

EXHIBITORS REGULATIONS

PARKING

Gate 5 Entry refer to Steward of each Section for Parking Allocation.

LIVESTOCK GATE ENTRY

- Day Exhibitors in Horse Events must enter via Gate 4, bottom Wingewarra Street Gate.
- 2. Horse Competitors with Camping/Stabling to enter via Gate 1, Fitzroy Street gate, near Railway Line.
- Sheep, Pigs, Yard Dogs, Woodchop and Shearing Competitors must enter by Gate 5 TOP GATE, Wingewarra Street, and traverse alongside the back fence. Before 9.30am each morning of the Show.
- 4. Exhibitors with cattle must enter via Gate 5. Top Wingewarra Street Gate.
- 5. Kennel Club Show Dog Exhibitors must enter via Gate 5, Top Wingewarra Street Gate.

DISPLAY SPACE, EXHIBITION, PAVILION, GROUND, COMMERCIAL SPACE

- Ground and Pavilion Space shall be made available at the discretion of the Committee of the Society, to any person, Firm, Agent, or Representative for the display of Machinery, Motor Vehicles and General Display Purposes.
- Applications for space will be made in writing, stating the size of allotment required and the purpose for which it shall be used.
- 3. EHIBITORS WILL BE ISSUED WITH 2 X THREE DAY PASSES AND 4 X ONE DAY PASSES. ADDITIONAL PASSES MUST BE PURCHASED AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION FOR SPACE, FOR A FEE OF \$13 PER ONE DAY PASS.
- 4. All Commercial Exhibitors are to be erected and operational by 10am on Friday the first day of the Shaw and not to be dismantled before 4pm Sunday of the Show.
- 5. The Demonstration of any power tools and the use of public address equipment in any of the pavilions is prohibited.
- No TV Aerials or other structures may be erected on the Pavilion Roof, such structures must be erected outside the Pavilion.
- All Chainsaws or other noisy power tools etc. must be fitted with silencers and operation is limited to the first five minutes of every hour.
- 8. AUCTION SELLING WILL NOT BE PERMITTED ON THE GROUNDS DURING THE SHOW, OR THE SELLING OF RAFFLE TICKETS.
- 9. No Site is Guaranteed.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. The name, residence and district of the exhibitor, the class of animal intended for exhibit, the pedigree of stud stock, the name of the breeder, so far as known, and of sheep the date of lambing, must be given to the Secretary with entry, If any doubt arises as to correctness of the declaration of any exhibitor, such exhibitor shall not be entitled to any prizes which may be award3ed to him or her until the Committee have satisfactory proof that the declaration is correct, and any exhibitor having made a false declaration shall be subject to all or any of the following penalties: Forfeiture of prize, non-permission to exhibit again, and expulsion for the Society.
- The competing exhibits must be delivered in the Show ground at or before the advertised hour and shall be classed and distinguished by the Exhibitors Entry Card affixed to each entry before they are placed on the Showground.
- 3. All exhibits, on the day of the show must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor, and shall, during the show, be under the control of the Stewards who shall have the power to expel from the Show Ground any person, in their opinion, interfering unnecessarily therewith. In the event of an exhibitor disposing of an exhibit between the day of entry and the day of exhibition, notice in writing of the sale, together with the name and address of the purchaser, must be forwarded to the Secretary of the Society. All cows not unmistakably in calf must be certified to have bred within two years.
- All Fine Arts, Handicrafts, Photography, Cookery, Agricultural, Fruits, Flowers and Vegetable entries must be the work of or grown by the Exhibitor.
- Exhibitors in Fine Arts Section to place in a conspicuous position on each package or picture the Exhibitors Entry Card.
- 6. Exhibitors, please note special conditions at the beginning of each section.
- In the event of there being, only one exhibit in any class, the awarding of 1st place will be left to the discretion of the judge.
- It shall be an instruction to Judges in all sections that if, in their opinion, any exhibit or exhibitor should be
 disqualified for any reason whatsoever, they shall pass them without comment, but may report the matter to the Chief
 Steward of the Section.
- 9. Protest against an award must be lodged in writing with the stewards of the section, or at the Secretary's Office within half an hour of the award being made in all livestock sections, or before 5pm on the first day of the show in all pavilion exhibits. The protest must be accompanied by a fee of \$50 to be forfeited if the protest is deemed by the stewards to be frivolous.
- 10. No person other than officials or Press representatives to be allowed in the ring with the judges during competition.
- 11. Damage through exhibits- the Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibit or to any person taking part or in any way connected with any race, contest, exhibition of performance, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor or other such person afore said shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings from such accident.

