Abstract: The Qatar International Court and Dispute Resolution Centre (QICDRC), in cooperation with SOAS University of London, delivered an interactive webinar session on alternative dispute resolution (ADR) in Islamic and Middle Eastern law Thursday 8th of April 2021.

Moderated by Dr. Jonathan Ercanbrack, Chair of the Centre of Islamic and Middle Eastern Law and Senior Lecturer in Transnational Financial Law at SOAS, the webinar introduced legal professionals in Qatar and beyond to practical insights on the arbitration practice in Qatar and Turkey, offering an in-depth look into the latest arbitration trends and controversies in the region. The session included a lively Q&A and general discussion from attendees, who joined virtually from across the world.

Distinguished speakers included Dr. Zain Al Abdin Sharar, Senior Legal Counsel at QICDRC's CEO Office, who discussed the challenges and opportunities of arbitration in Qatar. Dr. Amel Makhlouf, MCIArb, Lecturer in Law and Research Associate at SOAS, spoke about the use of alternative dispute resolution in Islamic law; while Att Turgut Aycan Özcan, Head of International Arbitration Practice at LEXIST Law Firm, Istanbul, tackled arbitration practice in Turkey as a bridge between Asia and Europe.
