As we reflect on the past year at Wayfinder Holistics, we are filled with gratitude and awe for the many accomplishments and milestones we have achieved. In 2022, we continued to deepen our commitment to creating a world where humans live in harmony with the natural world, as we navigated new challenges and opportunities. In the past year, we took on exciting opportunities to oversee a grand total of four farms, which includes our latest lease with the Mayry family in Fluvanna County.

Our approach is rooted in the practice of regenerative agriculture, which nourishes the soil and actively works to positively impact as much land as possible, creating a more abundant and resilient future for ourselves and the planet. We are passionate about finding sustainable ways to raise food, build homes that harmonize with the natural environment, and cultivate medicine for both our bodies and the land. We see these practices not only as a means of achieving greater self–sufficiency, but also as a way to connect with the land in a more meaningful way and contribute to a more regenerative world. By continuing to find better and more regenerative ways of living, we hope to inspire others to join us in reclaiming our ancestral connection with the land, and creating a brighter future for ourselves and future generations.

At Wayfinder Holistics, our mission is to promote sustainable and holistic living through regenerative agriculture, educational programs, and community engagement. In 2022, we continued to make progress towards achieving our goals, with a focus on sharing our personal story and building awareness to help combat against our current climate crisis through digital content creation, partnerships with leading organizations, and innovative farming techniques.



What is regenerative agriculture?

In simple terms, regenerative agriculture is a holistic approach to agriculture that focuses on the interconnection of farming systems and the ecological system as a whole. The concept of regenerative farming is not new. It was used by Indigenous communities centuries ago, long before industrial agriculture occurred.

SOIL AND CARBON BLUEPRINT



This past winter we received a grant to be enrolled into the Ecological Outcome

Verification or EOV program through the Robinia Institute and the Commonwealth

Network. This became possible due to our direct partnership and commitment to
providing consistent healthy food options for the region with Commons Provisions. This
certification is a much more scientific and rigorous certification then say organic – which
is much more top down, practice based. EOV is bottom up, outcomes based and puts the
focus and support back onto our farmers and the land.

Through this transformative approach, farmers are empowered to embark on a journey towards monitoring and cultivating the vitality and resurgence of their land and soil for years to come. Despite the fact that many small farmers are already cultivating organically, they are unfortunately unable to participate in certification programs due to prohibitive costs and cumbersome bureaucratic barriers. These onerous requirements may discourage even the most dedicated farmers, leading them to resort to conventional, ecologically harmful methods that remain unchecked by stringent regulations.

SOIL AND CARBON BLUEPRINT

A holistic framework is at the core of Wayfinder Holistics' mission, as we believe in the vital link between land, animal, and human health. Our efforts to rejuvenate the land and create thriving ecosystems have yielded exciting results at Millstream, the 80 acre farm we manage in Earlysville, VA. Over the past seven years, we have successfully reintroduced 400,000 pounds of carbon into the soil, a significant accomplishment for our team.



Removing 400,000 pounds of carbon from the atmosphere is equivalent to:

- Taking approximately 52 cars off the road each year, based on average annual emissions per car in the United States.

- Powering approximately 5
 homes each year with
 electricity generated from
 coal-fired power plants,
 which are a significant
 source of carbon emissions.
- Planting approximately 2,800 trees, assuming each tree can sequester 143 pounds of carbon over its lifetime.







MILLSTREAM: FARM TO FORK

Our soil sequestering highlights the impact that regenerative agriculture can have on the environment. That's just one farm. Imagine the possibilities if more farms took this regenerative approach! At Millstream Farm, we manage over 60 livestock, including sheep and horses, which require several shelter locations and fencing throughout the property. We also have honeybees that contribute to the farm's ecosystem.





RUMINATION

Over the last seven years, our team has transformed Millstream Farm from an overworked and depleted land parcel to a thriving ecosystem. Our efforts have included the installation of livestock waterers and fencing in collaboration with local conservation groups. We have also planted 1,423 trees in collaboration with James River Association, as well as introducing permaculture features, ponds, and small market gardens to the property.

FARM HABITAT AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Wayfinder Holistics continued to diversify our food and medicinal offerings and cultivate edible landscapes by introducing several new species onto the land.

