confirmed negative school when fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medicine. A medical doctor's note or negative test result is required to return to school.
- If confirmed diagnosis other than COVID-19 (e.g. stomach virus, ear infection, sinus infection) follow normal school illness policies to return to school. A medical doctor's note is required to return to school.

POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 (Asymptomatic or Symptomatic)

Cannot go to achool



ABYRPTOMATIC

 Stay home for 10 days since first positive COVID-19 test so long as symptoms do not develop. A medical doctor's note is required to return to school.

SYMPTOMATIC

 Bisy home for 10 days since first symptoms appeared, remain home until fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication AND symptoms have improved. A medical doctor's note is required to return to school.

NOTE: In the event a school has a positive case of COVID-19, staff members and parents of those individuals exposed will be notified as soon as possible. The school will consult with the Diocese of Orlando and the local health department for guidance and directives. The nature of the circumstance will determine if a school closure is necessary and the length of closure; each situation is unique and will be addressed accordingly.


