We plan to gather Thursday evening, 6 p.m., Nov 2nd at the Lakota Chapel in Pierre with Pastor Cheryl Arguello for worship & prayer. ***This part is vital, and honestly, is the biggest portion of my part in the assignment over the weekend. Star quilts are good. Our people having a voice at the state level of government is absolutely amazing. However, prayer and worship, building an altar unto the Lord, and ensuring our hearts are postured in humility and unity as tribal kingdom leaders is the imperative part, from which any and all success, breakthrough, and supernatural intervention will flow. In other words, without this portion, all else is man-made, and frivolous! My prayer is that you hear my heart on this.*** Gathering together and identifying ourselves as First Nation Kingdom leaders, establishing unity amongst ourselves, worshipping Jesus and making HIM and Him alone the main priority, focus, and necessity is truly our #1 mission and goal for the weekend, and beyond. *Will you join me in that perspective?*

The secondary goal to that is to then on Friday Nov 3rd at 10 a.m., meet at the Visitors Center at the Capitol Building, for a Kingdom Council meeting & time of prayer. We will break for lunch, and then reconvene at 2 p.m. where we plan to move to the Rotunda in the Capitol to have a formal presentation of a star quilt that the AGLOW of SD gave to Secretary of State, Monae Johnson to display in her office. At the time we plan to have a couple of First Nation Christians singing a song or two in Lakota. Of course, with the very recent passing of our beloved Grandma Norma Blacksmith, we have chosen several others to pray in the Lakota language.

**SAMPLE: EXECUTIVE PROCLAMATION FOR POINT OF
DISCUSSION AT KINGDOM COUNCIL ROUNDTABLE - FOR
FUTURE REFERENCE**

THE DOC BELOW IS THE EXACT WORDING OF GOVERNOR
MICHELSON'S PROCLAMATION IN 1990.
IT WAS TITLED: THE YEAR OF RECONCILIATION.
THE CHANGES MADE TO THE DOCUMENT BELOW ARE MADE BY SEC.
OF STATE MONAE JOHNSON.

Executive Proclamation
State of South Dakota
Office of the Governor

WHEREAS, As the State of South Dakota celebrates the beginning of its second century, we must also remember that statehood was a very sad time for the Native American; and,

WHEREAS, Two tragic events, the killing of Sitting Bull, on December 15, 1890, and the Wounded Knee Massacre on December 29, 1890, occurred just 13 months after South Dakota became a state; and,

WHEREAS, The anniversary of these tragic conflicts, as well as the celebration of 100 years of statehood, offer an opportunity for South Dakotans to learn more about the life and culture of the Dakota-Lakota-Nakota people; and,

WHEREAS, Strife between the cultures in South Dakota has, for 100 years, been of grave concern and continues to be of grave concern; and,

WHEREAS, Any improvement in cultural understanding in the past can be attributed to the work of the Indian and non-Indian people of South Dakota who have striven to understand our differences and to educate those of us who have grown up together but who have never made the effort to bridge the cultural gap; and,

WHEREAS, A statewide effort to develop trust and respect between Indians and non-Indians can, and must, include participation from the private and public sector, from churches and church associations, from tribal and state governments, and from individuals, communities and community organizations; and,

WHEREAS, That mutuality of interest provides a sound basis for constructive change, given a shared commitment to achieving our goals of equal opportunity, social justice and economic prosperity; and,

WHEREAS, By celebrating our cultural differences and drawing on those differences for the betterment of all, we can create a new respect among our citizens;

SAMPLE: EXECUTIVE PROCLAMATION (CONTINUED)

NOW, THEREFORE, I, KRISTI NOEM, Governor of the State of South Dakota, do hereby proclaim with the advice and consent of the state's tribal leaders, November 3, 2023 as

KINGDOM COUNCIL'S DAY OF RECONCILIATION

In South Dakota, and call on our citizens, both Indian and non-Indian to look for every opportunity to lay aside our fears and mistrust, to build friendships, to join together and take part in shared cultural activities, to learn about one another, to have fun with one another, and to begin a process of mutual respect and understanding that will continue to grow into South Dakota's second hundred years.