- Damage to Exhibits- The Society will not, in any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss or mis delivery
 of livestock, or other exhibit at the Society Exhibition, or any damage thereto.
- 13. Loss by Disease- The signing of the Certificate of Entry of any animal shall be taken as a guarantee that the animal specified is free from all disease, so far as is known to the owner. In case of infectious disease being spread through or by any exhibit, the exhibitor shall be held responsible.
- 14. THE COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT OF REFUSING OR CANCELLING ANY ENTRY, WITHOUT GIVING REASONS BY DOING SO. THE DECISION OF THE COMMITTEE ON ALL POINTS SHALL BE FINAL AND NO CORRESPONDENCE WILL BE ENTERED INTO.
- 15. The Committee reserves the right of adjudication on any questionable entry or other point not provided for in the Rules and/or Regulations of the Society, and of making any alterations that may be deemed necessary.
- 16. The Committee reserves the right to at any time postpone the Exhibition, or any event thereof, in consequence of the inclemency of weather, or other sufficient cause to a date or dates deemed suitable by the Committee, and No Entrance Fees shall be returnable in the event of such postponement. The reasonableness of the cause or causes for postponement shall be decided by the Committee, and its judgement shall be conclusive, and not open to question by an exhibitor or other persons affected by such postponement.
- 17. The Committee may abandon the Exhibition or any event there of through wet weather, or by any reason which my make such course advisable. Should the exhibition or any event be abandoned or cancelled, exhibitors shall be entitled to the return of the entry fee paid, but cause of action, liability or obligation shall be maintained or incurred by the Committee, or by the Society by reason of such abandonment or cancellation.
- 18. Notwithstanding the dates fixed for the departure of the several exhibits, the Secretary reserves the right to retain all or any of them for such further time as the Committee may consider necessary, and no exhibit without a formal permit from the Chief Steward of the Section or Secretary shall be removed from the Exhibition.
- 19. The attention of Exhibitors is specially drawn to the foregoing Regulations. Any disregard of the same will render the Exhibitor liable to be disqualified.
- 20. PRIZE WINNERS PLEASE NOTE: Prize money will be paid except Section A from the Show Office between the hours of 3pm to 5pm Friday of the show 11am to 1pm and 2pm to 5pm on Saturday of the Show and 11am to 1pm and 2.30pm to 4pm on the Sunday of the Show. Prize money will be paid according to the awards made by the Judges Book, duly signed by the judge, ALL prize monies must be collected by 30th June or will be forfeited.
- 21. Holders of member's tickets have free admission to the Ground for 1 Member & 1 Guest & 2 Children.
- 22. All Perpetual Trophies will be retained by the Society after presentation.
- Competitors not complying with horse stall allocations and regulations will not be eligible to compete in any horse
 events.
- 24. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT, RELEASE, AND INDEMNITY: Each exhibitor in consideration of the Society accepting one or more of the exhibitor's entries:
 - a) Acknowledges and agrees that the exhibitor participates in any competition or event conducted during the show wholly and solely at the Exhibitor's own risk of injury to his person or property.
 - b) Releases the Society and its servants and agents at the time of participation, from and against any and all liability for personal injury or damage to the Exhibitors property which the exhibitor may receive, sustain or incur directly or indirectly as a result of the negligence or alleged negligence of the Society and its servants or agents aforesaid resulting from or arising out of any accident or happening whilst the Exhibitor is on the Society's Show Ground or elsewhere under the control of the Society its servants or agents whether or not such accident or happening occurred whilst the Exhibitor for himself, his executors administrators and any person claiming through or under him indemnifies and holds the Society, its servants and agents aforesaid indemnified from and against all claims, demands, suits, actions, damage cost and expenses which the Exhibitor or any person engaged by the Exhibitor might be entitled to make or bring against or which may become payable by the Society by reason of or arising from or out of directly or indirectly any such accident or happening or by reason of any act or omission on the part or any such person engaged by him found in any action against the Society to be negligent shall be deemed to be negligence for the purpose of any claim under the aforesaid indemnity.
- 25. Exhibitors enter at their own risk.
- 26. Exhibitors must uphold the Dubbo Show Society Inc. OHS Policy.
- 27. MOTORISED SCOOTER are not permitted on the Show Ground. Note this is not a law created by ENSW, but by Transport for NSW. More information regarding the law on this matter can be found here: E-scooters Staying safe NSW Centre for Road Safety. Mobility scooters designed for the mobility impaired are allowed.
- 28. PLEASE do not bring your pet dogs to the show. They are strictly prohibited, and you will be denied access to the grounds. The ONLY dogs allowed on the grounds are registered assistance and/or guide dogs plus those competing in events within the dog arena. All dogs on the grounds MUST have an approved bio security health declaration. Owners who bring dogs
- 29. Exhibitors must comply with all applicable WORKING WITH CHILDREN LEGISLATION. The exhibitor agrees to produce on demand, at least 1 month before competition, evidence of working with children checks for themselves, their employees or volunteers who are involved in a child-related role or have direct unsupervised contact with children
 - MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR will be awarded on a point score basis: 1st- 3 points, 2nd- 2 points, 3rd- 1 point. GRAND CHAMPION- 3 points, CHAMPION- 2 points, RESERVE CHAMPION- 1 point.

- 1. **COMPETITORS** Enter at their own risk.
- 2. FARRIER ON DUTY: Rodney McCauley Ph 0429 885 215
- 3. DRUG TESTING MAY BE CARRIED OUT AT THE SHOW
- 4. HELMETS: Every rider is encouraged to wear a safety helmet compliant with the current Australian Standard. Riders under 18yrs must wear such a helmet.
- 5. ALL RIDERS MUST BE DISMOUNTED WHEN CROSSING THE ROAD TO THE CENTER ARENA
- 6. ALL COMPETITION AT THIS SHOW is governed by these regulations & by the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Rules for Discipline in Horse Sections at Shows which can be viewed at www.agshowsnsw.org.au. Should it be necessary for the ASC Disciplinary Committee to open an inquiry into any aspect of competition in this Horse Section, Dubbo Show Society will support any penalty imposed by that Committee because of the inquiry & will support penalties resulting from enquiries arising from Horse Sections at other NSW Shows.
- 7. INDEMNITY & WAIVER FORMS: The Horse Committee will take all care in managing the section, but competitors taking part in this Horse Section do so at their own risk. Each Adult competitor must, before competing, complete & sign a form indemnifying the Dubbo Show Society & waiving any claims against the Society for any injury sustained in competition or for loss or damage to the competitor's property or damage caused by the competitor or his/her animal(s) at the Show. A similar form must also be completed & signed by a parent or guardian for each competitor who is under 18yrs of age. ALSO, on each Waiver, each horse with which the competitor is involved in competition at the Show must be listed together with the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the horse came to the Show.
- 8. WORKING WITH CHILDREN: Exhibitors must comply with all Working with Children legislation (see Exhibitors Regulations for details).

