Risk identification:

Diligence (HRDD) process.

Credible data:

Provides trusted evidence for due diligence reporting obligations under directives such as the CSRD and for future CSDDD implementation.

Action planning:

Assessment results guide prioritization and integration of improvement measures into HRDD action plans.

As a fiber and raw material manufacturer, we expect that brands and retailers will increasingly use SLCP deeper in their supply chains, which would help reduce the number of additional audit requests we receive — leading to more efficiency and alignment across the industry.