Director of NAOMI House South Dakota hosts a Kingdom Council with 9 Tribes in Pierre

(Pierre, S.D.) – Genevieve Skidmore, Director of NAOMI House South Dakota is hosting a Kingdom Council in Pierre on November 3, 2023. Her plans are to bring a tribal member from all South Dakota's 9 tribes to bring reconciliation with non-natives and healing for the past.

She will also present her vision of spreading NAOMI House South Dakota to all 9 reservations to care for abused children.

Invited are state leaders, including Secretary of State Monae L. Johnson, mother of 3 adopted Native American children from 2 different tribes, who will share her story.

Also invited are Governor Noem, Lt. Governor Larry Rhoden, Tribal Secretary David Flute, Aglow International Regional Director Sande Lofberg, and many others.

INTERCESSORY PRAYER POINTS



1. Pray for FN Kingdom leaders to arise with a new strength and courage to know and govern their territories, lands, and regions. (Joshua 1:2-9, Acts 17:26)
2. Pray that the spirit of sleep, slumber, and prayerlessness be broken off of our people. That we will return to the altars of prayer, worship, and intercession. (Isaiah 40:31, Isaiah 56:10, Isaiah 64:7, Matthew 26:40-41, Revelation 4:1)
3. Pray for new levels of inner healing and deliverance for our kingdom leaders (Matthew 15:26, Matthew 17:21)
4. Pray for a new wave of supernatural strength, deliverance, and revival to families, marriages, households, and bloodlines. (Joshua 24:15, Acts 16:31)
5. Pray for a fresh and genuine baptism of the Holy Ghost and fire to fall upon FN leaders, and families. (Acts 2, Matthew 3:11, Acts 2:17, Joel 2:28)
6. Pray for FN to operate in wholeness, humility, spiritual maturity, and in the power of agape love. (I Corinthians 13:1-13, John 13:34-35)
7. Pray for the Spirit of Unity. (Ephesians 4:16, Psalm 133:1)
8. Pray for genuine transformation by the renewing of the mind. (Romans 12:2, Proverbs 26:2)
9. *Bind the spirit of division, territorialism, racism, trauma bonds, pride, stonewalling, unforgiveness, competition, lack of accountability and discipleship, religion, tradition, legalism and denominationalism, and socialism.* And we lose the spirit of unity, wholeness, genuine forgiveness, identity, spiritual maturity, relationship in Christ, and sovereignty unto the Lord.
10. Pray for spiritual spearheads and laborers to be thrust into the harvest field. (Isaiah 49:2, Matthew 9:37-38)
11. Cover each participant at the event in the armor of God (Ephesians 6)
12. Cover tribal kingdom leaders from the 9 tribes of South Dakota governmental leaders, intercessors, media, volunteers, participants, speakers, kingdom council, and their families, in the Blood of Jesus Christ.
13. Pray for the right doors of opportunity to open wide, and for every door that is not from the Lord to be shut, that no man can open. (Revelation 3:7-8)
14. Pray for resources to be brought from the North, South, East, and West to this assignment.
15. Pray for safe houses to be planted on each of the 9 tribal reservations of South Dakota.
16. Pray that we identify 100 intercessors.
17. Pray for all leadership of this event, including Genevieve Skidmore, Darla Provancial, Katie Ford, and Angie Meyer, and their families. Cover them in the Blood of Jesus.
18. Dispatch governmental angels to be released around the perimeter of the property of the State Capitol. (500 E Capitol Ave).
19. Plead the blood of Jesus around the perimeter of the property of the state capitol.
20. Pray for divine clarity regarding the path forward for the State of South Dakota and tribal and governmental reconciliation.
