HOW WE SPEND GOD'S MONEY


In last year's 2023 stewardship campaign, \$1,070,782 was pledged. In our budget, we planned on an additional \$286,163 of income through non-pledged offerings, gifts, Parent's Day Out tuition, etc. for a total income amount of \$1,356,945.

Every dollar we spend supports our ministry work. Expenditures are divided into 4 categories:

- Spiritual Growth: Includes children and youth ministers' compensation, nursery, Parish events, hospitality, youth group, Christian education, Parent's Day Out and VBS.
- Worship: Includes music staff compensation, Choral Scholars and outside musicians, altar supplies, building repairs and maintenance, landscape, cleaning, security, utilities, property insurance, altar flowers and debt service.
- Evangelism: Includes support of the Diocese of Northern Malawi, GRACE, Nashotah House Seminary, Union Gospel Mission, Camp Crucis, mission trips, the diocesan assessment and all other outreach.
- Pastoral Care: Includes clergy and office staff compensation, insurance, payroll taxes, office supplies, and normal office expenses.















WITH GOD'S GUIDANCE, MUCH HAS BEEN ACHIEVED IN 2023

God has blessed St. Laurence and has guided us to achieve some amazing things this year.

In 2023:

- So many baptized into the body of Christ! It's a record year for us with 18 babies and youth sealed and marked as Christ's own, and it's only October.
- Malawi ministry continues to grow. Our Adopt a Student program grew to support even more who want the chance to further their education. The priest's house in Mzuzu is almost completed and will soon help our partner priest to better serve the people of his parish.
- The Summer of Prayer continued. A team of prayer warriors (this year over 50!) prayed for everyone in the Parish again summer. We heard from so many of you that this was incredibly meaningful and that new friendships were forged through this special connection.
- Choir is Lifted Up. Some much needed risers have been added to the choir loft and new wood flooring is now in place. So not only does the loft look beautiful but we can see the choir and hear their beautiful voices better when they are spaced in a more professional way.
- Revelation Bible Study sees huge attendance. Our
 Wednesday nights are flourishing with so many people
 engaged in learning about the book of Revelation,
 connecting more deeply with our Lord and with each other.
- Parish Social Events are booming. Trunk or Treat, St.
 Laurence Day, Oktoberfest, Mardi Gras all of our social
 events have had tremendous turn out. Y'all love to be
 together!

- Children & Youth programs are bearing astounding fruit.
 Our High School, Middle School and God Squad youth groups are bursting with youth who are committed to being together and to serving together. Mission trips continue to be their most favorite activity.
- Kids' Sunday School forges strong bonds. The new learning format developed last year has had a surprising affect. With classes now more interactive, the kids are engaging with each other more readily and developing strong friendships earlier. It used to be that these bonds were formed when the kids got old enough for youth group. Now they're starting in Sunday School and are being carried into Youth Group, resulting in some unprecedented participation.
- Assistant Youth Minister Hired. With the explosion in our youth programs we have now hired Liam Estes to assist our Youth and Children's Ministers, be active with our youth groups and mentor to our young men.
- Youth take leadership role in Diocese. Summer camp at Camp Crucis, Youth Rally, New Beginnings Retreat: our youth are leading the way as leaders and participants in diocesan events. They're making friends around the diocese, bringing them to St. Laurence, and many are joining in our activities.
- Parent's Day Out flourishes. In its 6th year now, Parent's
 Day Out extends its ministry to provide a solid foundation
 of Christian teaching and Anglican tradition to God's littlest
 ones, and to embrace their families.

WHAT ARE WE ASKING FOR IN 2024?

Continue the Work We are Already Doing Strive to Make it Better

Our Stewardship Campaign funds the day to day operations of our Church, focusing on our core ministries of worship, evangelism, spiritual growth and pastoral care. The Capital Campaign, which will launch in the spring, is for the building of a new Parish Hall and the renovation of the existing Parish Hall.

What we are asking for the Stewardship Campaign now:

- If you have made a pledge in the past, please keep your pledge the same for 2024
- If you haven't pledged before, please consider doing so, giving back to God out of what He has given you

FAQ's

1. Why should I pledge? Can't I just give what I want when I want?

Of course you can. But if instead you can estimate what you will be able to give next year, it helps us to plan our budget so we know what ministries, programs, and staffing we can afford.

2. Why are you asking me to keep my pledge the same?

We will be asking you for an additional commitment in the spring to our Capital Campaign for the new Parish Hall. Our hope is that all additional resources you have may be given to this project. If you wish to pledge more to this stewardship campaign, we will greatly appreciate it and use it toward advancing our mission.

3. What if I've never pledged before?

Please do so now! It's just your best estimate of what you will give to God's work at St. Laurence in 2024.

4. Can I change my pledge if circumstances change during the year?

Be assured that you can change your pledge and your giving at any time. You get to decide what happens with your giving.

5. Should I set my pledge up on auto-draft?

Yes, please do. It helps you to give steadily throughout the year without having to remember each month to donate. It also helps us to have a steady income each month.

6. How do I tell you my pledge?
