And that is who God is to us: lavish, extravagant, profuse in love toward us.

KNOW A SAINT St. Catherine of Genoa – September 15

St. Catherine was born to a noble family in Italy. At age sixteen she married Julian Adorno. Because of his lifestyle the couple was reduced to destitution. After this he reformed and became a Franciscan teriary and the couple devoted themselves to prayer and to work in a hospital which Catherine became the director of. After sickness from the plague and the death of her husband she was forced to retire her position but she went on to write two famous works "Dialogue between the Soul and the Body and Treatise on Purgatory". She was canonized in 1737.