- REFUSAL OF ENTRY/ALTERATION OF SCHEDULE: The Committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without assigning any reason for doing so & to alter the schedule to meet emerging circumstances.
- APPROACHING JUDGES: No exhibitor or associate will initiate conversation with a judge on judging day, before or after judging except through the Ringmaster or Chief Steward.
- 11. **PROHIBITED RELATIONSHIP:** No Competitor will present for judging before a judge with whom he/she has a family relationship, has or has recently had a personal relationship or has had horse related business.
- 12. JUDGES DECISION/DISCRETION: The judge is empowered to withhold any or all prizes in any class where the exhibits are, in his/her opinion, unworthy of the prize, & always the judge's decision will be final. A judge has the discretion to ask that a led or performance exhibit & handler/ rider/ driver be ordered to leave the ring if he/ she considers the animal is unruly & /or likely to cause an accident.
- **13. ADMISSION TO RING:** Through Marshalling Yard only. Before admission to ring, ALL competitors must obtain & produce Entry Card which will be issued only on payment of Entry Fee.
- **14. LATENESS TO THE RING:** Competitors must be ready when called. Once Judging has commenced, a competing horse shall not be led, ridden or driven into or out of the judging ring without the permission of the judge &/or the Ringmaster or Chief Steward.
- **15. LEAVING THE RING:** If a led horse should drag or escape its handler or a ridden or driven horse take control of or unseat its rider & leave the ring, it is usually disqualified from class.
- 16. Class will not be delayed for competitors competing in another Ring. Competitors not complying with horse stall allocations & regulations will not be eligible to compete in any horse event.
- 17. REGISTRATION PAPERS where applicable for Breed Classes must be presented to Stewards on entering the ring. Each exhibitor must provide membership certificate, registration number & the name of the registered owner & current membership number.
- 18. No dogs allowed in Ring.
- 19. DISTRICT/ LOCAL CLASSES: Horses &/or riders must have been resident for at least three months prior to the show within 50kms radius of the Showground.
- 20. ATTIRE: Competitors must be appropriately attired for the competition in which they are competing.

CAMPING FEE: \$75.00 for Show

DISTRICT/ LOCAL CLASSES: Horses and/or riders must have been resident for at least three months prior to the show within 50 kilometer radius of the Showground.

ATTIRE: Competitors must be appropriately attired for the competition in which they are competing.

HORSE STALLS: Allocation to the various Sections will be made at the discretion of the Horse Committee upon application in writing on the appropriate form and accompanied by appropriate fee.

Preference will be given to visitors travelling long distances.

Application for stabling will close 2 Weeks prior to Show. Covered Stalls (bedding supplied) **\$80.00 (GST inclusive)** for week of Show, if available.

NO MONEY - NO STALLS

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- HORSE MEASURING: No official measuring will take place at the show, but, if a question about height arises, proof of height may be required. In the absence of proof, a decision will be at the absolute discretion of the Ring Master or Chief Steward.
- NOVICE HACK, GALLOWAY, PONY: A horse which has not won a first prize at any Agricultural Show, Royal Show, Hack Council or EFA show. A Statutory declaration to this effect may be required. This rule also applies to Show Hunters.
- 3. INTERMEDIATE HACKS, GALLOWAY, OR PONY: A horse which has not won either first, second or third at a Royal Show, Hack Council or EFA show. This rule also applies to Show Hunters
- 4. SHOW HUNTERS: Show Hunters are NOT eligible to compete in either the Novice, Open or Adults or Childs Hack classes, Ridden Hack, Galloway, or Pony Classes in the open ring. Show Hunters should compete in a bridle with plain browband & riders are to be dressed in Hunter attire.
- **5. RIDDEN HACK, GALLOWAY, PONY:** Horses in these classes are NOT eligible to compete in either the Novice, Open Show Hunter, or Adults/Childs Show Hunter classes & Show Hunter Classes. Riders to be dressed in the appropriate attire for these classes.
- **6. SUPREME CHAMPION HACK:** Horses eligible to compete in this class are: Champion Hack n/e 16hh, Champion Hack over 16hh, Champion Galloway Hack, Champion Pony Hack n/e 12.2hh & Champion Pony Hack over 12hh n/e 14hh from Round 1 only.
- ROUNDS: Any horse that has won either 1st, Champion or Reserve Champion in Round 1 is NOT eligible to compete in Round 2.
- 8. GRAND PARADE: Only horses that have competed in the Supreme Champion Hack will be required for the Grand Parade. The announcement of Supreme Champion Hack will take place during the Grand Parade. If an eligible competitor does not present for the Grand Parade, they will forfeit their chance to be awarded the Supreme Champion Hack.
- 9. PRIZEMONEY: If there are three or more competitors in a class, prizemoney will be awarded to 1st & 2nd. If there is two competitors in a class, 1st prizemoney only will be awarded. If there is only one competitor in a class, no prizemoney will be awarded.
- **10.** Prizemoney to be collected from the horse ring office.
- 11. STALLIONS: Are to be under the control of an adult at all times & must wear an appropriate bit so as they are always under effective control. Unruly behavior by a stallion will cause that stallion to be removed from the ring. Stallions are not permitted to compete in any Hack classes unless otherwise stated in the program. Stallions tied to the outside of a truck or trailer MUST be always supervised. Stallions may be substituted in prize-giving ceremonies with another horse should the rider deem it safer.
- 12. Riders & handlers of stallions at the show MUST be over the age of 17yrs: however, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian or owner/riders to ensure that all possible safety precautions are taken & they understand the full code of conduct for stallions at events.
- 13. ALL STALLIONS MUST BE DOUBLE TIED BY NECK STRAP & HALTER ON ALL GROUNDS.
- **14. PONIES:** May be ridden by an adult except in classes specified otherwise.
- **15. CONSOLATION HACK:** Competitors are eligible for this class if they have not won a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd at Dubbo Show for the year of competition.
- **16. TROPHIES:** All perpetual trophies will be retained by Dubbo Show Society. The winners name shall be engraved on the trophy by the Society.
- 17. PROTESTS: A protest or complaint against any exhibit or exhibitor may be lodged verbally with the Ringmaster or Chief Steward no later than ten minutes after the judging of the exhibit or exhibitor. The Ringmaster or Chief Steward must be provided with the exact nature of the complaint & act, if necessary, to maintain competitive fairness. The Ringmaster or Chief Steward may choose to refer the matter to the Protests Committee, which shall comprise the President of the Show Society, or a Vice President & Two other members of the general committee. A protest or complaint or an appeal against the decision of the Ringmaster or Chief Steward may be lodged in writing with the Secretary no later than 10pm on the day of Judging. Such protest, complaint or appeal shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which shall be forfeited if the protest, complaint, or appeal proves to be frivolous or vexatious. A matter lodged this way shall be dealt with by the Protests Committee

