

Buffaloberry (Russet) - Common Name

Scientific Name: Shepherdia

Shoshone Name: Bozahinna

Grows: About 8 ft tall and has the same spread.

Bloom Time: It is a hearty plant for both the cold weather and dry

weather. Ideal growing in alkaline soil

Coloring: Flower is yellow and fragrant and small

Bright red berries

Spotted or marked in the center

Showy silver leaves all season long

Native American Usage (food, medicine and dye):

Food: Porridge, relishes, pudding and dried cakes. Berries were

eaten raw but only after the first frost, which made them

sweet.

Medicine: Treat tuberculosis, constipation, sours, cuts, swelling,

arthritis, toothaches, headaches, mosquito bites, acne,

boils, stomach cancer. Used to make shampoo.
