A NOTE FROM MIKE LONG, MFH

Dear Bull Run Members,

The excitement about the 2012 foxhunting season is building daily. We are truly blessed with the most beautiful land, the best landowners, lots of game and the most fun hunt in Virginia! Greg has the hounds performing beautifully and we look forward to seeing everyone in the hunt field soon.

As the 2012 season approaches, your Masters and Board are wrestling with a challenging problem. **WE NEED YOUR HELP!** One of the great strengths of our hunt is the quantity and variety of territory we have the privilege of hunting. This abundance of riches creates a unique problem for us. We have <u>hundreds of miles of trails</u> that need to be maintained, so we can traverse our beautiful countryside safely for riders and mounts.

Historically, we have tried to address this challenge with organized workdays and volunteers. It's not working.Too few volunteers and too many trails. The "derecho" wind storms this year didn't help. We have hundreds of trees down. The handful of volunteers each week (the same folks, you know who you are) fighting this problem have been overwhelmed.

The Board and Masters have been searching for a permanent solution to this challenge. *After much deliberation, the Board passed a resolution establishing a Trail Maintenance Fund (TMF)*.

The Board has been extremely diligent controlling operating expenses of the hunt while maintaining membership dues at the lowest possible level. Rather than increasing dues to pay for workmen to clear the trails, the Board set up the Trail Maintenance Fund.

The TMF is similar to the Hound Fund, which has provided tremendous benefits for our hounds, but whereby the Hound Fund relies on donations and fund raisers, the TMF will be mandatory participation for all of our riding members.

However, the Board has established two ways to participate –

 show up for at least one workday per year

or

 pay \$25 for single memberships or \$50 for family memberships per year.

The Board would rather have your trail maintenance skills than your money. If you elect to pay the fee, the money will be used to hire workmen to do trail maintenance. The Board Treasurer will bill you for the fee and will issue full credits should you choose to participate in workdays instead.

We are also gladly accepting donations to the fund. The Masters believe this is a creative and fair way to deal with this challenge. This solution relieves the burden on the handful of members who are fighting this trail maintenance problem every week.

We have a great, great hunt. Thanks to all of you for making Bull Run "the most fun hunt in Virginia!"

Ride for Care - Sunday, August 12 - 8:00am

Bull Run Hunt, along with the Bike Stop Racing and Culpeper Regional Hospital will host the First "Ride for Care" event on Sunday, August 12. **The event will begin and end at the BRH Clubhouse in Mitchells**. 50% of the proceeds from the race will go to the Trauma and Critical Care Fund for Culpeper Regional Hospital. Registration for the race will begin at 7:00 am and the race should finish around noon.