- within 24hrs of Lodgment & the decision of the protest Committee is final. NB: No protest or complaint will be considered if it refers simply to a judge's decision.
- 18. LOCAL CLASSES: Are restricted to horses & riders living within a 50km radius from Dubbo Post Office. A local horse must be owned by the competitor three months prior to competition & have resided within the 50km radius during that time.
- 19. BLINDNESS: Any horse blind of an eye is only eligible to compete in led classes.
- 20. DRUGS: It is forbidden to administer any stimulant or depressant to a horse, or to cause one to be administered in any way whatsoever, whether before the start or during competition. If it is found that a competitor has administered drugs the Society may take temporary possession of the exhibit for drug testing purposes. Connections of the exhibit may be liable to the maximum penalties afforded to this act. DRUG TESTING MAY BE CARRIED OUT
- **21. NOMINATIONS:** The Society reserves the right to refuse any nomination.
- 22. RINGS: No horse shall compete in hack classes wearing rings.
- JUDGING RINGS: No persons other than judges & stewards will be allowed in a ring whilst competition is taking place
- 24. CONDUCT: All competitors are to enter & leave their respective rings in a dignified manner. Any person whose conduct toward another person is found to be objectionable may be asked to leave the Showground & may be subject to future disqualification & banned from other Show Societies. Likewise, the Committee reserves the right to ask a competitor to leave a judging ring if it is in their opinion a competitor is behaving in an unsuitable manner.
- **25. CRUELTY:** The Committee will not tolerate any form of cruelty or abuse to any stock on the grounds. The Committee reserves the right to expel any person/s from the grounds if, in their opinion, an act of cruelty or unnecessary abuse has been inflicted on any stock. Likewise, the Committee reserves the right to disallow any stock which, in their opinion is of poor condition or health to compete.
- **26. PROGRAM:** The Committee reserves the right to change, add, combine, or delete any classes without notice.
- 27. RIDERS: Under the age of 18yrs must wear properly fitted helmets (including a chin strap) that complies with the Industry & Sports standard & are less than 5yrs old from date of manufacture whilst mounted. These helmets must comply with Australian Safety Standards.
- **28. FOOTWEAR:** All competitors must wear appropriate footwear whilst mounted or leading a horse. Whilst riding the footwear must enable removal of the foot from the stirrup iron. It must also prevent the foot sliding forward & through the stirrup iron. Open toe sandals or thongs are not permitted either whilst mounted or leading a horse.



- 2. Fireworks Saturday 8pm.
- TIME OF ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE: All cattle in Breed Classes & LED Steer Competition must be at Dubbo Showground by 7am Saturday 20TH May.
- 4. LED Stud Cattle & Steers are to remain on the showground until 12pm Sunday 21st May.
- Heifers in Heifer Show & Junior Competitors must be at the showground by 8am Friday 19th May & must remain until 12pm Sunday 21st May.
- 6. Prize money is available to collect from Secretary's Office from 12pm Sunday 21st May.
- 7. No access to the cattle shed before 12pm Thursday 18th May.
- WORKING WITH CHILDREN Exhibitors must comply with all Working with Children Legislation (see EXHIBITORS Regulations for details).

