SERVICE DELIVERY AREA

El Paso County—approximately 60 miles south of Denver, Colorado at the base of Pikes Peak. El Paso County is the most populated county in Colorado, with a population of approximately 730,000 people in 281,000 households.

POPULATION SERVED

Describe demographics of children served by the Alliance; numbers of children served: In 2021, we served 539 children at our centers (average weekly enrollment: 222); 59% of our families were eligible for state subsidized child care, which in El Paso County equates to income at or below 185% of the federal poverty level. 78% qualified for free/reduced cost meals, and 98% of families received tuition assistance either through state subsidy or on our sliding fee scale based upon family income. Our student population mirrors our community and was 63% Caucasian, 18% African American, 15% Multi-Racial, 1% Asian, 1% Hispanic, 1% Native American, and 1% Hawaiian/Pacific Islander.

For our Home Network of the Pikes Peak Region program, we typically partner with 10-20 homes each year. The Family Child Care Home (FCCH) business owners are typically women and enroll 8-12 children in each FCCH.

SUMMARY OF APPROACH

Early Connections operates four full-day, year-round centers for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers; half-day, school-year preschool programs; and before/after school and full-day summer programs for school-age children. We also partner with local family child care home providers to increase capacity of quality options for families through our program Home Network of the Pikes Peak Region.
