
come naturally to me. I want to get he ball rolling on whatever is next to happen! That is why Advent is so important to me. I need to remember to slow down and wait.



First, thanks to all who contributed food bags to the "Thanksgiving in a Bag" for East Spring Branch Food Pantry. Again the entire gym floor was covered with sacks of food, and over 1100 families received a turkey, fresh vegetables and 1-2 sacks of dry goods.

Memorial Area Ministries is conducting their "Christmas Share" program. If you wish to contribute you can order online and send the items to MAM or by dropping off the items at 1625 Blalock. Clearly mark the items as "Christmas Share". If it is more convenient, you can deliver items to the church to be delivered to MAM. The children's toys should be new, unwrapped toys, between \$15 to \$50 in cost for ages newborn-12 years. Please, no stuffed/fabric toys and should include extra batteries, if required for the toy's operation. For teenagers, ages 13-17, purchase gift cards(\$25 or \$50) from either Walmart or Target.

During the month of January 2022, there will be a "Mountain of Food" drive for the Food Pantry. There is no limit to the type and quantity of non-perishable items you may choose to purchase. Anytime during January, please drop off food items at the Korean Center. Heavy sacks are available, if needed. Contact Frank Conner, fwconner@sbcglobal.net, for pickup from your home, if needed. The collected food will be delivered to the Food Pantry in February.