We also increased our plantings of perennials and berry bushes. We finished framing our raised beds, and grew over 75+ varieties of edible foods and medicines.

We collaborated with the **Frasier family** and the James River Association to plant 173 diverse, native trees along Cunningham Creek on Frasier Farm, one of the properties we lease.



INTRODUCED SPECIES

Calendula, Loofah, Pepper Varieties, Gomphrena, Tumeric, Lemon Verbena, Bluebells, Hopi Black Dye Sunflower, Yarrow, and Dahlias.

INCREASED BIODIVERSITY

Rosemary, Lemon Balm, Echinacea, Bee Balm, Chamomile, Catnip, Hyssop, Rose, and Mint to name a few.

NEW PLANTINGS

Mulberry, Dogwood, Elderberry, Persimmon, Oak, Sycamore, Hazelnut, Pawpaw, Black Willow, American Plum and more.

CULTIVATE

As we reflect on the progress we've made at Wayfinder Holistics, we are filled with a sense of gratitude for the land that sustains us and the community that supports us. At Millstream Farm, we've embraced regenerative agriculture as a way to honor the earth and create a more sustainable future for all beings. Our success in implementing this approach has been supported by tangible results. We hope to achieve similar results at our new lease with the **Mayry family**, transforming 100 acres of sprawling pasture in the heart of Fluvanna county.

Our commitment to regenerative agriculture is more than just a farming practice; it's a way of life that integrates ancestral indigenous wisdom and contemporary knowledge. We've learned that the key to restoring and rejuvenating the land lies in nurturing the seeds of this wisdom, allowing them to flourish in new and innovative ways.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS



In the month of April, we graciously extended our welcome to a cohort of young, vibrant souls hailing from the Global Majority, a collective of Black youth. Together, we facilitated a transformative gathering of self-care and learning, made possible by our steadfast partnership with Sentara Healthcare, a beacon of light in our local network. The idyllic Waddle Om Farm, awash in rustic charm, was the site of this bountiful exchange, where 15 youths, ranging in ages from 8 to 14, converged in joyous communion.

According to research conducted by the World Health Organization, young people who are exposed to nature and green spaces tend to experience a variety of health advantages.

These benefits include enhanced mental health, a decreased likelihood of developing chronic illnesses, and lower mortality rates.



Our collective focus was on cultivating a deeper understanding of the world around us, as we lovingly tended to the propagation of seeds, nurturing the soil with tender care. We embarked on a wondrous journey of discovery, delving into the manifold aspects of health and wellness, while making intimate acquaintances with the resident creatures of the farm.

For many of our youthful participants, this was an opportunity to immerse themselves in the splendor of nature, a precious and all too rare gift for those who dwell within the confines of urban spaces.

With open hearts and eager minds, we spent a day reveling in the majesty of the great outdoors, basking in the warmth of the sun, and luxuriating in the gentle embrace of the earth. It was a time of growth, both literal and metaphorical, as we nurtured the seeds of our shared future, rooted in the richness of our collective culture and the bounty of the land.

CONTENT CREATION

Our co-founder, Shankari Goldstein, continued to support development of digital programming with the Mind & Life Institute.

She hosted online programs and summits and interviewed several inspiring catalysts including contemplative practitioners, activists, researchers, and political leaders. In addition, she helped develop the "Global Joy Summit," which took place on November 13-16, 2022, a free, four-day, online international event inspired by the extraordinary friendship between His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu.

 In these spaces she was able to share the deep transformational work of Wayfinder Holistics, through her personal farming journey, and commitment to racial equity to a global audience. Personal storytelling and first hand accounts are like windows into the experiences of others, offering invaluable insights that can expand and enrich our understanding of the world.



The Summit reached nearly 200,000 people from over 150 countries.

 During the Global Joy Summit Shankari hosted daily sessions and interviewed several presenters. The summit explored how the latest findings on the science of joy, along with contemplative and faithbased teachings and practices, can help us rise to our better selves in light of the many global challenges we now face.

Shankari traveled to Dharamsala, India in the fall to help guide 108 people across the country into the Himalayan mountains to take audience with His Holiness the Dalai Lama. After months of curating discussion points, we shared two days of Mind & Life Institute conversations with His Holiness, that were transformational to those in the room and thousands online.