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- PESTIVIRUS Lab test results must be provided for each animal that is entered at the Dubbo Show Beef Cattle
 section including calves at foot. Results are to be provided with entries otherwise they will NOT BE ACCEPTED.
 Pesti Virus lab results must highlight the identification of the animal.
- AGE REQUIREMENTS No children under 18 years of age will be permitted to lead a bull any age in Paraders Competitions.
- 3. AGE & DATE OF BIRTH The age of cattle & competitors will be taken as at the first day of the show (Friday 19th May 2023) & will be determined by years instead of teeth. Birth dates & class numbers MUST be completed on entry forms.
- 4. BEDDING & STALLS Bedding is provided by the Society for each exhibit. Stalls will be allocated by the Society to each exhibitor. These allocations are to be strictly adhered to unless the chief steward states otherwise. Additional bedding for topping up stalls will be available to those exhibitors remaining on showground for the duration of the show.
- 5. BREEDERS GROUP ENTRY REQUIREMENTS All Exhibits in the breeder's group must be BRED & OWNED by the exhibitor & drawn from competitive classes. The group must consist of three animals, (with the exception of calves at foot) The Group must have each gender represented i.e. two bulls & one female, or vice versa.
- 6. SIRE'S PROGENY CLASS ENTRY REQUIREMENTS Exhibits in the sire's progeny group are to be drawn from the competitive classes. The group must consist of three animals, (except for calves at foot) with both sexes to be represented. The Name of sire is to be stated on Entry Form. All Exhibits in the class "MUST BE OWNED BY THE EXHIBITOR".
- 7. CALVES AT FOOT Calves must be under 9 months of age & still sucking of the mother. Calves must be stalled with its mother & although tethered, must always have unrestricted access to her. Additional space for Calves MUST be nominated on the Entry Forms. Calves must be entire (i.e. no steers). Calves do not have to be registered if only being shown at mothers' side but MUST be FULLY ELIGIBLE for registration. Calves do not need to be tattooed if only being shown at mothers' side. All calves at foot to be natural born calves, not an ET Calf.
- 8. BREED CLASSES Each breed must have at least two exhibitors within any breed. If there are not more than ten individual exhibits of any breed, they will then be included into ANY OTHER BREED class.
- CLEANING OF STALLS Each exhibitor is responsible for the removal of all manure from the stall in which their exhibit/s are stalled. All stalls to be cleaned out by 7am each morning. Waste is to be placed in the designated area.
- 10. CAMPING Unauthorised Campers will not be permitted & will be requested to vacate the showground.
- 11. DOGS No dogs are permitted within or near the cattle shed or judging lawns.
- 12. ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT All exhibitors electrical equipment must have an in-line circuit breaker, & all power leads must have a current certificate from a registered electrician, as required by law. These will be randomly checked by the Dubbo Show Society Safety Officer.
- 13. GRAND PARADE The Grand Parade is on Saturday at 2.30pm. ALL BROAD RIBBON WINNERS MUST PARADE TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR COLLECTION OF PRIZE MONEY. Any animal, whether a ribbon winner or not, may parade. NO HANDLER UNDER 12 YEARS OF AGE IS PERMITTED TO LEAD IN THE GRAND PARADE except for calves at foot if accompanied by an adult. Adequate halter restraints must be used. Exception due to safety is at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- 14. STUD EXHIBITOR PASS: A Stud Exhibitor Pass consisting of three (3) x 3-day passes must be purchased for \$50 at the time of submission of entries. These passes will not be available at any other time, Additional One Day \$13 passes may be pre purchased at time of submission of entries if wished. Passes are available for collection prior to the show.
- 15. HEALTH REGULATIONS Any animal infected by ringworm or warts will be deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the show. The Society will report any animal they believe to be infected by ringworm or warts to

- the Society's Veterinarian who will inspect such animals for the purpose of determining whether the animal is so infected. Completed Health Declarations & PIC numbers <u>MUST</u> accompany entry forms.
- 16. JOHNE'S DISEASE Except where the Society may determine otherwise, no cattle may be exhibited unless from a herd, stud or property for which a Johne's Disease Health Declaration has been submitted to the Cattle Section by the closing date of entries. Completed Johne's Declaration MUST accompany entry forms. JBAS Score 6 & above
- 17. JUDGING The Society may change the judge for any class, at any time, if it deems fit. No exhibit shall receive an award, if in the opinion of the judge, it is unworthy of such award. The decision of the Judge as to the merits of the exhibit & the competitor, shall be final & binding.
- 18. MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR will be awarded on a point score basis: 1st 3points; 2nd 2points; 3rd 1 point; Grand Champion 3 points; Champion 2 points; Reserve Champion 1 point. Breeds of less than twenty exhibits will receive "Most Successful Exhibitor Award".
- 19. PREPARATION OF EXHIBITS The use of powered cattle washers is prohibited. Grooming/clipping chutes are allowed but can only be put in the designated area.
- 20. RECOGNISED BREED SOCIETY All exhibits in the stud classes must have been fully accepted for registration by a RECOGNISED CATTLE BREED SOCIETY, & proof of this registration & ownership must accompany the entry form. An entire copy of the registration certificate MUST be provided for each exhibit, accompanying Entry Forms.
- 21. RIBBONS & PRIZEMONEY In a single class, a ribbon or other evidence of a previous award shall not be worn or displayed in the ring. Ribbons may be awarded throughout the cattle section in accordance with the following 5 exhibits & under up to 3 ribbons; 6 to 10 exhibits 4 ribbons; 11 to 15 exhibits 5 ribbons.
- 22. Prize money & or product will be awarded as follows Champion \$40; Reserve Champion \$20 & or equivalent. Where insufficient numbers, classes may be combined to become Junior/Senior classes. Trophies will not be presented in any breed unless there is competition within that breed (i.e.: more than one exhibitor).
- 23. SECURITY OF ANIMALS All bulls over 6 months & under 12 months must have a nose clip or be rung through the nose with ALL bulls 12 months & over to be rung with it being always used while being led. All female exhibits over 6 months must have a nose clip or ring. All exhibits must be provided with effective halters & are to be thoroughly broken to lead. All exhibitors must provide neck straps or neck collars for their cattle & they are to be always used when the cattle are stalled. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to tend to their cattle & make sure they do not get tangled.
- 24. STALLS There is to be minimal to no gear placed at the cattle stalls except for a rake stand & wheelbarrow to maintain the width of the aisle. Large quantities of feed & excess gear should be left in vehicles & only be brought out at feeding time or when needed. Any equipment left at the cattle stalls is left there at the owner's risk. Each exhibitor is permitted to display signage in the cattle sheds. Curtains & animal name cards are encouraged to make the stall area look nicer.
- 25. TIME OF ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE All cattle in breed classes & led steer competition must be at Dubbo showground Friday 19th May. Led stud cattle & steers are to remain on the showground until 12pm Sunday 21st May. Heifers in Heifer show & junior competitors must be at the showground by 8am Friday 19th May & cannot leave until the completion of presentations on Sunday 21st May. Cattle can commence arriving to the Dubbo showgrounds Thursday prior to the show at 12 noon.
- 26. LATE ENTRIES Late entries will be accepted, late entries close: 5pm Friday 5th May.
- 27. SUBSTITUTION Substitutions are not classified as a late entry. Substitution fee \$10 per substitution. Substitutions need to be from the same class i.e., age.
- 28. TROPHY & BROAD RIBBON CLASSES Grand champion male & female from each breed are to compete in the interbreed judging where all cattle judges from the day all decide on one champion male & one champion female who then go on to compete against each other for the interbreed supreme exhibit of the 2022 Dubbo show. Each winning breeders' group from each breed shall also compete in the interbreed judging for the interbreed champion breeders' group. There is to be NO substitution of animals for all classes
- 29. CONDUCT: All competitors are to enter & leave their respective rings in a dignified manner. Any person whose conduct toward another person is found to be objectionable may be asked to leave the Showground & may be subject to future disqualification & banned from other Show Societies. Likewise, the Committee reserves the right to ask a competitor to leave a judging ring if it is in their opinion a competitor is behaving in an unsuitable manner.
- **30.** The Committee reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry, without giving reasons by doing so. The decision of the Committee on all points shall be final & no correspondence will be entered into.
- **31.** The Committee reserves the right of adjudicating on any questionable entry or other point not provided for in the Rules &/or Regulations of the Society, & of making any alterations that may be deemed necessary.

