

At Bow Church many of us meet weekly or fortnightly in Cedar groups to look together at God's Word, the bible.
This Cedar series looks at Ephesians and provides daily readings for personal use integrated with our Sunday sermons and our Cedar group discussions. Together we seek to grow as followers of Jesus, as strong in our faith as the great Cedars of Lebanon.



Ephesus was an important city in western Asia Minor at the time of Paul's letter (AD 60). It had a river harbour and sat on two key trading routes. It boasted a pagan temple to the Romans goddess Diana and many of its inhabitants were devoted to idolatry. The ruins of Ephesus can still be visited in Turkey today. "On his second missionary journey, Paul visited Ephesus (Acts 18: 19–21). He returned two years later and ministered for three years, reaching much of the province of Asia with the good news of Jesus (Acts 19). Some years later when Paul was a prisoner in Rome (3: 1; 4: 1; 6: 20), he wrote this letter to the believers in Ephesus. A major theme of the letter is that God is working through His church, to bring the whole world to unity. Paul explains this is the work of redemption (Ch.1), resurrection (2:1–10), and reconciliation (2:11-3:21). In chapters 4-6, Paul states the responsibilities of believers in the light of God's great purpose. The letter to the Ephesians calls todays believers to a balance in the Christian life between doctrine (chaps. 1–3) and duty (chaps. 4– 6), divine sovereignty and human responsibility.

In chapter 2.20 Paul describes Jesus as the chief cornerstone in the church... a term picked up in the Hillsong worship song and significantly foundational for todays church, just as it was for the first readers of this important letter. ATRODUC ZONA SERMONIS


As together, Sunday by Sunday, we read and preach through Ephesians we will hear what God is saying to his Church today and in particular to us here in Bow.

Weeks one and two we'll unpack what it means to be the church: God's holy people, no longer strangers to God but citizens of heaven.

Weeks three, four and five we will consider what it means to live as the children of God: through whom God reveals his wisdom to the world, by calling us to live in unity as children of the light.

Week six we will land in the famous passage that tells of how we can equip ourselves for the spiritual battle that is forever raging around us.
