



In 1894 Barrhead became a burgh with its own officials and council to run its own affairs. Its first elections took place with William Shanks becoming the first Provost of the new burgh.



During the provostship of Zechariah John Heys, around 1899 gifted the land owned by him lying between his home in Bank Street and his property in Main Street.

The approval and planning for the municipal buildings took place on 11th March

1901 with architects McWhannell and Rogerson appointed to design the buildings, the contract to build the buildings was given to a local building firm Houston and Young and work started in 1902.



Opened on 15th April 1904, one part comprised of the Council Chambers, Burgh Treasurers Office with a short land running between this section to the Burgh Court Hall with an ornamental gate between.





In 1948 Barrhead gained its official coat of arms when Lord Lyon, King of Arms who supervised all matters of heraldry in Scotland granted the coat of arms.

A new chapter to a very colourful story...

In January 2019, Include Me 2 Club reached an agreement with East Renfrewshire Council to lease and occupy the one time Municipal Chambers, former Police Station and latterly the Work and Employability Centre for the council which moved to the Foundry upon its opening in January 2015.

Since the building has lay empty, being closed and almost forgotten about, with little activity from this once pinnacle site of activity some 116yrs prior.

The plan was to rejuvenate, renovate and re-open the famous landmark as the HQ of Include Me 2 Club, to bring together two of the buildings former uses and roles within the community, being used across the years as the local Disability Resource Centre and Work & Employment to the members of IM2C.

The mission was to create Social Blend, a forward facing social enterprise, with multi-offer approach of Coffee, Café, Books, Crafts, Arts and Community blended together to engage, inspire and empower the wider community, our members and supporters to make Barrhead a more inclusive community.

Inspired by the example set 116yrs before, rallying and bringing together the groups, resources and members of the community to create a new focal point, a meeting place and a hub of activity to reinvigorate the building back into daily life

We recorded every alteration, every demolition, every mystery and find of the project along the way, to document, record and display the amount of work, effort and attention we took to renovate, restore and re-establish this amazing building back to its former glory.

We hope you enjoy the look behind the scenes, and behind the walls, quite literally as you follow our journey across the year, enjoy and feel free to share you thoughts, comments and own experiences of the building on our media.

















































































































Virtue et Labore "By virtue and hard work"


