**Lisa Fingleton** is an artist, writer and grower. Living and working on a small organic farm near the sea in Kerry, she has spent many years cultivating deep-rooted connections between art, food and farming. Her journal-style book *The Local Food Project* explores the power of thinking global and eating local.

Lisa was the embedded artist with A Creative Imagining / Corca Dhuibhne Inbhuanaithe, one of 15 pilot projects under the first Creative Climate Action Fund. She worked with Dingle farmers, through line drawing and film, to explore ways in which they can respond to climate change and biodiversity loss. Lisa also created a 100 foot interactive drawing called The Creative Climate Wall with farmers and Creative Ireland at the National Ploughing Championship in 2022. The huge drawing was then installed at the Irish Museum of Modern Art (IMMA) for the

Earth Rising Festival. Last year Lisa also worked with the Crawford Art Gallery to draw The Sandwich Project on the gallery wall as part of the Meat and Potatoes exhibition.

For the last number of years she has been working with her partner Rena Blake on *The Barna Way*, an eco-social art and biodiversity project on their farm. In 2020 they planted 10,000 native trees on their land.

Lisa has been both the Kerry Council Visual Artist and Filmmaker in Residence. Lisa has an MA in documentary film from Goldsmiths College, London and a degree in Fine Art from the National College of Art and Design (NCAD).
