

Craig Phillips & Rebekah Lipp


Lovely books which help children understand their feelings and give practical skills to help them cope, including the value of spending time in nature.


Jeff Kinney

The Babysitters Club Series


Ann M. Martin

20 The Adventures of Captain Underpants Series





32 The BFG


Roald Dahl & Quentin Blake

Maurice Sendak


The story of Max's adventures when he sails away to The Land Where the Wild Things Are. A genuine classic, perfect for reading aloud together, and every child should have a copy.

On a volcanic island in the middle of shark-infested waters stands The Cruel School. The lessons are appalling, the school dinners are revolting and the teachers are terrifying.