Stud Pass: \$55.00 will purchase a Stud Exhibitor Pass consisting of passes for three people for the duration of the show. **This Stud Pass can only be purchased at the time of submission of entries & will not be available at any other time.** Additional \$13.00 one day passes may be pre-purchased at time of submission of entries if wished, or \$16.00 at the gate.

GATE/ VEHICLE PASS, & RECEIPT will be available on Thursday before the show at the sheep office. (Office hours 10am - 7pm)

WRISTBANDS will be placed on each person holding a three-day pass when admission ticket is presented on first entering the Showground. Wristbands are to be worn at all times.

Only one wristband will be issued per three-day ticket & it is your responsibility to look after the band for the three days of the Show. If wristband is broken, it will be replaced at the Show Office on presentation of damaged band. If band is lost, purchase of another ticket will be needed before re-entry to the Showground. **STUDENT PASSES:** The Show Society is offering a special rate for all school students to attend the Show & that is \$13 for a 3-day pass. This rate is at a very reduced price & the Committee felt it was a fair & equitable rate for school students to afford.

One vehicle per exhibitor, entry via Gate 5. All Exhibitors are required to remove their vehicle immediately once sheep have been unloaded. Chief Steward will advise designated parking area. No vehicle entry after 8.30am.

On SUNDAY VEHICLES MUST REMAIN IN THE PARKING AREA until advised by the Traffic Controller that they may be brought to the loading area for departure. (Vehicles must not be brought to the shed for departure until a time advised, based on the distance to be travelled).

Sheep may arrive on THURSDAY between the hours of 9am & 9pm ONLY.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

These conditions apply to Sections E, F, F (1) & F (2) unless otherwise stated in the breed section. HEALTH & SAFETY

- 1 COMPETITORS ENTER AT OWN RISK.
- 2 Working With Children- Exhibitors must comply with all working with Children legislation. (see Exhibitors Regulations for details)
- 3 Entry, National Sheep Health Statement, National Vendor Declaration, Indemnity & Waiver Forms must be fully completed, signed by the Exhibitor &, with the fees, form part of the Entry Form.
- 4 No stock shall be unloaded without completed Declaration. Exhibitors showing infected sheep may be liable to a fine of \$10,000.00 as per Government regulations.
- 5 Sheep will be penned in accordance with OJD MAP regulations. A copy of the Certificate of Compliance will be available from the Sheep Show Office.
- 6 Sheep must be from a Flock not infected or suspected of being infected with OJD.
- 7 EXHIBITORS WHO REQUIRE SEGREGATION IN PENNING AREA, BOARDS WILL BE AVAILABLE.
- 8 Entries are limited to flocks which are registered in a recognized flock book with a Breed Society or Association & must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor (see separate Merino condition of entry).
- All entries must be from an accredited brucellosis free flock.
- 10 Ewes in the last trimester of pregnancy should not be brought to the show.
- 11 All Entries must be tagged with PIC tags according to NLIS regulations. All Entries must have individual identification Tag number & all other NLIS regulations adhered to.
- 12 Trucks should be thoroughly cleaned & washed prior to loading sheep for the Show.
- 13 FEED & WATER CONTAINERS should be supplied by the Exhibitor & must be at least 30cm above the ground. Limited numbers of feed & water containers may be hired through the Sheep Show Office. Any hired containers should be returned to the stockpile prior to the conclusion of the Show.
- 14 **CLEANING:** Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning of pens, & lanes outside pens. Lanes to be swept by exhibitor at least each morning.
- 15 **STUD SIGNS** are to be limited to a single sign per exhibitor with dimensions no greater than 2 metres x 0.5 metres.
- 16 **INSPECTION OF SHEEP:** Sheep will be inspected prior to judging by an appointed panel of inspectors. Before any inspection takes place the Chief Steward & the Breed Steward are to be consulted.
- 17 The Chief Steward shall be the final arbitrator in the event of any dispute arising following inspection of sheep. All exhibitors have the right to appeal the chief's steward's determination if the Exhibitor does not accept the determination, the Show Society's Veterinary Officer is engaged to assess the sheep. the Veterinarian decision is final. If the animal in the veterinarian's opinion is not fit for exhibition & the exhibitor has engaged the appeals process, the exhibitor is therefore, liable to pay for all veterinary costs associated with the appeals process. any sheep that fails the inspection for veterinary process must be removed from the showground immediately by the Exhibitor.
- 18 Any health concerns should be immediately notified to the Chief Steward. Any Animal deemed to be unwell will be referred to the District Veterinary Officer or Show Society Veterinary Officer.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1 ALL SHEEP TO BE PENNED BY 9pm on Thursday prior to the Show & remain in pens until 2pm Sunday of the Show.

