Reflection Question for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist is the <u>source and</u> <u>summit</u> of our Catholic faith because Christ is truly present in the Eucharist in every tabernacle throughout the world! Our AFC community is already responding to Jesus in *the Holy Eucharist* with great love through good preaching, good music, good community and good parking. What more will you personally do this week? Yield. In addition, seeds and crops contribute trillions of dollars to the United States' and global economy. Yield. Long before the USDA defined a seed as a "fragile, living organism," Christ makes the same point in Matthew 13:1-23. A seed planted on an open path, can be stolen. Planted on rocky ground, it develops shallow, not deep, roots and easily dries up during drought. Planted in a field of established weeds it struggles to compete for the water and nutrients it needs. It's rate of production is limited or eliminated. Our Lord compares his followers, aka disciples, to seeds. The conditions we are surrounded by affect our ability to grow and know God's love. Do you want to learn about who God is, how to love him, how to receive love from the Father, Son and Holy Spirit? Then your <u>heart, soul</u> and <u>mind</u> (Matthew 22:36-40; Mark 12:30-31; Luke 10:27) are like <u>"rich soil"</u> "who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold." Think the numbers Jesus refers to are too much? Think again. A midwestern corn field with 32,000 to 39,000 plants per acre, ppa, can yield upwards of 190 bushels per acre at harvest. Like seeds, IF a follower of Jesus, a disciple, is healthy, he or she can yield other disciples, more people who will love and decide to follow Christ.

Last week I met so many people after each of the Masses who love God with their hearts, souls and minds. Here are a few practical examples of the yield God is bringing about by people in our own community. There is a married couple from the Franklin area who are members in Fairfax. They are hoping to invite friends to be active in the AFC. Yield. There is Romey Peterson from Gibbon who made this observation. He bought "1" of Bishop Barron's books and shared it with a friend. The friend liked Bishop Barron's points so much, he bought "20" copies and shared them with his friends and family. Yield. There is Will, a server and young leader from Winthrop, who is attending the Steubenville Youth Conference at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester with the goal of growing in his faith. Our youth group and adult leaders, along with Fr. Tanner Thooft and I, will join Will and thousands of others at this Eucharistic and Christ-centered event. There is the Platz family who are baptizing the next generation of family into the faith of Jesus Christ. Yield! It's not that hard to tell others about Christ if our hearts, souls and minds love him enough to be good soil, what we call having a good attitude. When you know Christ, you have something – someone – to offer family and friends. As Saint Paul says in Romans 8:18-23, "Creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God."
