SB 132 Updates

Meeting 4/5/2021 with CCII Vandenberg, CDW Ret. Harrington, and Lt. Trenka to discuss pre-transfer class. Effective immediately, it is a required prerequisite to transfer. Used to help screen transgender women prior to classification and transfer. Even once class is successfully taken, transfer is not a guarantee.

16-hour class. Consisting of 8, 2 hour classes over the course of four weeks. Each class will also have a mandatory homework writing assignment that will be discussed at the beginning of the next session.

"Right person, Right prison."

Mandatory, active participation is required for completion and chrono.

In addition, individual must take Beyond Violence and Healing Trauma upon transfer.

Trans fears of being housed with cis.
Triggering of trauma

Safe for you