- 2 All Sheep to be removed by 7am Monday following the Show. Order of loading & departure will be advised based on distance sheep are to travel & a roster will be displayed in the tearoom & Sheep Office window regarding Schools departing first.
- 3 Initial bedding will be provided by the Society. Additional bedding may be purchased through the Sheep Show Office & will be available early morning or late afternoon.
- **4** Up to two (2) entries are permitted per exhibitor per class unless otherwise specified. Schools may have up to three (3) entries per class except for scanning & best head classes.
- 5 If total entries are more than the number of sheep capable of being penned, the Society reserves the right to request intending exhibitors to reduce the number of animals entered. Pairs may have to be penned together.
- **6** First places in each open class automatically are entered for the CHAMPION & RESERVE CHAMPION classes. For Reserve Champion, the second place to the champion in their class becomes eligible. No further entry required.
- 7 WINNER OF SCANNING CLASS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR CHAMPION (must have won its individual class)
- **8 GROUP CLASSES** must be drawn from general entries but are a separate entry & entry fee must be paid. Pairs are not to be drawn from single classes unless otherwise stated in breed conditions.
- 9 MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR: Points awarded as follows: 1st place 3 points; 2nd place 2 points; 3rd place 1 point. No points shall be allocated where there are less than three (3) Entries in the class. Points awarded in Novice Classes shall not be included in Open Section Most Successful Exhibitor. No Most Successful Exhibitor Award will be made where there are less than three (3) Exhibitors in the breed. Group Classes not included.
- SPECIAL PRIZES Champion / Special Award PRIZE MONEY may be collected from the Sheep Show Office during the office Hours. Exhibitors are urged to collect prize money at the Show to avoid possible inconvenience later. Any prize money not collected by 11am Sunday of the Show (will be available for collection from the Show Society Secretary's Office up until 30th June current year of the Show.) Any prize money not collected by this date will be forfeited.
- **11** All perpetual trophies remain the property of the Dubbo Show Society & must be returned to the Chief Steward immediately following judging.
- 12 The Dubbo Show Society Code of Conduct must be adhered to by all exhibitors, participants & spectators at all times.

13 RIBBONS & PRIZEMONEY -

- In a single class, a ribbon or other evidence of a previous award shall not be worn or displayed in the ring. (Ribbons may be awarded throughout the sheep section in accordance with the following 5 exhibits & under up to 3 ribbons; 6 to 10 exhibits 4 ribbons; 11 to 15 exhibits 5 ribbons.) Prize money & or Product will be awarded as follows Champion \$40; Reserve Champion \$20 & or equivalent. (Where insufficient numbers, classes may be combined to become Junior/Senior classes. Ribbons will not be presented in any particular breed unless there is competition within that breed ie: more than one exhibitor).
- Judges must declare any conflict of interest which may arise, such as family members, particularly in Interbreed judging. In the event of a conflict of interest a stand-in Judge will be appointed by the Chief Steward to undertake judging for the class of interest.

NOVICE SECTION

- All Novice Class sheep must be bred by the Exhibitor & are open to exhibitors who have never won a first prize at any Royal Show, Feature Breed Show, ASSBA Show or an Open Class at Dubbo Show. A breeder is no longer eligible for the Novice Section after exhibiting at Dubbo Show three (3) times.
- 16 Schools may enter Novice classes regardless of prior history.
- 17 Those exhibitors entering in the Novice Section cannot enter the same class in the Open Section. Where no class is available for Novice Exhibitors entries may be made in the Open Section.
- **18 FIRST & SECOND PLACES** in a novice class are automatically entered in the same class in the Open Section where available. No further entry is required.



- 1/3 cup Sherry or Brandy
 - 250g (8oz) Plain Flour
 - 60g (2oz) Self Raising Flour
 - 1/4 teaspoon Grated Nutmeg 1/2 teaspoon of Ground Ginger
 - 1/2 teaspoon of Ground Cloves
- 250g (8oz) Butter
- 250g (8oz) Soft Brown Sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon Lemon Essence or finely Grated Lemon Rind
 - 1/2 teaspoon of Almond Essence
- 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla Essence
- 4 Large Eggs

METHOD:

Mix all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.

Cover and leave at least for one hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly.

The mixtures should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared 20cm (8")

Square Tin and bake in a slow oven approximately 3 1/2 to 4 hours.

Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NB: To ensure uniformity and depending on size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

INGREDIENTS:

- 190g butter at room temperature, chopped
- 1 and ¼ cups white sugar
- ¾ cup of milk
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- 1 and ½ cups plain flour

ICING

- 1 and ½ cups icing sugar
- 10 grams of butter
- 2 Tbsp boiling water
- few drops of rose-pink food colouring

METHOD:

- Preheat the oven to low (150) degrees Celsius. Lightly grease a 20cm round, deep cake tin. Line the base of the tin with baking paper.
- Cream the butter and sugar in the small bowl of an electric mixer until white and fluffy. Gradually add half the milk to help dissolve the sugar and beat well. Beat in the vanilla. Transfer to a larger bowl.
- Sift the flour, cornflour, baking powder and salt together three times. Fold into the butter mixture, then add the remaining milk (don't worry if it appears curdled at this stage).
- 4. In another bowl, use clean beaters to beat the egg whites until stiff peaks. Fold half the egg whites into the cake batter, then fold in the remaining egg whites.
- 5. Transfer 1 cup of the mixture to a smaller bowl and stir in the drops of food colouring. Take about ¾ cup of the white mixture and spread over the base of the tin. Take half the pink batter and spoon it in a ring about 1cm in from the edge of the tin should be about 1-1 and ½ cm wide.
- 6. Very carefully spread half the remaining white batter over, taking care not to disturb the pink ring. Spoon the remaining pink batter into the center of the tin, making a round of about 8cm. Spoon the rest of the white batter over the whole top, again taking care not to disturb the pink round.
- 7. Bake for about 1 hour 10 minutes, until the cake is springy to a gentle touch in the centre and comes away from the sides of the tin. It may appear slightly cracked in the centre but should settle on cooling (If not, gently press the top with your fingertips) Turn out onto a clean tea towel-lined with a sheet of baking paper. Leave to cool.
- 8. To make the icing, combine the ingredients until smooth. Spread over the top of the cooled cake and leave to set.

- 2. All vehicles are to be parked by 12 noon Sunday in the designated area where they will be inspected.
- 3. The Derby is open to all competitors, male & female of the age of 18 years & must be the holder of a current NSW Driver's License.
- **4.** No consumption of alcohol less than 12 hours before the event. Anybody found intoxicated will be banned from the current & any future Demolition Derby's at the Dubbo Show.
- 5. The event is started when the RED flag is swapped with a green flag. The officials may at any time change flags to RED in the event of & accident or fire. All action must cease when the RED flag is shown.
- **6.** Crash helmets & seat belts must be of an approved type & are to be always worn.
- 7. All drivers must wear approved racing uniforms. No thongs, shorts or t-shirts allowed. Overalls & or racing uniforms together with helmets must be presented for inspection at scrutinizing. Uniforms must be clean & free form oil, grease & petrol.
- 8. Cars will be scrutinized on the day of the event. Failure to comply with the rules and regulations of the event will result in automatically disqualified.
- ANY DRIVER'S DOOR TO BE HIT ON PURPOSE BY A FELLOW COMPETITOR, the offending driver will be instantly disqualified.
- 10. FIRST & REVERSE GEAR TO BE USED ONLY. Any competitor using second or third gear will be disqualified.
- 11. Prize money: The winning cars may be re-inspected after the event before official placings are given.

- 1. All vehicles must be in standard condition except of modifications outlined in this specification
- Vehicles may include cars, ute's, station wagons & Volvo 4 cylinder but may not include 4WD's, trucks or chassis vehicles
- **3.** The vehicle must be its original height (no alteration to the suspension)
- **4.** No tractor tyres allowed but rally tyres will be permitted
- 5. Locked diffs or limited slip diffs optional
- All external chrome work & protruding objects must be removed (including all cast metal that hold blinker lights)
- 7. All glass must be removed, not broken in
- **8.** All interior linings & handles must be removed
- **9.** All cars are to be cleaned out (*no loose objects*)
- 10. All doors must be secured by stitch welding
- 11. A 1/4" (6mm) metal plate may be slid down the window channel of the driver's door only. The plate is not to be protruding past the height of the door skin

- **14.** Window mesh in front of driver (*driver's door optional*)

- 17. If cutting a hole in the floor for floor shift it is not to be any bigger than the minimum necessary to gear shifts

- 28. One bar form pillar to pillar (*center pillar*) must be used. Bar must be 50 x 50 x 3mm a plate of 1100 x 100 to be welded on each end then be bolted to the pillars by at least 2 x 6mm high tensile bolts with bolts facing inwards with another 100 x 100 x 3mm plate on the outside
- **29.** One floor to roof bar is allowed in the middle of the car (in case of a rollover) but is not mandatory
- **30.** Approved seat belts must be fitted to the car, three or four-point harness
- **31.** No other types of seat belts are accepted (*lap*)
- **32.** Belts must be in good condition (*no frayed edges*)
- **33.** The driver's door must be painted red with a large white cross on it, if the car is red then the door must be painted white with a large yellow cross
- 34. All sign writing will be inspected, anything deemed to be in bad taste by officials must be removed
- **35.** All cars must be fitted with a white flag 300mm x 300mm attached to a piece of 6mm wooden dowel (*no longer*)
- **36.** The dowel (*flag*) is to be attached with tape to the right-hand pillar of the car within reach of the driver this is to be no lower than 300mm above the roof line of the car
- **37.** The drivers are to break the flag off as soon as his/her car is immobilized indication that the car is no longer in the event & no longer a target
- **38.** Any foam cushioning must be fully covered (*no rope to be used in the car*)
- **39.** In case of a rollover, if the car is not affected by leaking fuel the car will be reinstated on its wheels & allowed to continue in the derby
- 40. All brakes must be in original working order. ABSOLUTELY NO MODIFICATIONS ALLOWED

DURING THE DERBY

- During the derby when the driver cannot or does not wish to participate any further in the event, they can break the white flag off & no driver shell deliberately hit any vehicle without a flag however once the flag is broken that vehicle cannot restart in the event.
- Removal of seat belt, safety harness or helmet during the event incurs immediate disqualification.
- An area will be marked on the ground with lime to show the boundary of the area to be used & vehicle's driving over this boundary may be disqualified.
- All drivers must remain in their vehicles until the event is complete.
- Any vehicle deliberately ramming the driver's door will be disqualified.
- Drivers are allowed to use low & reverse gears only & can travel a maximum of 40 metres at any time in a straight line.

POST DERBY

- All driver's participating in the event are responsible for picking up the debris, prior to prizes being announced & distributed.
- All vehicles must be moved from the showground following the completion of the event or a \$50 fine will be imposed.
- The judges reserve the right to disqualify any driver at any time. The judge's decision is final.
